THE DOMINICAN SHRINE OF ST. JUDE

DECADE OF PRAYER WITH ST. LUKE AND ST. JUDE THADDEUS OCTOBER 18 – 28, 2021

As the Director of the Shrine of St. Jude, I once again wish to invite you to join us in storming our heavenly patron, St. Jude, for eleven days of prayer. These eleven days begin with the Feast of St. Luke (October 18) and end with the Feast of St. Jude (October 28). You might be wondering why the eleven days and not just the traditional novena leading to the celebration of St. Jude. It has to do with mission and intention.

An ancient tradition tells us that St. Luke was from Syria and was also a doctor. He accompanied Paul on his second missionary journey and was also with Paul at the end of the latter's life in Rome. Luke very likely left Rome after Paul's death and traveled to Greece, where he wrote his Gospel, as well as the Acts of the Apostles, as a kind of epilogue. Luke is the patron of those in the medical profession as well as of painters. It is believed that he painted an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He died of natural causes at about the age of 84.

St. Jude, also identified as Jude Thaddeus, shares a common feast with St. Simon, who is called "the Zealous." The two preached the Gospel together in Egypt before going on to Persia, where Jude was martyred. The Letter, authored by St. Jude, warns Christian converts against false teachings and immorality. His popularity grew around his being identified as the "patron of impossible cases." I have always preferred to identify him as the "patron of the despondent." In our spiritual journey I do not believe that there is an impossible case. We have all been redeemed and saved by the cross of Jesus Christ.

With the foregoing thoughts in mind, I propose these 11 days as an opportunity to join in prayer for the medical professionals and patients in the hospitals here in our Parish of St. Vincent Ferrer and St. Catherine of Siena. Our mission here at the Shrine of St. Jude has always been the hospital apostolate. The friars in our two priories are the chaplains for the various hospitals surrounding the Parish, as well as for other city hospitals outside the immediate vicinity of St. Catherine's. They are on duty on a roation basis, as well as on call and available—depending on patient needs—twenty-four hours a day. Their ministry is strenuous and emotionally draining, to say the least.

It is for this reason that we invite you to pray with us in support of our medical personnel, chaplains, and patients. Each day as I spend time in our church and at the shrine, I assist grieving families when they tell me about the terminal condition of their loved ones. I assure them of our prayers and support, and I encourage them to place the names of their sick in our prayer intention book on the altar of the Shrine of the Holy Cross.

With these intentions in mind, I invite you to join our Shrine and Parish Families in this Octave of Prayer to the healers Luke and Jude, beginning on October 18th and going through the 28th. The prayers to our saints will be recited daily at each of the Masses in our churches. The 5:15 PM Mass will be celebrated daily at St. Catherine's for these intentions and for those that have been mailed into the shrine on this occasion.
