Shrine of St. Jude - St. Joseph Novena

May I take this opportunity to extend my prayerful best wishes to you and your loved ones from the Shrine of St. Jude.

As you read this letter, we are celebrating Laetare Sunday, the midpoint of Lent. I pray that this will be an opportunity for us to reflect, pray, and live our Christian vocation in union with the life, passion, death, and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Each year the Shrine of St. Jude celebrates a novena of prayer leading up to the Solemnity of St. Joseph on March 19. We honor St. Joseph as the husband of Mary and Patron of the Universal Church. This title was given to him by Pope Pius IX in 1870. More recently, in 1989, Pope Saint John Paul II gave him the title "Guardian of the Redeemer." Joseph became the most intimate companion and protector of Jesus and Mary and, we might add, an intimate companion of all who invoke him as a guardian and protector.

For the past few years, our common intention for this novena has been to pray for family members and friends who are no longer practicing their faith. We all know of someone whom we love who for whatever reason is indifferent about the Catholic Church and the gift of faith received at baptism. St. Joseph is our perfect intercessor. He looked after and cared for his family with loving devotion. May we approach St. Joseph, Protector of the Holy Church, with confidence and assurance that our prayers will be heard and answered.

Our St. Joseph Novena will begin on Monday, March 11 and conclude on Tuesday, March 19, the Solemnity of St. Joseph. This solemnity comes before Palm Sunday and Holy Week this year, and our celebration of this novena might be a Lenten Pilgrimage of sorts. Let us move forward prayerfully, contemplating this very ordinary man who, as the Gospels teach us, lived an extraordinary life and has become the Patron of the Universal Church.

The Mass will be celebrated for all your intentions each day of the novena at St. Catherine's, and our novena prayer will be recited at each of the five daily Masses as well as the eight weekend Masses in the parish. Also, the Shrine of St. Joseph in each of our churches will have an intention book and prayer cards for those who might visit during this Novena. I invite you to join us in daily prayer.

Please know that our prayers to St. Joseph will be instrumental in our common efforts to restore and build up the Body of Christ. Let us pray the following prayer together each day:

SATURDAY, MARCH 16, 12 PM Midday Retreat with the Mystics: Matthew the Poor

This month at St. Catherine's, we'll continue our Midday Retreat with the Mystics, focusing on Matthew the Poor (1919-2006). He was a prolific Coptic monk who led a revival of Egyptian monasticism fifty years ago. Matthew the Poor is a good example of "breathing with both lungs" (JPII) as he was shaped by Western spiritual theology along with Eastern Christian sources.

Fr. Ignatius Schweitzer, O.P. will give a conference talk on Matthew the Poor, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and guided meditations from his writings. A small social gathering will follow in St. Joseph Hall, along with the opportunity to be anointed with St. Elizabeth of the Trinity oil. MONDAY, MARCH 18, 6 PM Solemnity of St. Patrick

This year, the Solemnity of St. Patrick, the Patron of the Archdiocese of New York, is transferred from March 17 to the next day. On Monday, March 18, there will be a Sung Mass and Procession with the traditional blessing of the shamrocks at 6 PM at St. Vincent's.

TUESDAY, MARCH 19, 6 PM Solemnity of St. Joseph

For the Solemnity of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Patron of the Universal Church and of the Eastern Province of the Order of Preachers, there will be a Solemn Mass and Procession at 6 PM at St. Vincent's for which the Schola Cantorum will sing Mass in A minor, Op. 197 by Josef Rheinberger.

The Mass will include the Roman tradition of blessing St. Joseph's Day bread. Following the Procession, there will be a light reception in the Cloister walk of the Church. Parishioners are also invited to bring any images, statues, or devotionals of St. Joseph from their homes, and to place them in the St. Joseph Chapel on the north side of the church prior to Mass so that they may be blessed alongside the traditional sweets.

This is the last day of the Lenten Food Drive. There is a custom of offering food for the poor with the blessing of food on St. Joseph's Day, and this is a great way to combine these two customs.
