Theological Architecture

INTENTIONAL DESIGN

Our two churches have a grandness, yet intimacy, about them. Visitors constantly comment about how beautiful the churches are. We really have been so blessed that our forebears built these grand edifices for the glory of God and that subsequent generations worked so hard to preserve them. Yet, aside from the pew we pray in or the statue we like to visit, have we considered our churches in their larger symbolism? Have we delved into the nooks and crannies that make these churches special and rich in meaning?

Looking at St. Vincent Ferrer, Bertram Goodhue, the church's architect, extensively studied the Dominican liturgical practices before he began to make his plans. Goodhue wasn't Catholic, but the Dominicans were so impressed at some of his other works, that they called upon him to design St. Vincent Ferrer (1918), while his erstwhile partner, Ralph Adams Cram, designed Sacred Heart Church (1924) in Jersey City, NJ (a parish formerly entrusted to the Dominicans, but which is now closed). It is remarkable how these two churches just across the river from one another could be so similar and yet so distinct. The stained-glass windows and the statuary of both churches communicated a common theme (the pulpit at Sacred Heart had even been designed with a statue of St. Vincent Ferrer prominently situated in front). Yet, Goodhue's genius shines out at St. Vincent Ferrer. There are tons of medieval designs throughout the church, such as the natural imagery of vines and animals. There are softening elements, such as busts, shields, and rounded edges. While Sacred Heart lacked some of those elements, in St. Vincent Ferrer, we see remarkable details that we might take for granted, but they help make the church more personal and intimate.

When the second Church of St. Catherine of Siena (the current one) was designed a little over a decade after the current Church of St. Vincent Ferrer, it was clear that there was supposed to be an overlap with some of the elements of St. Vincent Ferrer. From the riddle curtains around the altars, to the large candlesticks by the sides of the high altar, the images on the front of the high altar, and the statuary in the reredos, there was an intentional design overlap between the two churches. Indeed, the architect for St. Catherine's was Wilfred E. Anthony, Goodhue's assistant on the St. Vincent Ferrer project. St. Catherine's had first been established as a mission church of St. Vincent Ferrer, then was made into its own parish, and now the two have been merged once again.

EVANGELICAL DESIGN

Through all of these elements, there is something so profound. I'd like to spend the next few months drawing out some of the implications of this. To what do the symbols in the churches speak? How do the churches and their various elements aid the preaching work of the Dominicans, even when the friars aren't present? Why are there dolphins on the Tabernacle at St. Vincent's? Why are the lines of the Our Father connected with the mysteries of the Rosary in the windows at St. Catherine's?

The architects, stained-glass makers, sculptors, and painters all sought to draw us out of ourselves through their work. In typical Gothic fashion, they sought to lift our minds from their work to the heavenly realities behind them. Hopefully, over the next few months, we'll all be able to see that their skill was about more than good art. For, through their work, even our churches can help to evangelize us and lead us to God.

MONDAY, MAY 5, 6 PM

Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer

Born in the province of Valencia, Spain, Vincent Ferrer (1350-1419) joined the Order of Preachers in 1367. Traveling widely across Europe, his preaching against the evils of the time encouraged repentance and promoted Church reform. A significant figure in ending the Western schism, he worked tirelessly for peace and unity within the Church. Vincent is often depicted holding a trumpet and the Book of Revelation with a quotation from it, reading: Timete Deum et date illi honorem quia venit hora judicii ejus (Fear God and give honor to him for the hour of judgment is coming). The flame above his head symbolizes the Holy Spirit's call to preach the Gospel.

St. Vincent Ferrer's feastday according to the liturgical calendar of the Dominican Order is May 5. In the general Roman Calendar, St. Vincent's feastday is April 5, the day on which he died in 1419.

Join us for a Solemn Mass, after which a relic of our Patron will be available for veneration.

Solemnity of Dedication

The building, dedicated on May 5, 1918, was built to the designs of renowned American architect Bertram Grosvenor Goodhue, who considered this his finest building. This National Historic Landmark is widely acclaimed as the foremost American example of French Gothic-style architecture and includes a complete set of Charles Connick stained glass windows, carvings by Lee Lawrie, and two instruments by the Schantz Organ Company.




