# The Legacy of St. Thomas in the Pews

## EUCHARISTIC TEXTS

This past Sunday, we were blessed to have a whole series of musical pieces to conclude our 40 Hours Devotion. All of these were texts written by St. Thomas Aquinas and set to music by some of history's most talented composers. Some of the music, like the *Panis Angelicus*, and some of the texts, like the *O Salutaris*, were probably familiar to us. Yet, we can underestimate just how much of an effect St. Thomas had on the liturgy and how his works affect our life in the pews.

In 1263, there was a Eucharistic miracle in Bolsena, Italy in which the Eucharistic Host began to bleed onto the corporal at Mass. The following year, Pope Urban IV instituted the feast of Corpus Christi (in some accounts the Eucharistic miracle as well as St. Thomas Aquinas's support of it are influences). He then asked St. Thomas to write the liturgical texts for the feast.

Those texts for Corpus Christi have largely stayed the same for the current Mass and Office of Corpus Christi, but they also have come into the regular prayer practice of the Church and the Dominican Order. For instance, St. Thomas gave us the *O Salutaris* (a part of the hymn for Lauds), the *Tantum ergo* (a part of the hymn for Vespers), and the "O God who in this wonderful sacrament..." (the Collect for Corpus Christi as well as for Benediction at the end of Eucharistic adoration). In a Dominican community, we also have the prayer that we say before each Office, the "O Sacred Banquet" (the Magnificat antiphon for Vespers II for Corpus Christi). In these ways, we can see that St. Thomas's legacy guides a major part of the liturgical life of the Church, and his writings have been sung or said by Catholics all over the world for centuries.

## EUCHARISTIC PRAYERS

I just want to draw out one of these texts, one that is so dear to the Dominicans: "O sacred banquet, in which Christ becomes our food, the memory of His Passion is celebrated, the soul is filled with grace, and the pledge of future glory is given to us." In this Vespers antiphon, St. Thomas so beautifully encapsulates a rich Eucharistic theology that also is meant to lead us to heaven. Here, the Eucharist is described as a "sacred banquet." This is a foreshadowing, "a pledge" of the future eternal banquet of heaven, in which all the saints participate and in which we enter in some way when we come to the Mass. For there, "Christ becomes our food," the food

of the wayfarer who is seeking to get to heaven. This food nourishes our souls to help us avoid sin and to live virtuously. In this way and each and every time that we partake of this heavenly food, our souls are "filled with grace" in a very real way.

Furthermore, this "sacred banquet" is also the means by which we enter into "the memory of His passion." When the Mass is celebrated, the graces flowing from Christ's victory on Calvary are made present and applied to our souls. In other words, at Mass, we not only have a foreshadowing of the heavenly liturgy, but we do so with the graces of Christ's definitive victory shaping our hearts to lead us there.

## EUCHARISTIC HEARTS

When it comes to daily Christian living, this gives us great hope. Even after the Ascension, Jesus has not left us destitute. He is still truly present with us, and He is constantly offering us graces to join Him in heaven. Each time we pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament, He is working His graces in our hearts. Every time we receive Him in Holy Communion, He is giving us the food for the journey of life so that we can persevere through all the challenges we are bound to face. That can make for a beautiful act of thanksgiving after receiving the Eucharist as well as for all eternity in heaven.

## TUESDAY, MARCH 19, 6 PM

### Solemnity of St. Joseph

For the Solemnity of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Patron of the Universal Church and of the Eastern Province of the Order of Preachers, there will be a Solemn Mass and Procession at 6 PM at St. Vincent's for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Mass in A minor*, Op. 197 by Josef Rheinberger.

The Mass will include the Roman tradition of blessing St. Joseph's Day bread. Following the Procession, there will be a light reception in the Cloister walk of the Church. Parishioners are also invited to bring any images, statues, or devotionals of St. Joseph from their homes, and to place them in the St. Joseph Chapel on the north side of the church prior to Mass so that they may be blessed alongside the traditional sweets.

This is the last day of the Lenten Food Drive. There is a custom of offering food for the poor with the blessing of food on St. Joseph's Day, and this is a great way to combine these two customs.

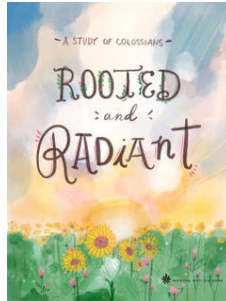
**SUNDAY, MARCH 24****Palm Sunday with Procession**

Holy Week begins next Sunday with Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. On this day, the Church recalls the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. This is liturgically observed with a procession, blessing of palms, and proclamation of the Gospel passage recounting Christ's entrance. The Gospel of the Mass itself is the Passion according to Mark (or Matthew or Luke in other years). The liturgical color is now red throughout, although purple was traditionally worn for the Mass itself.

In our Parish, the 12 NOON Solemn Mass of Palm Sunday is preceded by the Solemn Blessing of Palms and the chanting of the brief Office of Sext at 11:30 AM at St. Catherine's. After the Office, the congregation, with palms in hand, and accompanied by a brass quartet, processes through the streets over to St. Vincent's for the Mass. Pews will be reserved at St. Vincent's for those participating in the Procession.

**MONDAY, MARCH 25****Reconciliation Monday**

Monday of Holy Week, March 25, is Reconciliation Monday throughout the Archdiocese and the Dioceses of Brooklyn and Rockville Center. This is an opportunity for all to make their confession before Easter. Confessions will be heard at St. Catherine's from 2-5:05 PM and 6-9 PM and at St. Vincent's from 2-4 PM and 5:15-9 PM.

**THURSDAYS, APRIL 11-MAY 16****Women's Bible Study**
