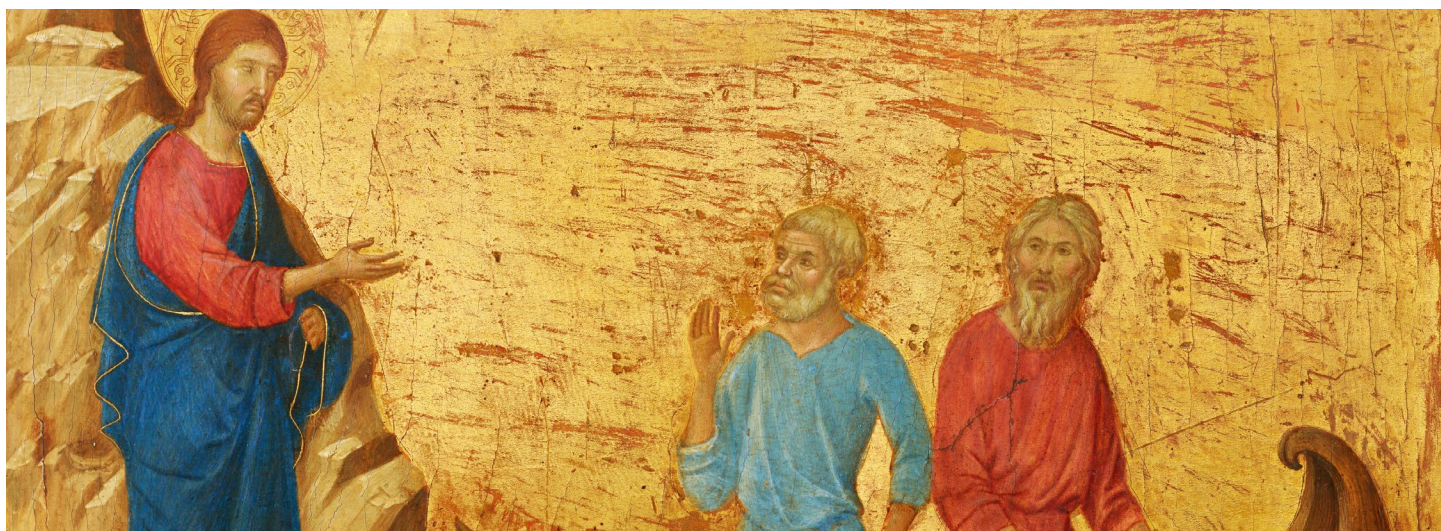

# Shrine of St. Jude Presentation Novena

It is with great joy that I take this opportunity to extend my prayerful best wishes to you and your loved ones for a Blessed and Happy New Year.

I hope that you had very enjoyable Christmas, and that you will continue to appreciate the cycle of the incarnation of Jesus Christ as we prepare to celebrate His Presentation in the Temple on February 2. This period of forty days from Christmas to the Presentation of the Lord was historically the Christmas cycle. For centuries, the feast of the Presentation was referred to as Candlemas, and it is still celebrated around the world, marking this important feast.

We can presume that Mary and Joseph waited patiently and prayerfully during those forty days after the birth of Jesus before making their pilgrimage to the Temple to present Jesus in fulfillment of the law. According to the account in Luke: 2:22-38, when the Holy Family arrived in the Temple, they were met by Simeon, who had waited all his life to see the Messiah and could finally die in peace because God's promise was fulfilled. The old man Simeon proclaimed him "a light to enlighten the Gentiles." Simeon's prayer upon taking Jesus into his arms is the canticle 'Nunc dimittis' in Luke 2:29-32 which the Church uses each night in Compline:

*Lord, now let your servant go in peace; your word has been fulfilled: my own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared in the sight of every people: a light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel.*

My brothers and sisters in Christ, I invite you to join us in our mid-winter novena of prayer to honor the parents of Jesus who brought their Child to the Temple to fulfill the Jewish ritual of purification and redemption. Beginning on January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, let us carry our intentions prayerfully as we celebrate Candlemas on February 2 and welcome Christ anew into our hearts and lives.

As usual, we will celebrate the Presentation Novena by saying the novena prayer at all five weekday Masses in our parish. In addition, we will say the prayer at all eight weekend Masses. There will be a Novena of Masses offered for your intentions beginning on January 25 and concluding on the Feast of the Presentation. Your intentions will be placed at the altar of sacrifice at St. Catherine's.

