Principles for Voting, Part II

CONCERN FOR CHARITY

In October of 2020, the Campus Ministry Staff at Providence College had a meeting with our Campus Ministry Leadership students, those who oversaw our programs and were on the front lines of daily interactions with students. We told them that whoever won the election, it was very likely that the day after the election they would experience different reactions. Someone very well could come up to them to complain about the President-Elect, and this could be followed by someone else coming in and ecstatically supporting the President-Elect. In both situations, they were to remember that they were called to charity. Interestingly enough, the day after this meeting, I had back-to-back meetings with students where this happened. I hope that I lived out my own words then.

With this election season, what is our call as Christians? It's charity. First, our voting patterns should come from charity, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. ... You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37, 39). Yes, our voting should be rooted in the love of God above all else and the love our neighbors as ourselves.

Second, our response to other voters should have that twofold call to charity at its core. If we are called even to love our enemies (cf. Matthew 5:44), then we surely are called to love those who vote differently than we do. When people vote from a well-formed conscience and do so in a way that seeks charity, we are called to love them, even if we disagree with them.

In other words, charity should guide us before and after our votes.

PARTICULAR CONCERNS

When it comes to particular issues, there are a whole host of ideas that different politicians have. Some of their answers might resonate with us, and some might not. Rather than trying to address each of the possible concerns here, the US Bishops sum them up in their new Introductory Note in their *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*. While this passage is long, I think it's worth quoting: "The threat of abortion remains our pre-eminent priority because it directly attacks our most vulnerable and voiceless brothers and sisters and destroys more than a million lives per year in our country alone. Other grave threats to the life and dignity of the human person include euthanasia, gun violence, terrorism, the death penalty, and human trafficking. There is also the redefinition of

marriage and gender, threats to religious freedom at home and abroad, lack of justice for the poor, the suffering of migrants and refugees, wars and famines around the world, racism, the need for greater access to healthcare and education, care for our common home, and more. All threaten the dignity of the human person." The Bishops lay out the most important issues and give precedence to certain ones over others. This is a good thing to pray about and take to heart as you are trying to form your conscience in preparation for voting. Furthermore, how does the two-fold call to charity play into this? How, through your voting, can you best love God and your neighbor when it comes to these concerns?

PROPOSITION 1

Finally, I want to say a few words about Proposition 1, the proposed "Equal Rights Amendment" to the New York state constitution. If passed, Proposition 1 would have dire effects on our society, and so the New York Bishops have called this to our attention.

First, it would make "reproductive healthcare" a right, which would mean that abortion up to birth and for any reason at all would be considered a state right. This is something gravely contrary to both Catholic teaching and the principles of natural law.

Second, in codifying "age" as something that cannot be discriminated against, this would allow for children to make decisions without parental consent. No matter the age, if a child insists on some procedure, then a parent loses their right to have a say or even to know that something is being discussed.

Hence, the Bishops of New York are all of one mind that the ramifications of this proposition are gravely harmful to society, and are asking all people of good will to vote "No" on Proposition 1.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION FOR THE ELECTION

With the worries that people have over this election and the likely unrest that will occur in different parts of the country depending on who is elected, we are going to host an All-Night Eucharistic Adoration at St. Vincent's from Monday, November 4 at 7 PM until Tuesday, November 5 at 7 AM. Please join us as we pray for wisdom and charity for voters as well as for civility and peace after the election. May God's will be done.
