## Wisdom From on High

#### **DOVES ABOVE**

The Holy Spirit reigns down from above with a heavenly fire, enflaming all present. With wisdom from on high, He not only enlightens the mind of the preacher, but He also enkindles a heavenly fire within the minds and the hearts of the hearers.

In case you haven't noticed, right about the head of the preacher in the high pulpit at St. Vincent Ferrer, there is a carved, golden dove at the top of the sounding board. Throughout both of our churches, we see images of a dove representing the Holy Spirit. Many of them are in the canopies or ceilings above the altars, and those signify the presence of the Holy Spirit at the time of the consecration. Yet, the Holy Spirit is at Mass more than just during the consecration.

At each and every Mass, He is also present throughout the entire Mass. This is especially true during the Liturgy of the Word. While the words of the readings are being proclaimed, the Holy Spirit is working on the hearts of the hearers as He seeks to cut through anything that would hinder God's divine grace from working on the soul. He works to break into the heart, like water that pours down over a cliff and breaks through the rocks below.

Moreover, during the homily, the Holy Spirit is ever-present. On the one hand, He is active in the preacher, ideally guiding Him to preach what needs to be heard. Yes, the preacher will have prepared the homily, and so there is the human element there. At the same time, so many preachers have experiences where there sometimes is a movement in the mind to shift something, to say something a certain way, or to edit the text on the fly. In these cases, the Holy Spirit is active in the preacher and guides the delivery of the homily.

Possibly more profound than that is how the Holy Spirit is "living and effective" (Hebrews 4:12) in the congregation. Preachers frequently hear, "Father, I'm so glad that you said this and that during your homily." The thing is, we didn't say those things; the Holy Spirit did. He was at work in the person receiving the homily and helped them to hear whatever it was that they thought they had heard. How beautiful is that! In one homily, God can touch the lives of so many people in so many different ways, all because the Holy Spirit is acting on them in whatever way will be best for them to hear. In this, the Divinely Wise One is acting with wisdom from on high.

#### **SOULS ENFLAMED**

On this feast of Pentecost, the visible carvings and paintings of the Holy Spirit in both of our churches become a tangible reminder to ask ourselves about how attentive we are to the Holy Spirit. Do we regularly pray to Him? Do we ask Him to pour out His seven gifts upon us? Are we docile to His divine movements in our souls when He begins acting on us?

If you don't have a strong devotion to the Holy Spirit, maybe this is the week to begin developing it. You could start by praying to the Holy Spirit to help you pray more intentionally at Mass. Also, after the opening Collect when we all sit down, you could say a quick prayer to the Holy Spirit, "Come, Holy Ghost!" Moreover, after the Gospel and before the priest starts his homily, you could again ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to help you hear whatever God wants you to hear.

On this Pentecost Day and during this week, may the Holy Spirit help you to grow deeper in prayer and union with God, and may He set your minds and hearts on fire with truth and charity!

### **MUSIC NOTES**

English Renaissance composer William Mundy's career spanned the dramatic liturgical upheavals brought about during the reigns of Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary, and Elizabeth I. His music reflects this, as both a number of Latin and English works exist, in styles appropriate to the Catholic or Protestant establishments for which they were written. The son of Thomas Mundy, a sexton of London's St. Mary-at-Hill, William grew up as a boy chorister at of Westminster Abbey (at that point, a Cathedral). From 1559 until his death, he was a Gentleman (professional singer) of the Chapel Royal, the body of priests and singers attached to the English monarch.

# **Upcoming Events**

#### **SUNDAY, JUNE 8**

Pentecost

The Solemnity of Pentecost celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and is prayed as the Third Glorious Mystery of the Rosary. It marks the fiftieth day of Easter: seven weeks of seven days, thus a week of weeks.

Pentecost has its roots in the Jewish celebration known variously as the Feast of Weeks, Feast of Harvest, and Day of First-Fruits. Contemporary Judaism observes this festival, signifying the end of the grain harvest, as Shavu'ot (meaning "week").

Pentecost is also known as Whitsunday, a name derived either from the white garments that the neophytes would have worn for the last time (Pentecost marking the end of Eastertide), or from the wisdom (wit - formerly spelled 'wyt' or 'wytte') out-poured on the Apostles by the Holy Spirit. Red, considered an 'active' and 'caloric' color, is the liturgical color for this feast, as it is for Masses of Confirmation and Ordination. The Paschal Candle, blessed at the Easter Vigil, has been burning for the entirety of these fifty days, showing Christ's enduring presence until the descent of the Holy Spirit; although historically in some places the Candle was extinguished on the Ascension (the fortieth day after Easter) to mark the time of the cenacle.
