SOLEMN DOMINICAN RITE REQUIEM MASS

On Monday, November 8 at 7 PM, a Solemn Requiem Mass in the Dominican Rite will be offered at St. Vincent Ferrer. The Schola Cantorum will sing Maurice Durufle's *Requiem*, Op. 9. The Mass is co-sponsored by the New York Purgatorial Society.

LATERAN BASILICA

Tuesday, November 9 is the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. There will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer.

The Cathedral of the Most Holy Savior and of Sts. John the Baptist and the Evangelist in the Lateran is cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome and serves as the seat (*cathedra*) of the Roman Pontiff. It is the oldest and highest ranking of the four Major Basilicas, holding the unique title of "archbasilica." (The other three Major or Papal Basilicas are St. Peter's, St. Paul Outside-the-Walls, and St. Mary Major.)

FEAST OF ST. ALBERT THE GREAT, O.P.

Monday, November 15 is the Feast of St. Albert the Great, O.P., patron saint of scientists who advocated the synthesis of faith and reason. There will be a "Gold Mass" in the Dominican Rite at 7 pm at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing Maurice Duruflé's *Messe cum jubilo*, Op. 11. Like the other Masses for members of particular professions, the Gold Mass is offered for scientists.

CHRIST THE KING

Sunday, November 21 is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the final Sunday of the liturgical year. This feast, instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, is the culmination of the time after Pentecost during which the Church lectionary has been describing the workings of the Holy Spirit in the world, urging the faithful to prepare for the coming (the Advent) of the Lord, both in his lowly birth at Bethlehem and in his kingly glory at the end of the age.

FEAST OF ST. CECILIA

Monday, November 22 is the Memorial of St. Cecilia, Virgin Martyr. Because she is the patron saint of musicians, there will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing Pierre Clereau's *Missa Cecilia Virgo* and Jean de Castro's *Cantantibus Organis* – *Biduanis*.

MUSIC NOTES

Next weekend, for the Thirty-third and final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Schola will present motets by two of the most influential polyphonic composers. At least 375 works are attributed to Josquin des Prez, the head of the Franco-Flemish school of composition. Born in the lands controlled by the Dukes of Burgundy, Josquin grew up as a choirboy and possibly studied under Ockeghem. In the 1490s, Josquin was a member of the papal choir in Rome, and from there worked in Milan, France, and briefly in Duke Ercole I's court in Ferrara (at a post for which Isaac had been considered). He spent the last twenty years of his life in his native region of Condé-sur-l'Escaut.

The Dominican Charism - Prayer & Intercession of the Dominican Saints

"Let them do what they wish. I will be worse to them in death than in life." On Palm Sunday, 1252, St. Peter Martyr preached before a huge multitude (one source says "tens of thousands") in front of Sant' Eustorgio, the Dominican church in Milan. He had recently become aware of an assassination that was plotted against him, but he was not worried. He had spent years trying to convert the Albigensians of northern Italy back to the practice of the Catholic faith and had been noticeably successful. This angered the Albigensians around Milan, which had become a sort of Albigensian stronghold, and so they made plans to kill him. His preaching ended up being prophetic, though. For soon after his death, the entire Milanese area had come back to the Catholic faith. Even more impressive is the story of the man who martyred him, Carino of Balsamo. He too converted, and after this conversion, he entered the Dominican Order as a cooperator brother and is now a blessed.

This story, among many others, depicts the beauty of the intercession of the saints. When St. Paul speaks about the Church in 1 Corinthians 12, he speaks about the variety of gifts given to her members: "To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another mighty deeds; to another prophecy; to another discernment of spirits; to another varieties of tongues; to another interpretation of tongues" (1 Cor. 12:8-10). Each of these gifts is given by the Holy Spirit to help guide the members of the Church through this pilgrimage of life as we seek to arrive safely at our heavenly home.

What is interesting is that many of these gifts seem to continue in heaven. Healings, mighty deeds, spiritual insights, knowledge of the workings of God's providence, and so many other things all seem to come through the intercession of the saints in heaven, with certain saints playing certain roles. St. Dominic, St. Peter Martyr, and so many others prophesied their heavenly intercession. As St. Therese described it, they would spend their time in heaven doing good upon earth. This is why we associate saints with a certain patronage. For instance, St. Thomas Aquinas's brilliant insights about the Eucharist are not just the subject of the treatises he wrote, but his knowledge of God's goodness has only increased now that he is in heaven. Thus, his intercession for our study of the faith is so helpful. St. Albert the Great's incredible research in all things scientific was not simply meant to help those in his day, but his intercession now aids the work of scientists and researchers as they too seek to understand the beauty of God's creation. St. Catherine of Siena worked diligently to bring about peace among warring states, and so her intercession now before the King of Peace in heaven is a great support for those in the midst of political conflict. The list goes on and on among the Dominican saints and all the saints in heaven.

For a parish served by a religious Order, there is a special connection between the intercession of the saints of the Order with those connected to that Order. In his discussion about the order of charity (*ST* II-II, q. 26), St. Thomas points out not only that we should love God above all else and that we should love our souls more than our neighbors, but also that we can have greater love for some people than others. This especially applies to those united to us in a particular way, and being joined in a religious family as brothers and sisters unites people in a most beautiful fashion. This means that because the Dominican saints are my brothers and sisters in heaven, I can entrust myself to their heavenly intercession. Thus, Bl. James Salomonio, O.P. might be a more helpful intercessor if I get cancer than St. Peregrine because Bl. James is my brother.

In the same way, the more that we become associated with the Dominicans–by joining as a friar, cloistered nun, active sister, lay Dominican, or even in some way by being a parishioner of a Dominican parish—the more that the Dominican saints and blesseds in heaven will be bound to us in the order of charity and thus intercede on our behalf with particular interest. What a gift that is, and what a beautiful family we have in Our Holy Father Dominic!

On this day, the Feast of All Dominicans Saints, and as we celebrate the feasts of the Dominican saints this month–St. Martin de Porres (Nov. 3), Bl. Bonaventure Garcia Paredes and his companion martyrs (Nov. 6), St. Albert the Great (Nov. 15), St. Ignatius Delgado and his companion martyrs (Nov. 24), and St. Catherine of Alexandria, co-patroness of the Dominican Order (Nov. 25)—may their charity for us lead to their intercession so that even while in heaven they may still do good on earth.

FRASSATI HOLY HOUR AND FELLOWSHIP