It has been the custom of honoring the Infant of Prague leading up to February 2. So, our novena shrines for this celebration will be located at the Infant of Prague Shrine in each church. The origin of the figure of the Infant Jesus of Prague is shrouded in legend. It was brought from Spain to Prague in the 16th century, and in 1628 was presented to the Discalced Carmelites. It became an object of popular devotion that received ecclesiastical approval through its coronation by the bishop of Prague on April 4, 1655.

Our common prayer intention will be for infants and respect for life from conception to birth. Let us not forget the families and the children who have been displaced and separated by wars in Ukraine and in Israel and Gaza. May we also keep in our prayers all those who have been injured or killed during these conflicts.

May we persevere in prayer and in waiting for Christ as did Simeon who welcomed the Light of the world. May the grace of this holy season fill your hearts and lives today and always. We will continue to light 175 candles at the Shrine of St. Jude for your intentions and the intentions of this novena of prayer.

Please, know that you and your loved ones remain in my daily Masses and prayers.

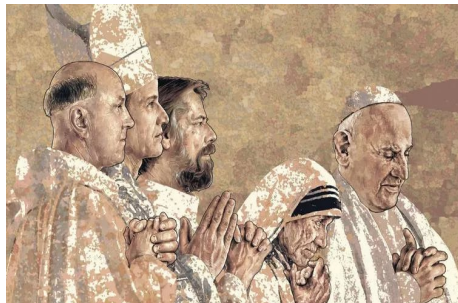

## THURSDAY, JANUARY 25, 6 PM

### Conversion of St. Paul

For the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, there will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's.

Saul of Tarsus (later, Paul) was a Pharisee and a persecutor of Christians in the period immediately following the Resurrection. As described in Chapter 9 of the Acts of the Apostles, Christ appeared to Paul on his way from Jerusalem to Damascus in Syria, asking why he was persecuting him. Paul fell to the ground and was blinded. Ananias, a disciple of Jesus from Damascus, restored Paul's sight and baptized him.

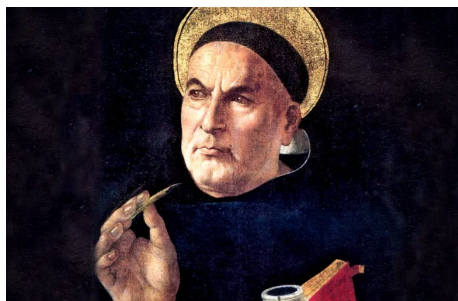
**SATURDAY, JANUARY 27, 8 AM-5 PM****Retreat for Married Couples: Learning Prayer through the Holy Family**

**MONDAY, JANUARY 29, 6 PM****Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas, O.P.**

This year, the Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican friar and Doctor of the Church known as the *Doctor Angelicus*, is transferred from January 28 to the next day. There will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's. Enrollment in the Angelic Warfare Confraternity will also be made following the Solemn Mass for those interested.

Born around 1225, he was educated at the abbey of Monte Cassino, in Paris under St. Albert the Great, and in Cologne. His prolific corpus of writings includes the *Summa theologiae*, a systematic scientific, philosophical, and theological examination of Catholic doctrine. He is the father of the eponymous Thomistic school of theology and philosophy. He died in 1274 (this year, we commemorate the 750th anniversary of his death) and was canonized in 1323. He is the patron of academics, bookmakers, students, and theologians.

**FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 6 PM****Candlemas**

For the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, commonly known as Candlemas, there will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Euge bone* by Christopher Tye; *Ave Dei Patris filia* by Robert Fayrfax; and *Videte miraculum* by William Mundy. The Solemn Mass will include the blessing of candles traditionally offered on this Feast. A reception will follow the Mass and Solemn Compline will be sung at 8 PM.

The life of Nuremberger Chrisoph Buel is almost completely unknown. Jacob Handl, born in the Duchy of Carniola in the Holy Roman Empire, had a varied career, serving as a musician in the Viennese court chapel, as choirmaster for a Moravian bishop, and as organist of the Church of St. John on the Balustrade in Prague from 1585 until his death. Both wrote in a poly-choral style in which two competing groups of musical forces singing as semi-independent entities (in this case: SSAT+ATTB for the Buel and SSAT+ATTBarB for the Handl).
