Holy cards will be available at both Churches and the Novena Prayer will be recited at all Masses during this period.

# FEAST OF ST. THOMAS AQUINAS, O.P.

Friday, January 28 is the Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican friar and Doctor of the Church known as the *Doctor Angelicus*. There will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer followed by a Solemn Enrollment in the Angelic Warfare Confraternity.

### **CANDLEMAS**

Wednesday, February 2, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, commonly known as Candlemas. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 pm at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing Marian music from the Spanish Renaissnace: *Missa Ego flos campi* by Juan Gutiérrez de Padilla; *Alma Redemptoris Mater á 8* by Tomás Luis de Victoria; and *Ave Maria á 8* by Francisco Guerrero. The Solemn Mass will include the blessing of candles traditionally offered on this Feast. The Wednesday Evening Holy Hour will be offered as usual following the Solemn Mass.

Do you know someone who complains that their children don't listen, don't follow what they have been taught, or challenge everything their parents tell them? That's Paul and the Church in Corinth. The Corinthians were a constant source of heartache for Paul. They wanted to know by what right Paul should claim authority over them. Both letters to the Corinthians defend his apostolate, and 2 Corinthians especially stresses that they would not have become believers – Christians – without having heard Paul's preached gospel.

Join us for a Parish Study on 2 Corinthians to unpack these ideas and build on last summer's Parish Study on 1 Corinthians. Fr. Albert Paretsky will lead the study on Tuesday evenings from 6:45-7:45 PM, from January 18 to February 15, in the Parish Hall at St. Vincent Ferrer. # **MUSIC NOTES**

Next Sunday, for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Schola will sing music of Carlo Gesualdo. Don Carlo, the wealthy Prince of Venosa and Count of Conza, married Leonora d'Este, the niece of Duke Alfonso II in 1594. It was while living in Ferrara for the two years following the marriage that he cultivated the expressive, highly chromatic musical language for which he became known and the likes of which would not be seen again until the late 19th century. Eventually returning to Gesualdo, he became increasingly reclusive, seeking remediation for past sins. He was the nephew of St. Charles Borromeo.

# The Dominican Shrine of St. Jude

I wish to extend my prayers and best wishes for a Blessed New Year!

As we approached the New Year many of us reflected upon a resolution or two that we might like to undertake. Then it was quietly set aside and completely forgotten. This is often the case with many of our dreams and intentions. We are creatures of habit and find ourselves too preoccupied with everything we are doing in our daily lives. According to where we might live, many of us find the months of January and February cold, dark, snowy and slushy, to say the least. We wish for longer days and light to cheer us up. Sound somewhat familiar?

Each year, after the Christmas and Epiphany season, we wait prayerfully with Mary and Joseph to take their baby Jesus in a procession, so to speak, to the Temple of the Lord for His Presentation. According to the Law of Moses, a woman was excluded from public worship for forty days following the birth of a male child. This period was considered the rite of purification. Then, on the fortieth day Mary, accompanied by Joseph, would go into the temple to comply with the ritual observance by presenting Jesus to the Lord. There would be the ritual of offering a pigeon or a turtledove to the temple. It was also customary to bring an offering of thanksgiving and praise to God for the safe delivery of the child. This offering would be a young lamb or, if the couple were poor, another pigeon or turtledove could be substituted.

We also read that when Mary and Joseph went to the temple for the purification, they took the child Jesus to "be consecrated to the Lord," and they offered a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, the offering of the poor. They were careful to observe all that the law required. This ceremony would have been an act of deep love for them.

In the Gospel of St. Luke, we read further that there was a man named Simeon in the temple of Jerusalem at that time, a man "just and pious, and he awaited the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him" (Luke 2:25). Luke continues to tell us that Simeon took the child Jesus in his arms and praised God saying:

"Lord, now you let your servant go in peace; Your word has been fulfilled: My own eyes have seen the salvation Which you have prepared in the sight of every people: A light to reveal you to the nations And the glory of your people Israel."

These words from the Liturgy of the Hours are recited daily in the Night Prayer of the Church. With the coming of the Child Jesus, we have the light breaking through the darkness of the Old Dispensation of a sin-weary world, and bringing in the light which God had promised through the prophets.

Christ, the true light, has entered our world. Many have not acknowledged Him, or have denied Him by their way of life. We have been given the opportunity through the grace of baptism, to walk in the light of Christ. Our parents were presented with a candle at our baptism and told to keep the light of Christ burning brightly. May our celebration of this Novena of prayer in honor of the Presentation of Christ, awaken within us a renewal of our life of grace begun at the time of our baptism.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, I invite you to join all our parishioners in our mid-winter of prayer to honor the parents of Jesus, who brought their child to the temple to fulfill the Jewish ritual of purification and redemption of their child. Beginning on January 25, the Feast of the Convertion of St. Paul, let us carry our lighted candles along with all our intentions, as we prepare to celebrate Candlemas on February 2 and to welcome Christ anew into our hearts and lives.


