Music Notes

This Sunday, the Schola offers motets by Andrea Gabrieli and Giovanni Bassano, two members of the Venetian School associated with that city's Basilica of St. Mark's. Next weekend, for the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Schola will present a double-choir motet by Giovanni Croce, an almost exact Venetian contemporary of Bassano.

The other motet, O altitudo divitiarum, is a hymn praising the Holy Trinity written by Bolognese composer Ascanio Trombetti. Born into a family of musicians, their adoptive surname is apparently due to their reputation as wind instrumentalists. Ascanio began deputizing at the Basilica of St. Petronio in 1560 and was given a permanent appointment in 1574 which he retained until at least 1590. Ascanio was also maestro di cappella of the Church of St. Giovanni in Monte from 1583 until 1589.

The Dominican Charism - Prayer & the Rosary

Many Dominicans have a distinctive walk. This isn't because of how quickly or slowly we walk nor is it about how softly or firmly our feet hit the ground. Rather, it's about the Rosaries we wear on our habits. There is a particular cadence and timbre to the sound of a habit Rosary—the beads rubbing against one another, the holy medals ringing as they hit the beads or one another, the beads sliding along a chair as the friar sits down. Often, when people get to know the Dominicans better, they can start to distinguish one from another just by hearing the sounds from their Rosary as they walk. In a sense, then, the Rosary reveals the person and becomes a means to better know that Dominican from the next.

On a deeper level, isn't this what the Rosary is supposed to do? Isn't it supposed to reveal a person? Not so much this or that friar or sister, but rather the person of Jesus Christ. "This school of Mary" in which we contemplate "the scenes of the Rosary in union with Mary is a means of learning from her to 'read' Christ, to discover his secrets and to understand his message" (St. John Paul II, *Rosarium Virginis Maria*, 14). When we pray the Rosary, we are mystically transported "to Mary's side as she is busy watching over the human growth of Christ in the home of Nazareth" where she molds and shapes us "until Christ is 'fully formed' in us (cf. Gal 4:19)" (*Rosarium Virginis Maria*, 15). In other words, the Rosary is a Christocentric prayer, with the purpose of helping us to meditate on the mysteries in the life of Christ and to imitate the virtues that He lived out in each of those mysteries (cf. *Rosarium Virginis Maria*, 1).

This sort of Christocentric and virtue focused contemplative prayer is what makes the Rosary such an emblematic Dominican form of prayer. As the tradition has it, when St. Dominic was struggling in his preaching to the Albigensians, the Blessed Mother gave him the Rosary as a tool to aid his preaching. Regardless of the debate about whether or not this is historically verifiable, it is clear that the reconciliation of the Albigensians to the Church needed to involve a prayer that emphasized the humanity of Christ and His virtues being manifest in His words and deeds. The Albigensians denied that God created material things, and so an emphasis on Christ's actions, the actions of God-made-man, was critically important in bringing them back into the fold of the Church.


As we begin our reflections on the four pillars of Dominican life–prayer, study, community, and preaching—it seems most fitting to begin with prayer, especially on this day when the Dominican Order celebrates "Rosary Sunday." On the old Dominican calendar, the first Sunday in October was the date to celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. October was one of Mary's months, and so the Order began the month with a celebration of Our Lady's protection over the Church through answering the faithfuls prayers in the Rosary. In like fashion, the Order also established the custom of blessing rose petals on this day so that the faithful could bring them home and, through the intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary, be protected from the attacks of the devil and his minions. For the roses symbolize a pleasing fragrance that would be lifted up to heaven and remind Christ of the blessed life of His Virgin Mother.

Throughout this month and the whole of our lives, may Our Lady draw us deeper into communion with her Son, and through her intercession may we grow in His virtues unto everlasting life.
