Next weekend, we join Catholics around the world for the celebration of World Mission Sunday. ALL SAINTS DAY

Tuesday, November 1 is the Solemnity of All Saints, a **Holy Day of Obligation**. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Omnium Sanctorum*; *Cantabant sancti canticum novum*; and *In civitate Domini* by Andrea Rota. The Litany of Saints will also be chanted in procession at the Solemn Mass.

In addition to the regular weekday Mass and Confession schedule, there will be a 1 PM Low Mass at St. Catherine of Siena.

The evening Masses on Monday, October 31 will be for the Vigil of the Solemnity.

ALL SOULS DAY

Wednesday, November 2 is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, commonly known as All Souls Day. There will be a Solemn Requiem Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Requiem in C minor* by Luigi Cherubini.

The weekly Wednesday Holy Hour will follow the 6 PM Mass at St.

Vincent Ferrer as usual.

In addition to the regular weekday Mass and Confession schedule, there will be a 1 PM Low Mass at St. Catherine of Siena.

MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, the Thirtieth Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Schola will sing two motets by Peter Philips, an eminent English composer, organist, and Catholic priest exiled to Flanders. He was one of the great keyboard virtuosos of his time, with some of his keyboard works found in the Fitzwilliam Virginal Book. His surviving motets number in the hundreds, and although retaining some English characteristics, they are largely in the style of his conservative Italian contemporaries. Philips spent his childhood in London as a choirboy at St. Paul's Cathedral, under Sebastian Westcott who also had trained the young William Byrd some twenty years earlier. In 1582, Philips fled England, first to Rome where he studied with Felice Anerio and served as organist for the English Jesuit College. After considerable travel, he settled in Antwerp in 1590. By 1597 he was employed in Brussels as organist to the chapel of Albert VII, Archduke of Austria and governor of the Low Countries. Sometime after 1600, following the deaths of his wife and child, he was ordained and received a canonry at Soignies in 1610, and another at Béthune in 1622 or 1623.

Fr. Francis Belanger, O.P. - Parish Staff

It is a joy to begin pastoral service at St. Vincent and St. Catherine of Siena Parish. I have visited both churches and priories numerous times over the years and count it a privilege actually to be assigned here. I was raised in Rhode Island where my mother still lives, along with my sister and her family. I also have family in the New York City area, an added blessing. One of those relatives told me that I now have two teams to root for — the Patriots and the Giants. This sounds impossible, but miracles happen!

Most of my priesthood has been in parochial and campus ministry — in Charlottesville, Virginia; Hanover, New Hampshire; and Baltimore. Also I was novice master for our Dominican Province, in Cincinnati. One Dominican motto is *contemplare aliis tradere* —"to contemplate and to share with others the fruits of one's contemplation." 
Fr. John Paul Kern, O.P. - Director of the Dominican Foundation

Dominican Shrine of St. Jude Eleven Days of Prayer Honoring St. Luke and St. Jude October 18 – 28

Dear Parishioners and friends:

I take this opportunity to thank you for your participation in our Octave of Prayer honoring our Lady of Sorrows and the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. During these times when thousands of our clients of the Shrine of St. Jude are joined together in prayer, we can be sure that the intentions of all the participants are in fact being heard.

Our Shrine staff are preparing to celebrate eleven days of prayer honoring our Patron Saint Jude. These eleven days begin with the Feast of St. Luke (Oct. 18) and conclude with the Feast of St. Jude (Oct. 28). You might be wondering why eleven days and not just the traditional novena leading to the celebration of St. Jude. It has to do with mission and intention.

May we reflect together on our saints for these eleven days of prayer. St. Luke is one of four evangelists, along with Matthew, Mark, and John. Luke's Gospel gives us a look at the compassionate, forgiving Christ. His aim was to tell us who Jesus Christ was through His life, death, resurrection, and ascension. He wrote a masterful piece of work in perfect Greek which may have been his native tongue. Luke's Gospel is a "Gospel of Joy" as well as a "Gospel of the Poor." Christian tradition recognizes Luke as the "beloved physician" (Col. 4:14), as St. Paul calls him.

St. Jude, also identified as Jude Thaddeus, brother of James, was supposedly a fisherman by trade. He shares a common feast with St. Simon, who is called "the Zealot." The two preached the Gospel together in Egypt before going to Persia, where Jude was martyred. The Letter authored by St. Jude warns Christian converts against false teachings and immorality. His popularity grew around being identified as the "patron of impossible cases." Personally, I have preferred to identify him as the "patron of the despondent." In our spiritual journey, I do not believe that there is an impossible case. We have all been redeemed and saved by the cross of Jesus Christ.

With the foregoing thoughts in mind, I propose these eleven days as an opportunity to join in prayer for the medical professionals and patients in the hospitals here in our Parish of St. Vincent Ferrer and St. Catherine of Siena. Earlier, I indicated that this period of prayer has to do with mission and intention. Our mission here at the Shrine of St. Jude has always been the hospital apostolate.

The friars in our two priories are the chaplains for the various hospitals surrounding the parish, as well as for other city hospitals outside the immediate vicinity of St. Catherine's. They are on duty on a rotation basis, as well as on call and available—depending on patient needs—twenty-four hours a day. Their ministry is strenuous and emotionally draining, to say the least.

It is for this reason that we invite you to pray with us in support of our medical personnel, chaplains, and patients. Each day as I spend time in St. Catherine's Church and at the shrine, I assist grieving families when they tell me about the terminal condition of their loved ones. I assure them of our prayers and support, and I encourage them to place the names of their sick in our prayer intention book. There are phone calls from people asking for prayers from all over the country. Our mission is not limited to any location.


With these intentions in mind, I invite you to join our Shrine and Parish Families for these eleven days of prayer to the healers Luke and Jude, beginning on Oct. 18 and going through Oct. 28. Books for listing your intentions will be set up in the Holy Name Shrine where there is a statute of St. Jude in the Church of St. Vincent Ferrer and on the altar at the Shrine of St. Jude in the Church of St. Catherine of Siena. The prayers for these eleven days will be said at five daily Masses in our parish, as well as all eight of the Masses we celebrate on Sunday. I n addition, we will offer Masses beginning on the celebration of St. Luke and concluding on the celebration of St. Jude for your intentions.


I pray that you might find in these days of prayer a true source of grace and healing. May Saints Luke and Jude bring you true peace and consolation in all your prayers. God bless you.


