# LATERAN BASILICA

Monday, November 9 is the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. There will be a Sung Mass at 6 рм at St. Vincent Ferrer.

The Cathedral of the Most Holy Savior and of Sts. John the Baptist and the Evangelist in the Lateran is cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome and serves as the seat (*cathedra*) of the Roman Pontiff. It is the oldest and highest ranking of the four Major Basilicas, holding the unique title of "archbasilica." (The other three Major or Papal Basilicas are St. Peter's, St. Paul Outside-the-Walls, and St. Mary Major.)

## **MUSIC NOTES**

Next Sunday, for the 33rd and Last Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Schola will offer the final motet of the "Sundays after Pentecost" section of Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina's collection *Offertoria totius anni* (Offertory Antiphons for the Whole Year). The text of this Offertory Antiphon, *Out of the depths I have cried to you, O Lord; Lord, hear my voice* (Psalm 129 (130):1, 2) is one of the most recognizable lines from the entire Psalter.

Franco-Flemish Jacobus Vaet's motet sung at Communion quotes the Prophet Isaiah, referencing the power of Christ at the consummation of the age, a theme which runs through the final Sunday of Ordinary Time and the Solemnity of Christ the King. *Before me there was no God formed, and after me there shall be none. For every knee shall be bowed to me, and every tongue shall praise me.* (Isaiah 43:10; 45:23)

# BACH ORGAN PROJECT

With the new Parish Year in mid-September, I began a project in which I plan to present all of the major organ works of Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) as the voluntaries (preludes and postludes) at Sunday Mass throughout the next year. The project will continue over the remaining Sundays in Ordinary Time and recommence after Christmastide, while Feast days and privileged seasons (e.g. Advent and Christmas) will feature repertoire of other composers.

For our purposes, Bach's organ works fall into three major categories: Fantasie/Prelude/Toccata and Fugue; Trio Sonata; and Concerto. Some miscellaneous pieces, such as the *Pastoralla in F Major*, BWV 590, will also be interspersed. I am omitting the fourth major genre: the Choral Prelude. These are based mostly on Lutheran hymn-tunes which are foreign to the Catholic Mass and unknown to most modern listeners, Lutheran or otherwise.

Johann Sebastian Bach, the German composer who defined the Baroque period, wrote in every major musical genre of his time except for opera, and is known for the *Brandenburg Concertos*, *Goldberg Variations*, *Mass in B minor*, *St. Matthew Passion*, *The Well-Tempered Clavier*, and over 200 cantatas. Bach spent his mature career in the towns of Weimar (1708-1717, as director of music at the ducal court), Köthen (1717-1723, as director of music to Leopold, Prince of Anhalt-Köthen), and Leipzig (1723-1750, as director of music (*Thomaskantor*) of St. Thomas Church). Beyond his ability as a composer, conductor, consultant, choir-trainer, and teacher, he is regarded as one of the finest and most versatile organists of any age. The variety of his compositions bespeaks not just his illimitable creative genius but his own technical ability to translate the written work into performance.

(October 18)	Prelude and Fugue in C Major, BWV 545
(October 25)	Toccata and Fugue in F Major, BWV 540
(November 8)	Prelude and Fugue in C minor, BWV 546
(November 15)	Toccata and Fugue in D minor, BWV 538, 'Dorian'

(The 'BWV' after the title indicates the number assigned to the individual work in the *Bach-Werke-Verzeichnis* catalog by which all of Bach's compositions are scholastically organized.)

Generally, at the 9:30 AM and 12 NOON Masses, the Fantasie/Prelude/Toccata is played before Mass and the Fugue afterwards. While at the 6 PM Masses, the Fantasie/Prelude/Toccata is played at Communion, since Vespers at 5:45 PM precludes a prelude at these Masses. With other opportunities to hear live music as scant as they currently are in the City, please consider coming a few minutes early and staying a few extra minutes after Mass to hear some of the greatest organ music ever written.

The organ at St. Vincent Ferrer was installed in two phases by the Schantz Organ Company of Orrville, Ohio: the chancel organ in 1998 and the gallery organ in 2002. The instrument has over 5,000 individual pipes (from 6 inches to 32 feet in length), many miles of wiring, and countless mechanical parts, and it is controlled by a 4-keyabord console in the choir stalls. Although the Schantz is markedly different from the organs that Bach would have known in terms of scale, technological assists, and electrical power, many individual sounds on our instrument are similar to ones from his era. More information about the organ may be found here: *nycago.org/Organs/NYC/html/StVincentFerrer.html* As part of the Parish's ongoing Capital Campaign, we hope to do some work on the organ which, though hard to believe, is approaching its twentieth anniversary. More about that later.

# The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

• To honor this church is to honor them all and to give thanks for the generosity, artistic expression, and devotion of the People of God so which church buildings give public expression.

## November 10

# St. Leo the Great, Pope (Memorial)

• St. Leo sat in the Chair of Peter from 440 - 461 AD. His gifts of administration and pastoral care

manifested themselves in his dealing with the Huns who threatened Rome in the 450s.

• Ask his intercession that the Church may learn to make her way in a less Christian world.

## November 11

# St. Martin of Tours, Bishop (Memorial)

• St. Martin (d. 397) was converted to Christ while a Roman soldier. Pray that military service may be in our time an occasion of spiritual growth.

### Veterans Day

• Pray that those who have served in our Armed Services may have from others fitting gratitude and practical support, and within themselves fulfillment from their service and healing from its traumas.

# November 12

# St. Josaphat, Bishop and Martyr (Memorial)

• St. Josaphat (1584 - 1625) gave his life for the unity of the Eastern and Western Churches. Pray for that intention on his feast.

• Pray as well for Church in Ukraine, and the whole people of Ukraine, at this challenging time.

# November 13

# St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, Virgin (Memorial)

• Mother Cabrini (1850 - 1917) was an immigrant to this country who spent herself in service to other immigrants. We can honor her feast by praying for immigrants in our time and for those who tend to their needs.
