Deepening your Advent with the Misa de Gallo

A ROOSTER'S CROW

Farms were a plenty in my hometown, and one of my sets of grandparents even lived on one. Seeing the combines harvest corn, watching the center-pivot irrigation systems water vast fields, or jumping from barn lofts onto bails of hay were common experiences. Learning to navigate the various smells from orchards to wild flowers to various kinds of fertilizer could bring one back down to earth in the briefest of moments. Then there were the noises of nature: the mooing of cows, the humming and spitting of alpacas, the singing of grasshoppers and cicadas, and the crowing of roosters.

While certain smells can immediately grab your attention, a rooster's crow can sound far and wide, averaging 90 decibels, and for this reason it's one of the most striking things around. While there are many reasons a rooster will crow, the most stereotypical one is true: at sunrise, roosters crow. This is partly because of their biological clock, but it's also because of the fact that when they see light they crow (they might even crow when seeing headlights at night). After a long night of darkness, they see the light and let the world know all about it.

A ROOSTER'S MASS

There's something profound in this pattern of nature that should lead us above nature to the Lord Himself. The rooster's cry signifies the coming of the light, and that the darkness has not conquered the light (cf. John 1:5). It is almost as if it is a call filled with the hope that rests in the new day ahead. Isn't this what we see during Advent? We gather for the weeks leading up to Christmas in the midst of a world around us where the sun rises late and sets early. Here, nature itself is largely wrapped in darkness. Yet, when Christ comes at Christmas, His light scatters the darkness of despair and breaks the world of sin as He not only shines from Bethlehem but illuminates our hearts. He is the true light who has come into the world to lead us to the eternal light of heaven.

It is with this in mind that the *Misa de Gallo* tradition began. Like a rooster's biological clock awaits the light of the sun, so too do we gather in the early hours of the morning to enter with the Lord into His coming forth among us. Like a rooster calling forth the day when the light breaks forth over the horizon, so too do we pray to the Lord to break through the horizon of sin and fear.

Even more, these early morning Masses from December 17-24 march along with the liturgies of the day when we shift from the first part of Advent to the second. On the weekdays of the first part of Advent, we see the prophecies of the Old Testament (First Reading) fulfilled in Christ (Gospel). Through this time, the Church leads us to see how Christ is the fulfillment of all the prophecies of old. From December 17-24 though, the liturgical readings shift gears, and we begin to traverse the mysteries immediately leading up to Christ's birth. It is as if we move from the astronomical dawn (when the first rays of the sun begin to permeate the firmament of the sky) of the Old Testament through the nautical dawn (when the light of the sun makes it possible to distinguish between the sky from the land or water) of St. John the Baptist to the civil dawn (when colors begin to appear and the world around us becomes visible) of salvation. No longer do we just see hints of the Lord's promises in the Old Testament, but now we see more clearly that when the sun rises on Christmas day, we will see everything clearly by His light.

This is what we are offered each day from December 17-24. We have the chance to come in the midst of a darkened world to pray with the Son as He rises to scatter sin and lead us all to a life enlightened by Him. Come join us for this beautiful Advent devotion at 6am at St. Vincent's each day and so prepare for a most beautiful and lightsome Christmas.



MASSES IN CHRISTMAS WEEK December 26–30

The season of Christmas, known as Christmastide, runs from the Nativity of the Lord itself through the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 8 this year). Further, Nativity scenes and crèches may be displayed through the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas), on February 2, which marks the consecration of Jesus to the Lord and the purification of Mary forty days after giving birth.

Within Christmastide is the Christmas 'Octave', ending on the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or 'Octave Day', on January 1. The most important feasts of the liturgical year have such 'octaves' for the express purpose of continuing the celebration and highlighting the magnitude of the feast. The 6 PM Mass at St. Vincent Ferrer will be a Sung Mass every day within the Octave. The days immediately following Christmas Day celebrate:

December 26 – St. Stephen, protomartyr December 27 – St. John, Apostle and evangelist ('the Divine') December 28 – Holy Innocents
