GOLD MASS FOR SCIENTISTS (FEAST OF ST. ALBERT THE GREAT, O.P.)

Tuesday, November 15 is the Feast of St. Albert the Great, O.P., the patron saint of scientists who advocated the synthesis of faith and reason. There will be a Mass in the Dominican Rite at 7 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Pange lingua* by Josquin des Prez, a masterpiece of the early Renaissance. This is the annual Gold Mass for scientists.

FEAST OF ST. CECILIA

Tuesday, November 22 is the Memorial of St. Cecilia, Virgin Martyr. Because she is the patron saint of music and musicians, there will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa choralis* (Missa Orbis factor), Op. 102 by Vinzenz Goller; *Afferentur regi virgines* by Anton Bruckner; and *Cantantibus organis* by Philippe Rogier.

But, in another way, it is the life-long process by which fully initiated Catholics re-discover the faith and delve more deeply into the call of Christian discipleship. THANKSGIVING NOVENA

From Thursday, November 17 through Thanksgiving Day on Thursday, November 25, the Parish will offer a Thanksgiving Novena of Prayer. Holy cards and petition slips will be available at both Churches.

THANKSGIVING DAY

On **Thursday, November 24**, Thanksgiving Day, there will only be two Masses offered in the Parish: a Low Mass at 9 AM at St. Catherine of Siena and a Sung Mass at 10 AM at St. Vincent Ferrer. Both churches will close following the Masses.

The Parish Offices will be closed Wednesday–Friday, November 23–25, but Masses and Confessions will be offered as usual on Wednesday and Friday.

MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, for the Solemnity of Christ the King, the last Sunday before Advent, the Schola will sing the final setting of the Ordinary Mozart completed. Written for Salzburg Cathedral's Solemn Mass of Easter, 1780, it is often called the "Colloredo Mass" after Count Hieronymus von Colloredo, the Prince-Archbishop of Salzburg under whose patronage the setting was composed. It will be accompanied by a small chamber orchestra, as would have been the arrangement in Mozart's day.

Following the Solemn Mass, the Procession to the Cathedral will be accompanied by festive music played by a brass quartet. The Schola will also sing for the final Benediction given by Cardinal Dolan at Saint Patrick's.

BURYING THOSE WHO HAVE PASSED

We hear in 2 Maccabees about how after a battle, Judas Maccabeus was searching the bodies of the fallen Jews and found tokens of pagan worship on them. In light of this, he and the rest of the Jews with him "turned to prayer, beseeching that the sin which had been committed might be wholly blotted out" (2 Maccabees 12:42). Likewise, he "took up a collection, man by man, to the amount of two thousand drachmas of silver, and sent it to Jerusalem to provide for a sin offering. In doing this he acted very well and honorably, taking account of the resurrection" (2 Maccabees 12:43).

In the same way, we too take "account of the resurrection" and place our hope that just as Christ was raised from the dead so too will we all be raised from the dead at the end of time. Each and every Sunday, in the Creed at Mass, we pray, "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead." By professing this, we are not saying that we believe in life after death. We do believe that as well, but this is about something else. This is about how at the end of time, all people will get their bodies back. Jesus tells us, "For the hour is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear [God's] voice and come forth, those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment" (John 5:28-29). Our bodies will be raised as spiritual bodies as St. Paul says (cf. Philippians 3:21, 1 Corinthians 15:44). What that means is still a little mysterious, but no matter what we can be sure that we will get our bodies back at the end of time. For the blessed in heaven, this will make their experience of the new heavens and the new earth even better (cf. Revelation 21:1).

It is for this reason that the Church has always buried the dead. From ancient times, the Church has held that the appropriate thing to do with the remains of the deceased, whether the whole body (i.e. a burial with a casket) or in the form of cremains, is to bury the deceased in consecrated ground at a Catholic cemetery. Scattering ashes or preserving them in jewelry or other objects overlooks the reality of the resurrection of the body as well as separates the deceased from a place where the entire Christian community may pray for their peaceful repose, and for these reasons these practices should be avoided.

If you still have the cremains of your loved ones in your home, we recognize that it might be hard to part with them. With hope in the resurrection of the dead and with faith that, God-willing, you will be reunited with them one day, we encourage you to arrange for their burial. Here is a list of Catholic Cemeteries in the area to help facilitate this:
