# Gossip and Prayer

## DEADLY GOSSIP

There's the coffee break, the water cooler conversation, and the text message chain. Those words that we utter behind closed doors might not always start as something bad. We might be trying to work our way through a challenging conundrum. Yet, there can be that particular point in the conversation where things go south. Frustration overtakes charity, and we fall to any of the many ways of gossip.

Don't we see something of this in the aftermath of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead? John 11 recounts the famous miracle where Jesus brings His friend back to life. After that, though, things get more intense. "The large crowd of the Jews found out that [Jesus] was [at the home of Lazarus] and came, not only because of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. And the chief priests plotted to kill Lazarus too because many of the Jews were turning away and believing in Jesus because of him" (John 12:9-11).

Jesus worked a miracle where Lazarus wasn't just mostly dead but all dead, leading people to start talking. Some started believing in Jesus, and others started despising Jesus. Words went back and forth, eventually getting to the chief priests who went from words to actions. And, what happened next? It wasn't just that some things went south. In this case, the result was the passion and death of the Word Incarnate.

While our sins of gossip might not escalate to that sort of result, they can still be destructive. So, how do we avoid this in our speech and conversations?

## AVOIDING GOSSIP

First, it is important to note a few ways that we can sin regarding speech. St. Thomas conveniently sums up many of these in one paragraph: "Just as the railer intends to injure the honor of the person he rails, the backbiter to depreciate a good name, and the tale-bearer to destroy friendship, so too the derider intends to shame the person he derides" (ST II-II, q. 75, a. 1, corp. art.). Reviling (or railing) is done to the person, so it's not what we typically consider gossip. The others, which are all done in secret though, describe different kinds of gossip.

Whichever of these things might be in our lives, there are some helpful tools to fight against them. First, they almost always stem from frustration. When we're frustrated about the actions of another, our first recourse should be to speak to God about it and ask for His peace. When we turn to Him, He can

fill us with His peace to calm our souls so that we won't speak rashly or with any of the sins of gossip. His peace can give us great clarity of mind and restfulness of heart.

Even more difficult for the heart than frustration is unforgiveness. If our words are flowing from a place of unforgiveness, then praying the Our Father is helpful, "forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." The Lord can heal our hearts and help us grow in forgiveness. We just need to ask Him for that growth.

Finally, these sins of gossip can be countered by prayer for the other person. Sometimes, even with prayer beforehand, we still want to get advice from another person. In those situations, the temptation to gossip can still be present. Thus, before crossing the line when things become destructive, it can be helpful to switch gears and begin praying for the other person or at least ending the conversation with an invitation to prayer. In this regard, we recognize that it's not just that our hearts need to be reshaped when it comes to peace and forgiveness. Sometimes, the other person needs to be reshaped by grace as well. God can do this; He can indeed bring about their conversion and their growth in virtue.

As we continue to draw closer to Easter, may the Lord grant us graces to continue uprooting the weeds of sin in our lives so that not only what we do but also what we say can be transformed by His grace.

## NOTES

The final part of the season of Lent is Passiontide, from the Fifth Sunday of Lent, known as "Passion Sunday" until the Triduum. The liturgy during this time focuses on and commemorates the sorrowful events of the last week of Jesus' mortal life. During this fortnight of "deep Lent," violet veils traditionally cover crosses (until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday) and cover images and statues until the Gloria of the Easter Vigil. The veiling was associated with the Gospel (John 8:46-59) formerly read on Lent V, in which Jesus "hid himself" from the people (*Jesus autem abscondebat se*).
