God Has You in Mind

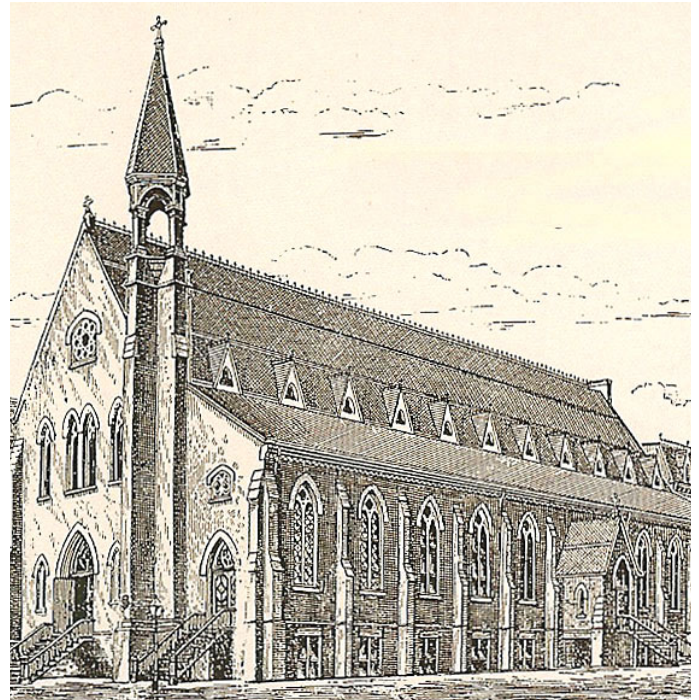
In 1867, the Dominican friars first assumed the pastoral care and responsibility of this community. Establishing the Parish of St. Vincent Ferrer, the friars served the Upper East Side of New York. As the Catholic Church continued to grow here in the city, the Dominicans soon after set up the Parish of St. Catherine of Siena. Even at that time, God had you in mind.

New York City was, in many respects, a different place in the mid to late nineteenth century. Between the establishment of the two Parishes, the construction of Central Park was completed. The Statue of Liberty was also completed around this time, as it welcomed many Irish immigrants who made up the first generations of the two Parishes. The first pizzeria in New York (or the country) wouldn't open for another fifteen years after the first Church of St. Catherine opened. Yet, in that very different age, these first members of these two Parishes made a commitment to preserve the treasure of the Faith for their children, for their grandchildren, for the city that was growing around them—and, indeed, for the faithful of our age. Even then, God, who sees all of time in one all-knowing and complete view, had you in mind.

A short while back (not quite as long ago as 1867 and well after the merger of the two Parishes ten years ago), we conducted a survey to help us discern, together, an ambitious but prudent path forward for our Parish. Your responses to this survey have been invaluable as we look toward the next steps for our Parish, and I am grateful for all your time and commitment to this work. Because of this input, we are putting together an actionable and attainable (and, frankly, exciting) plan for our future, which I will continue to share with you all in the coming months.

Beyond just being a way to gather counsel, the survey also served as an invitation to think about how you might support Parish and its work, both spiritually and materially. Many of you have indicated a desire to be very generous, and I do not take this for granted. I am struck with joy and gratitude in the face of such a desire for holiness through generosity.

It occurs to me that, all these years after the initial beginnings of the Dominican presence in the Upper East Side, we have a very similar opportunity as did those founding members of the formerly two Dominican Parishes. Though we cannot pretend to know what New York will look like in fifty, one hundred, or especially two

hundred years' time, we can say with complete certainty and with confident faith and trust that those living here will be in need of the love and peace of Christ—perhaps even more desperately than our age needs it now. From 1867 until now, God also has these souls in mind, and it is our turn to help advance His plan for them.

As we look forward to the future, we have a really beautiful opportunity to be cooperators with God as He continues to pour out His graces on all who come here now and those who will come here in the years to come. For this to bear fruit, though, we need your support—spiritual support through prayer, practical support through volunteering to help the life of the Parish, and financial support so that these beautiful things can become a reality. I feel confident that all this will bear fruit that will last (cf. John 15:16).

In light of all this, I invite you to contemplate how you can offer your gifts to this Parish. In prayer and in prudence, please consider that Our Lord is extending to you a very specific invitation into cooperation with Him and the economy of salvation. Our Lord is seeking brave souls today to safeguard and build up His Church.

He has you in mind.

MUSIC NOTES

There are four Marian Antiphons sung across the year: *Alma Redemptoris Mater* (Advent until Candlemas); *Ave Regina caelorum* (Candlemas until Maundy Thursday); *Regina Caeli* (Easter Sunday until Trinity Eve); and *Salve Regina* (Trinity Sunday until Advent). These Antiphons are attached to the night Office of Compline, the last in the Church's daily round of corporate prayers. Beginning in medieval times, at the conclusion of the service, the religious community would process to the Lady Chapel of the church (typically behind the High Altar) where either a chant melody or an elaborate polyphonic setting of the text was sung in devotion. The traditional of the seasonal Antiphon being sung at the end of Mass developed subsequently.
