DECEMBER 25-26 Parish Office Closed

The Parish Offices will be closed December 25 and 26 as well as January 1 and 2.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 25, 5 PM Solemn Vespers of Christmas

Solemn Vespers of the Nativity of the Lord will be celebrated at 5 PM on Christmas Day. The Schola will sing Magnificat Primi Toni (1576) by Orlando di Lasso. Please consider joining and making this a part of your Christmas observance.

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 26, 6 PM Feast of St. Stephen

For the Feast of St. Stephen, Protomartyr, there will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's for this Second Day of Christmas. Stephen was a deacon of the early church, and this Feast is mentioned in John Mason Neale's Christmas carol "Good King Wenceslas."

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 27, 6 PM Feast of St. John the Divine

For the Feast of St. John, Apostle and Evangelist, there will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's for this Third Day of Christmas. John and his brother James were Galilean fishermen, called the "sons of thunder," and were chosen to be among the Twelve Apostles. John and his community of followers are credited with writing the fourth Gospel. According to some traditions, the same John wrote the Book of Revelation.

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 28, 6 PM Feast of the Holy Innocents

For the Feast of the Holy Innocents, martyrs, there will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's for this Fourth Day of Christmas. This feast commemorates the massacre of the young boys of Bethlehem by King Herod in his attempt to kill the infant Jesus, as told in St. Matthew's Gospel (2:16-18).

CHRISTMASTIDE

December 26-30

The season of Christmas, known as Christmastide, runs from the Nativity of the Lord itself through the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 8 this year). Further, Nativity scenes and crèches may be displayed through the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas), on February 2, which marks the consecration of Jesus to the Lord and the purification of Mary forty days after giving birth. Within Christmastide is the Christmas 'Octave', ending on the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or 'Octave Day', on January 1. The most important feasts of the liturgical year have such 'octaves' for the express purpose of continuing the celebration and highlighting the magnitude of the feast. The 6 PM Mass at St. Vincent Ferrer will be a Sung Mass every weekday within the Octave.

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 31 Feast of the Holy Family

The Sunday within the Octave of Christmas is Feast of the Holy Family. Observance of this feast began locally in Canada and France in the 17th century. In 1893, Pope Leo XIII, who had a personal devotion to the Holy Family, approved it as a feast for Canada, and Pope Benedict XV had it added to General Roman Calendar in 1921 on the Sunday within the Octave of the Epiphany. After the 1969 revision of the Calendar, it was moved to the Sunday within the Octave of Christmas, or, in years when there is no mid-Octave Sunday, on December 30.



MONDAY, JANUARY 1 Octave Day – Mary, Mother of God

New Year's Day, is the Octave Day of the Nativity: the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. The Parish will offer a regular weekday schedule of Masses and Confessions. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing. The Parish Offices will be closed on Monday, January 1.

The Octave Day of the Nativity celebrates the Circumcision of our Lord. In the Old Law, by the rite of Circumcision, every male Jew became a member and shared in the privileges and blessings of the chosen people of God. Our Lord, the sinless Son of God by nature who therefore did not need adoption into the membership of God's children, nevertheless submitted to the ancient Law. The Feast of the Holy Name follows on the heals of Octave Day to celebrate Jesus' name given at the Circumcision.
