Impatience and Patience

INCREASED SIGHT

While I've never been completely blind, I don't really have any memories of what life was like before glasses. I got my first pair of glasses when I was about five, and they've been a part of my life. Similarly, I don't know what it's like to see colors clearly. While I'm not colorblind (*the correct term for someone like me is color deficient*), I don't see all colors properly. In other words, I have vision issues.

This has forced me to learn to be patient. I have had to learn patience with myself in recognizing that it's okay to make mistakes when it comes to the Crayola box, and I have had to learn patience with others who may not fully understand what it's like to not be able to tell the difference between colors that seem so clear to everyone else.

Even more so, we see the growth in patience in the man born blind (cf. John 9:1-41). Jesus cures his blindness and then disappears. The man simply knows that a miracle has happened, but the Pharisees don't see it so clearly. They interrogate him again and again. Eventually, when they don't seem to get it, he starts to break down, "I told you already and you did not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples, too?" (John 9:27). The temptation to the Charlie Brown style "Aaugh!" seems to roll off his lips as the impatience creeps up. Soon after, they throw him out.

Then, Jesus returns. He comes back to the man and invites him to move beyond that first-level sight where he only understood Jesus to be a miracle worker. "'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' He answered and said, 'Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?' Jesus said to him, 'You have seen him, the one speaking with you is he.' He said, 'I do believe, Lord,' and he worshiped him" (John 9:35-38). Not only does the man receive physical sight and the gift of faith, but he can also live in a whole new way. He is able to follow Jesus, putting away not only a physical blindness nor even just a lack of faith, but also a way of life that wasn't fully rooted in Christ. In other words, the physical gift of sight leads to faith which leads to full Christian living.

INCREASED PATIENCE

When you think about it, New York City seems to breed impatience. Just standing on a subway platform, it's as if the whole Peanuts gang is joining Charlie in his exasperated responses. The so-called "New York Second" is a real thing,

and the rush of the city is a constant battle. Wall Street makes everything fast, and things like it affect so much of our daily lives.

The question that we can ask ourselves is: have I fallen to the temptation of impatience? When it comes to walking through the city, do I rudely tailgate other people and/or simply pass beggars without even praying for them? What sort of example do I set when I miss the subway or someone gets in the taxi I was trying to hail? What do I do when someone is late to a meeting, especially when I have two back-to-back meetings after that one?

There are so many opportunities in our city to fall prey to impatience. Yet, each of them is also an opportunity to grow in patience. They are all invitations not only to see Christ clearly but also to see how His providence is unfolding in our lives. His providential plan can come with twists, turns, and seeming delays, but it is always the way that will lead us most surely to heaven. It starts with seeing Him, as He comes to touch the eyes of our minds and hearts, and then it grows as we come to know Him more completely. When that happens, we will be able to see His providence more clearly, and that, in turn, will help us to live with the patience and all the other virtues necessary for a truly Christian life.

MUSIC NOTES

For Laetare Sunday, the Schola will sing music from Austria and Germany. Bruckner ranks as one of the finest composers of the late Romantic period. A simple man and devout Catholic, Bruckner sang as a choirboy at the Augustinian monastery of St. Florian, where he later served as organist from 1848 until 1855 when he became organist of Linz Cathedral. From there, in 1868 he was appointed to the faculty of the Vienna Conservatory from which he retired. Born in the village of Sant'Andrea-in-Monte on the Austro-Italian border, Goller studied in Innsbruck and the Vienna Academy of Music.
