We can be saints too!

SAINTS FOR ALL TIMES

This past weekend, I gave a vocation's retreat for the Dominican Sisters in Hawthorne, NY. They care for people who are dying from cancer, and their home is quite beautiful. The patients have the chance to go to Mass, receive Anointing of the Sick, and Last Rites. The sisters also pray by the patients' bedsides when they are in their last moments, offering not just medical but also spiritual care. After hearing about our new reliquary, and in gratitude for my visit, Mother Marie Edward gave me a 1st Class relic of Ven. Rose Hawthorne, their foundress. Currently, two miracles attributed to her are being reviewed in Rome. As soon as she is declared "Blessed," you can bet that her relic will go into the reliquary!

Rose was the daughter of the author Nathaniel Hawthorne, and she had lived in New York City. After her conversion, she frequented both churches of our Parish. She eventually became a lay Dominican, and then, under the guidance of one of our friars, began the Dominican Sisters of St. Rose of Lima (commonly known as the Hawthorne Dominicans) to care for those dying from cancer. This humble and faith-filled woman who knew our Parish, prayed here, and led so many people to God, was declared "Venerable" this spring. Not only do we have records of her holiness, but now the Vatican has officially declared that her life was virtuous and worthy of imitation.

Ven. Rose Hawthorne prayed here, as do we. As I've mentioned before, numerous saints walked the streets of this city. In Rose Hawthorne, though, we have someone who prayed in our churches. What's to stop us from becoming holy too? Heaven is possible, and we can be saints too. Let us offer our lives to Christ and completely entrust ourselves to His graces, so that, having been transformed by Him, we may enter into the heavenly kingdom.

There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's for the Memorial of St. Cecilia, Virgin Martyr and the patron saint of music and musicians, for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Mass in C, Op. 70* by John Gardner and *Cantantibus organis and Cecilia virgo* by Peter Philips.

After Mass, there will be a reception in the Cloister Walk, and this is a beautiful chance for all of us to thank our choir members for all that they do for the parish on the patron's feast day.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 24, 12 NOON**Christ the King Procession**

Sunday, November 24, the final Sunday of the liturgical year, is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Following the 12 NOON Solemn Mass, the Parish will have its **annual Eucharistic Procession from St. Vincent's to St. Patrick's Cathedral where Benediction will be offered.** All are encouraged to attend.

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 28**Thanksgiving Day**

On Thanksgiving Day, there will only be **two Masses** offered in our Parish: a Low Mass at 9 AM at St. Catherine's and a Solemn Mass at 10 AM at St. Vincent's for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Brevis No. 2 in F Major*, Hob. XXII:1 by Franz Joseph Haydn; *Illuminare, Jerusalem* by Pierre de Manchicourt; and *Pater noster* (1585) by Orlando di Lasso. **This is the first year we are offering a Solemn Mass on Thanksgiving Day; all are encouraged to attend.** St. Vincent's will be open from 8 AM - 12 NOON, and St. Catherine's will remain open until the early afternoon.

The Parish Offices will be closed Wednesday – Friday, November 27 – 29, but Masses and Confessions will be offered on the regular schedule on Wednesday and Friday. The Wednesday evening Holy Hour on November 27 will be offered as usual.

ADVENT**Beginning Sunday, December 1**

Sunday, December 1, is the First Sunday of Advent, which marks the beginning of the new liturgical year: Year C in the three-year lectionary cycle during which we hear from the Gospel of St. Luke. The season of Advent (from the Latin *adventus* meaning "coming") looks forward to the birth of Christ, calling the faithful to prepare for his arrival: first in meekness and mercy and ultimately in judgment and glory.

Liturgies during this "privileged" season of Advent strike a note of anticipation and repentance that is mingled with joy and hope; hence, although penitential violet is the season's liturgical color, the Gloria is omitted, and the use of the organ is moderated, the Alleluia is retained. The congregational Ordinary (Kyrie, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei) at Sung Masses changes to the Latin-version of *Missa XVIII*. The Marian Antiphon at the conclusion of Mass changes from *Salve Regina* (sung from Trinity Sunday until Advent) to *Alma Redemptoris Mater* (from Advent until Candlemas).

The Advent Wreath at both churches will be blessed at the Vigil Masses on November 30.

MUSIC NOTES

There are two remaining Sundays of Ordinary Time and the Solemnity of Christ the King before the year turns to Advent. As the Liturgical Year draws to a close, the lectionary focuses on the coming of the Lord at the end of time. The two Spanish Renaissance motets for Sunday complement that theme with the texts, "Behold the Lord shall come" and "Come, O Lord, and tarry not".
