Staying With the Lord

UNNECESSARY YET REVELATORY

There's a unique architectural element at St. Vincent's. Above the altar in the Friars' Chapel, there is a hanging pyx. This is interesting for a few reasons. First, while the church architecture is French Gothic, hanging pyxes were not common in France. Rather, they were more commonly used in the medieval period in England and Northern Europe; in those places, they were more common than tabernacles. Second, this is a sort of tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament could be reserved. Yet, we don't use it at St. Vincent's for such a purpose. Finally, it is designed in one of the typical ways, namely as a medieval tower. Looking at the top, though, we see more than just a tower. Rather, there is also a tall and skinny spire, which looks similar to the 150-foot-tall spire that was originally designed for St. Vincent's. In other words, we have an architectural element that seems out of place at first.

Yet, isn't there something so beautiful about that? When we think about architecture in general, there is much that can be added that is unnecessary. Gargoyles on medieval churches were meant to divert rain, but they didn't need to be elaborately fashioned. Looking around the city, we also see so many decorative elements, arches, trefoils, and other things that we would consider beautifying the buildings. Yet, none of them are strictly necessary for the structural integrity of the building.

Even with that, they show something else: beauty is good. It is worth creating beautiful things because they reveal something behind them. On the one hand, their beauty shows the creativity and skill of the artist. On the other hand, their beauty shows forth the Divine Architect. In other words, beauty reveals the Beautiful One in which beauty has its source.

So, when it comes to church architecture, there are often many elements that are not necessary for divine worship, but, at the same time, actually reveal something deeper. Elements like the hanging pyx and the tile work in the Friars' Chapel show something, Someone, beyond themselves. Even if the Blessed Sacrament is only reserved in the main tabernacle, the hanging pyx is another reminder of the goodness of God who came among us, took on our flesh, and continues to give Himself to us the Blessed Sacrament.

REVEALING A UNION

All that being said, what do the hanging pyx and the tabernacle invite us into? Union with God. They are the outward symbols of what can be held inwardly. With the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle, the Lord rests among us. He sits

with us so that we can sit with Him, and He rests with us so that our hearts can rest with Him. He has come among us to aid us in this life so that we can come among Him and all the angels and saints for eternity. In other words, the hanging pyx and, even more so, the tabernacle reveal that God desires to be in union with us. This isn't a symbolic or figurative thing. Rather, God is truly present among us, and He desires to dwell within us, especially when we receive Him in Holy Communion.

This Corpus Christi Sunday is a beautiful day to renew our commitment to come to Mass and visit the Blessed Sacrament throughout the week. In these ways, may the good Lord lead us safely through this life and hoist us up to heaven!

MUSIC NOTES

Marc'Antonio Ingegneri was born in Verona where he likely studied with Vincenzo Ruffo, the *maestro di cappella* of the Cathedral. Sometime around 1570 he moved to Cremona and in 1581 was named *maestro* of the city's Cathedral. Ingegneri was close friends with Bishop Nicolò Sfondrato (who later became Pope Gregory XIV), one of the influential voices of the Counter-Reformation's Council of Trent. Ingegneri's music, with its simplicity and textual clarity, embodies the musical principles of the Council. And thus, even as a northerner, Ingegneri is considered a member of the Roman School of Polyphony and is stylistically very close to Palestrina. Ingegneri wrote two books of Masses, in 1573 and 1587; at least three books of motets; and eight books of madrigals. He is also remembered as the teacher of Claudio Monteverdi, the defining musical figure of the late Renaissance and early Baroque and the forefather of modern opera.

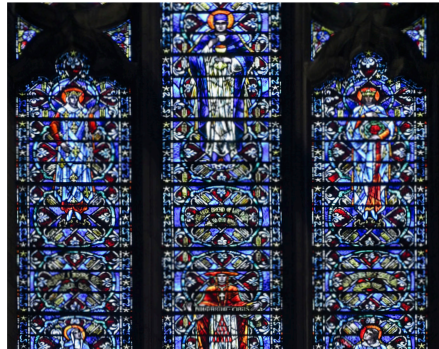
Corpus Christi

St. Vincent Ferrer has a window dedicated to the Blessed Sacrament, in the southwestern bay of the chancel, next to the Window of Music. The Blessed Sacrament Window was designed by Charles Connick and was completed in February, 1933.

The dominant figure in the center lancet is St. Thomas Aquinas, O.P., author of many liturgical texts for Corpus Christi; he is holding the Blessed Sacrament. Below is Hugh of St. Cher, the first Dominican cardinal and the first to have the Feast of Corpus Christi celebrated in his diocese. And below Hugh is a scene in which St. Thomas Aquinas prepares for Pope Urban IV the papal bull promulgating the Feast of Corpus Christi in 1264.

The left lancet shows St. Radegunde of Poitiers (top) and St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon (bottom). The right lancet shows St. Louis, King of France holding the precious relic of the Sacred Crown of Thorns (top) and St. Tarcisus, the 3rd century martyr of the Blessed Sacrament (below).

Through the patterned background below the figures runs the inscription from St. Thomas' hymn of the Blessed Sacrament, *Adoro te devote*.



SUNDAY, JUNE 22

Corpus Christi

The second Sunday after Pentecost is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi – the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Following the 12 NOON Solemn Mass, we will have a Eucharistic Procession with brass quartet through the streets, with a stational altar at St. John Nepomucene, and ending at St. Catherine of Siena with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Eucharistic Adoration will then continue at St. Catherine of Siena until Benediction at 4:45 PM. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed at 3 PM and the Rosary recited at 4 PM.

TUESDAY, JUNE 24, 6 PM

Nativity of St. John the Baptist

For the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, we will have a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer. John the Baptist has two feast days in the liturgical calendar: one commemorating his birth (June 24) and the other his death (August 29). There are only three nativities observed in the Roman Catholic calendar: for Jesus, for Mary, and for the Baptist.

Mystagogy

Mystagogy returns for a bonus talk with author, Stephen F. Auth, to talk about his latest book.

Solemnity of the Sacred Heart

For the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, we will have a Solemn Mass and Procession at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa in honorem Sanctissimi Cordis Jesu* by John Singenberger; *Qui manducat meam carnem* and *Praeparate corda vestra* by Jacob Handl.

Saturday, June 28, is the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Closely linked with the Solemnity of Corpus Christi is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, celebrated on the Friday before the 3rd Sunday after Pentecost, and the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, now celebrated on that Saturday. Another opportunity to contemplate Christ's unmitigated loving-kindness toward a fallen humanity, the origin of the devotion to the Sacred Heart in its modern form is derived from a French Roman Catholic nun, St. Marguerite Marie Alacoque, who said she learned the devotion from Jesus during a mystical revelation.

Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul

This year, the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, Apostles, falls on a Sunday, displacing the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. We will offer our regular weekend schedule.

This is a special day for the Dominicans because of the tradition that St. Peter and St. Paul appeared to St. Dominic and confirmed his apostolic way of life by giving him a walking staff and a copy of St. Paul's letters.
