# Good Use of Language

## CONTRASTING VIEWS OF LANGUAGE

Last summer, a parishioner invited several brothers to a Yankees game. The time at the stadium was very enjoyable, and even the ride home was memorable. After the game, while waiting at the subway stop amidst the throngs of people, we finally managed to get on one of the trains. There, crammed in like sardines but sticking out like a sore thumb, we all stood in our white habits. As sometimes happens, there was a person on the train who thought we were all in costumes. She had no experience of religious brothers and priests, and so she didn't know what to make of us. She was polite and was seeking to understand what was going on, and yet she had no sense at all that her use of language was completely inappropriate. Four letter words flowed from her mouth as she fumbled through her confusion. Yet, when she finally realized that we were priests and brothers, she became extremely apologetic. That's where it became clear, though, that her use of improper language wasn't antagonistic. She just didn't know how to communicate in any other way, and even in her apologies, those same words flowed. She apologized for that too, and she tried to clean up her language.

How different this is from what we see on Palm Sunday: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest" (Luke 19:38). Moreover, as we sing at Mass, "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!" The words used to welcome the King into Jerusalem were those of praise and jubilation. They were words that were brought into the glory of the Messianic prophecies, and that have echoed through time on the lips of scores of people in the Mass. Those are words where the lips speak God's praises.

## PURIFYING OUR LANGUAGE

These two ideas provide a stark contrast: the inattentive use of language accompanying a sort of subway procession versus the rich, deep, and completely intentional use of language accompanying a procession leading to salvation. Most people who go to church regularly don't fall into the category of inattentive use of language. Rather, they are often in a sort of middle ground where either words slip out when things are particularly rough, or where things like the Lenten swear jar are meant to break the bad practices.

There is one thing, though, that is far more common, even among the devout. That is the use of the term, "O my God." This term seems to permeate so much of culture from the uncatechized to the daily Mass-goer. It's not an objectively inappropriate or sinful term, for it can be used as a prayer: "O my God, please help me to turn away from sin and to grow in virtue." Yet, more often than not, this isn't how it is used. Rather, it can be a filler term, a reflex response coming in moments of surprise, or even something demeaning to our relationship with God. Not only is the latter something to be avoided, but we should even avoid the other non-prayerful uses. First, it is important to make references to God in a much more prayerful and reflective way, rather than simply in a reactive or exclamatory sense. Second, the more that we are particular in our language about the phrase, "O my God," the more that we'll be particular in all our speech. Thus, we'll be able to speak God's praises and tell of all the good things that He has done (cf. Psalm 105:1-2).

Ultimately, our use of language should be life-giving. Being supportive of others, offering a charitable correction, praising God and His good works, and sharing Him and His truth are all beautiful ways to use language for the good of our souls and the souls of others. Thus, we should be intentional about our word choice. If we live in that way, then our minds and hearts can be more deeply united to God, and the whole of our lives can become more like the beautiful Hosannas that we sing on Palm Sunday!

# Holy Week

## THURSDAY, APRIL 17

### Holy Thursday

On Holy Thursday (in Latin, *Feria Quinta in Cena Domini*), the Evening Mass commemorates the Institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper and the ordination of the Apostles. (No other Mass is celebrated on this day.) The Mass of the Lord's Supper is therefore a Mass of joy and thanksgiving. Hence the Church replaces her penitential violet with white; the altar is decorated; and the *Gloria* is sung during which bells are rung for the last time until the Easter Vigil. Also at this Mass, an extra ciborium of hosts, consecrated for Good Friday's Solemn Liturgy, is borne in procession to an Altar of Repose. The other altars are stripped, signifying that the holy Sacrifice will not be offered again until the Vigil. The title "Maundy" Thursday is derived from the ceremony of the washing of feet, the *Mandatum*, so called because of the incipit of an Antiphon sung during that ceremony: *Mandatum novum do vobis* (I give you a new commandment. John 13:34). The *Mandatum* takes place on this day because the Lord washed the feet of his Apostles before the Last Supper.

## FRIDAY, APRIL 18

### Good Friday

Good Friday is the anniversary of the death and burial of our Lord, who, being both High Priest and Victim, offered himself on the cross for the salvation of the world. This day is called "Good" because on it the condescension and goodness of God were exceedingly manifested toward mankind in Christ's self-sacrifice. Its Solemn Liturgy, customarily celebrated at 3 PM, the hour of the Crucifixion, consists of three parts:

**1a.** The Liturgy of the Word, including the chanting of the Johannine Passion.

**1b.** The Solemn Intercessions, with supplications made for the Church and the whole human race.

**2.** The Adoration of the Holy Cross.

**3.** The Holy Communion, with the sacred Host which was consecrated on Holy Thursday. The liturgical color is red, although traditionally was black. On this and the following day, by a most ancient tradition, the Church does not celebrate the Sacraments at all, except for Penance and the Anointing of the Sick.

## SATURDAY, APRIL 19

### Holy Saturday

Through Holy Saturday the Church waits at the Lord's tomb in prayer and fasting, meditating on his Passion, Death, and descent into Hell, and awaiting his Resurrection. Of this night's Great Vigil, which is the pinnacle of the liturgical year, there is only ever one celebration in each parish. It consists of four parts:

**1.** The Solemn Entrance (*Lucernarium*), in which the new fire is kindled, the paschal candle is inscribed, the candles of the faithful are lit (*Lumen Christi*), and the Easter Proclamation (*Exsultet*) is sung.

**2.** The Liturgy of the Word, in which up to nine readings (seven from the Old Testament and two from the New) and a Gospel tell of the relationship between God and his people from the beginning of creation through the Resurrection.

**3.** The Baptismal Liturgy, in which the Litany of the Saints is sung, the baptismal water is blessed, the Baptismal Promises are renewed, and the Elect are baptized and confirmed.

**4.** The Liturgy of the Eucharist, as the first paschal Mass of Easter Sunday. The church's best white or gold vestments are worn.
