Christ our King

How blessed are we to have such a good and gracious King? Our King gave the whole of His life for us, He came to serve us, and He continues to offer us all the graces we need to live in virtue and holiness.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 26 Christ the King Procession

The Most Reverend Gerardo J. Colacicco, Auxiliary Bishop of New York, will celebrate the 12 NOON Pontifical Mass for the Solemnity of Christ the King, after which he will lead a Eucharistic Procession from St. Vincent's to St. Patrick's Cathedral where Benediction will be offered.

For the Solemnity of Christ the King, the Schola will sing Mozart's Mass in C Major, K. 258. This is one of three Ordinaries Mozart composed in late 1776, just before departing Salzburg for Mannheim, Paris, and eventually Vienna. Its soubriquet seems to refer to the Mass's brevity.

SEASON OF ADVENT Beginning Sunday, December 3

Sunday, December 3 is the First Sunday of Advent, which marks the beginning of the new liturgical year: Year B in the three-year lectionary cycle during which we hear from the Gospel of St. Mark. The season of Advent (from the Latin adventus meaning "coming") looks forward to the birth of Christ, calling the faithful to prepare for his arrival: first in meekness and mercy and ultimately in judgment and glory.

Liturgies during this "privileged" season of Advent strike a note of anticipation and repentance that is mingled with joy and hope; hence, although penitential violet is the season's liturgical color, the Gloria is omitted, and the use of the organ is moderated, the Alleluia is retained. The congregational Ordinary (Kyrie, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei) at Sung Masses changes to the Latin-version of Missa XVIII. The Marian Antiphon at the conclusion of Mass changes from Salve Regina (sung from Trinity Sunday until Advent) to Alma Redemptoris Mater (from Advent until Candlemas).

The Advent Wreath at both churches will be blessed at the Vigil Masses on December 2.

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 8 **Immaculate Conception**

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation and the Patronal Feast of the United States. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's.

In addition to the regular weekday Mass and Confession schedule, there will be a 10 AM School Mass at St. Vincent's and a 1 PM Low Mass at St. Catherine's. The evening Masses on Thursday, December 7 will be for the Vigil of the Solemnity and will satisfy the obligation.

The Act of Total Consecration to Jesus Christ through Mary will be made after Friday's 5:15 PM Mass at St. Catherine's.

MUSIC NOTES Sunday, December 3, 12 NOON

For the First Sunday of Advent, the Schola will sing music from the Italian Renaissance. The heraldic tone of this anticipatory season is announced in both motets. The Offertory text begins: Blow the trumpet in the new moon, even on our solemn feast day [Psalm 80 (81)]. And the Communion exclaims: Blow the trumpet in Zion, for the day of the Lord is near; behold, he shall come to save us (Joel 2:1). The Ordinary is based on a Marian motet, also by Palestrina, and gives nod to the devotion to the expectant Mother during Advent: As a lily among thorns, so is my dear one among the daughters of Adam (Song of Songs 2:2).
