Tending Our Souls

"Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord. He is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream" (Jeremiah 17:7-8a).

THE SOIL OF THE SOUL

When it comes to gardening, the right soil matters. For instance, both peanuts and roses like sandy loam because it allows for great drainage. The right type of soil is one of the primary things that cultivate the plants to yield a great bloom that can be fragrant and colorful. Yet, when the soil has a bad pH balance, doesn't drain properly, or gets weedy, the plants can get stifled.

The same thing can happen in our spiritual lives. On the one hand, if our hearts are turned away from the Lord, we will be "like a barren bush in the desert" (Jeremiah 17:6), all dried up in life. On the other hand, if we are like the blessed ones who trust in the Lord, then we will be like the "tree planted beside the waters," stretching out our hearts to draw from the waters of life (cf. Revelation 22:1-2). Thus, remaining with the Lord and being nourished by His graces is so important for the spiritual life.

If, though, we are like the poor soil, it can be hard for the seeds of grace to take root. When we come to this awareness, the solution is to turn to the Divine Gardener so that He can till the soil of our souls. This might mean that He needs to use spiritual rakes, hoes, and spades to clean out our hearts. This might sting the heart or mind a little bit. Yet, the results from His divine actions are always fruitful.

Over the next couple of months, as we prepare for Easter, I want to draw out this analogy. There are so many things that can get in the way of our journey to the Lord. Some of these are clearly obvious, but some are much more subtle. The Lord wants to guide us in all of these ways, though. He desires that we become the good soil able to receive the seed of His word (cf. Matthew 13:8) so that the plant can grow large and vibrant (cf. Matthew 13:32).

WATERING THE MIND

In the First Reading for this Sunday, we hear from the Prophet Jeremiah who speaks about the tree stretching "out its roots to the stream." It is soaking up the good waters that will nourish it and prevent it from drying up when the heat comes. Jeremiah tells us that even in "the year of drought," it "still bears fruit."

This leads to a question. What are we drawing from? What sort of waters are nourishing our minds? There are so many things that we encounter each and every single day. Some of these things, like ads in subway stations and cab toppers, we can't control. Yet, there are other things like music, TV, movies, YouTube, and the like that we can control. Looking at these things in our lives, what are we watering our minds with?

Not all music, movies, or novels are bad. For instance, some works like *Brideshead Revisited*, Kristin Lavransdatter, or Flannery O'Connor's novels and short stories show the breakdown of the human person, but also the power of grace and redemption. There are challenging situations, clearly sinful actions, and the breakdown of virtues. Yet, those novels and others like them also show how grace can triumph and lead to a deeply profound conversion. Similar things can happen in movies and music.

It is important to be able to sort through the things that will nourish the mind. Is what we're listening to, watching, or reading actually helpful for our souls? Hopefully, the answer can become yes if it isn't already there. Just imagine how beautifully our souls will flower if they are watered with life-giving waters! May these next couple of months be a chance to examine this in our lives. That way, when the Divine Gardener rises on Easter morn, He may find our souls to have rich soil that has been watered by His grace.

MUSIC NOTES

According to the preconciliar liturgical calendar (i.e. before the Second Vatican Council), the Season of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, is anticipated by three Sundays of "pre-Lent." Just as during Lent itself, the *Gloria* and *Alleluia* are omitted except when the Mass of a feast is said, and violet vestments are used in this "Gesimatide." Although no such liturgical alterations now differentiate them, these three Sundays may still be referred to by their ancient Latin titles: *Septuagesima*, *Sexagesima*, and *Quinquagesima*, which mean the seventieth, sixtieth, and fiftieth day [before Easter] respectively. These titles relate to the name of Lent: *Quadragesima*, meaning "fortieth." Obviously, they do not precisely correspond with the exact period they indicate. This year, these Sundays are February 16, 23, and March 2.

MISSA CANTATA: Chair of St. Peter

For the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter (*Cathedra Petri*), celebrating the papacy and St. Peter as the first Bishop of Rome, there will be a **Sung Dominican Rite Mass at 9:30 AM at St. Vincent Ferrer**.

The chair itself, a wooden throne that tradition claims the Apostle used as Bishop of Rome, is a relic conserved in St. Peter's Basilica and was enclosed in a gilt bronze casing by Gian Lorenzo Bernini (1598-1680). Pope Benedict XVI described the Chair as "a symbol of the special mission of Peter and his Successors to tend Christ's flock, keeping it united in faith and in charity."

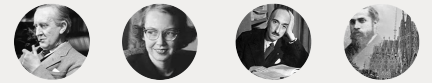
