Support for our Deceased Loved Ones

The year after college was a working year for me. I had begun the application process to the Dominican Order by the end of my senior year but not in time to apply to enter that year. So I found myself in need of work. To make a long story short, I got a job at a funeral home (feel free to ask me about the longer version of the story). Ironically, it was a very enlivening experience for me because I was given the chance to learn about the priesthood while applying to enter the Order. I watched dozens of priests, and even some bishops, as they ministered to grieving families, and I was given the chance to pray in cemeteries, to attend numerous Funeral Masses, and even to drive the limo and speak to the families putting into practice what I had learned. It was an incredibly rewarding and formative experience in many ways.

I can remember one story in particular of a soldier who had given his life to save his company. He was a young man who had a promising military career ahead of him. Yes, his family was sad, but they had incredible consolation that their son died heroically and in imitation of Christ's words, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). This was one of many stories where, even in the midst of grief, the family members were able to reflect on so much for which they had been thankful.

GIFTS OF PRAYER FOR OUR DECEASED LOVED ONES

In recent bulletins, I have been speaking about ways to show gratitude to God, to the Church, to the Dominican Order, and so forth. In a similar way, we can extend our gratitude to those who have gone before us. We can show them that we love them as we pray for them, have Masses said for them, light 5-day candles or request week long candles for them, enroll them in the St. Catherine's Purgatorial Society, offer up sacrifices and penances for them, and memorialize them in various ways. Our prayers for them are acts of love and thankfulness, which help their souls as they are being lovingly purified by God to become even more suitable to behold His goodness. In other words, all that we offer on their behalf helps to open the eyes of their hearts to look upon God and live eternally (cf. Revelation 22:4). It is like we're saying to them, "Thank you for all that you did for me. Through this, I want to help you get the best reward possible—heaven."

This can be especially helpful if we never had the chance to come to closure or to reconcile with a particular person. Sometimes, at the

time of another's death, there are unresolved situations from the past. This can either be things that we did that we regret or things that they did for which they never apologized. We can show them our love and desire for reconciliation as we ask their forgiveness for things that we've done. We also can offer them our forgiveness through acts of prayer and sacrifice. All the forms of prayer mentioned above are beautiful ways to say, "Please forgive me" or "Please know that I forgive you." As such, they reveal even now that we desire their holiness and peace.

GIFT OF A FINAL REST

One final way to show our deceased loved ones that we still love them is to bury them. Sometimes after the funeral, people want to hold on to the urn for a little while so that they have time to sort through the emotions of the heart. One of the ways to do just that is actually to bring their urn to a place of rest in a cemetery where they can be lovingly cared for and visited for decades, even centuries, and where we can finally entrust them to the eternal care of God. During the time that I worked at the funeral home, I made sure to pray for all the souls whose bodies were buried in the cemeteries I visited, and I bless every cemetery that I pass even now. In a cemetery, scores of people can offer their prayers for your loved ones, even if they never know them. If you need help finding a cemetery in which to bury your loved one, please ask the Parish Office. We are very happy to help you!

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 7 PM Mystagogy: Church History, Characters, and Doctrines

John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran is the cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome and serves as the seat (cathedral) of the Roman Pontiff. It is the oldest and highest ranking of the four Major Basilicas, holding the unique title of "archbasilica." (The other three Major or Papal Basilicas are St. Peter's, St. Paul Outside-the-Walls, and St. Mary Major.)

For the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Schola will sing two motets by Spanish Renaissance composer Francisco Guerrero. He held the position of *maestro di capilla* at the Cathedrals of Jaén and Seville, his native city.

The final few Sunday of the liturgical year look to the coming of the Lord in judgment and justice at the end of the age. The Offertory motet implores the Lord: "Come and do not delay; show your face and we shall be saved. As a mother consoles her children, so will you console us." The Communion motet restates the Sunday Gospel parable of the wise and foolish virgins.
