MUSIC NOTES

Next week, for the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Schola sings two motets by English Renaissance composer William Byrd. Following the death of Robert Parsons in 1572, Byrd became a Gentleman (professional singer) of the Chapel Royal. A practicing Roman Catholic whose name appeared on recusancy lists from 1584, he composed choral music for both the Latin Rite and the English services of Queen Elizabeth's nascent Anglican Church. Much of Byrd's music was published during his lifetime, as he and friend and teacher Thomas Tallis held a royally-bestowed monopoly on the printing of music in England.

SACRED STUDY

How are things with you and Jesus lately? In case things have grown stale or distant, let's find a way to greater meaning and intimacy, or if need be, to respark the relationship all together. Certainly, there are various ways to do this, especially the Sacraments. In this letter, we'll discuss a way that is powerful, yet easily overlooked: sacred study.

Sacred study is one of the great treasures of Catholic life. In study, we aim to know more about God simply for its own sake, like two old friends who want to know more about each other for no other purpose than to love each other and to have something to ponder together as they share a pot of Irish Breakfast tea. The more we know God, the more we can love Him, the more we can welcome His love into our hearts. And if our devotion or zeal has waned or wilted, most likely, we've neglected the privilege of sacred study.

Dominicans take sacred study very seriously, and we hope to share this with our parishioners and any guests that stumble upon us. In a variety of ways, at our parish, we share in sacred study together: the Mass itself, preaching at various liturgies, parish studies (like our current one on the Book of Genesis), RCIA, etc. There's something powerful about studying together as a community, but study is also a personal way of growing closer to Jesus by knowledge and love. To help develop such personal ways, this letter will recommend a few excellent ways to enter into sacred study:

Aquinas 101 – We just celebrated the feast of St. Thomas Aquinas, and while the Church may celebrate his works, if you ever open up the *Summa* and begin reading, you may not feel like celebrating, but rather giving up, given its length and complexity. Your groans have been heard. The Thomistic Institute in Washington, DC has developed a program aimed at the intelligent Catholic who wants to start reading St. Thomas's works: Aquinas 101. It's a program with videos, lectures, and reading, spanning the central themes of St. Thomas's *Summa*. And it's all free! Simply go to *aquinas101.thomisticinstitute.org* or google "aquinas101".

Dominicana Journal – The student brothers, at the Dominican House of Studies in Washington, DC, publish biannually a journal that covers various topics and genres, including book reviews, new translations of old greats, interviews, and original fiction and verse. A recent issue has an interview with Country, Bluegrass, and Gospel Hall of Fame Musician Ricky Skaggs, exploring the relationship of music and Christian life. And again, it's free! Go to *dominicanajournal.org/login*, put in the "svsc" as the user ID, and "ManhattanOP" for the password.

FORMED – Among many millenials, FORMED is known as "Catholic Netflix." You'll find full length movies on various saints and mini-series on the Sacraments and other topics. There's also children's programing and audio books. All of it is aimed to support a Catholic lifestyle. And once again, it's free! Go to *formed.org* or download the FORMED app on your device, and then register by using the parish code for St. Vincent Ferrer and St. Catherine of Siena: 2ZFMH7.

Sister Mary Baruch – If you'd rather just cozy up to a nice Catholic novel, you should try a new series from Fr. Jacob Restrick, a Dominican friar stationed in DC. This series tracks the life of a Jewish girl, Becky Feinstein, growing up in New York City in the 1960s. When her Catholic friend becomes sick, Becky decides to light a candle for her at a Catholic church. She finds a particularly beautiful one at 66th and Lex, and after she enters its doors, her life never returns to normal. Currently, Fr. Jacob has published four volumes, with a fifth in the works, and possibly more in his imagination. To purchase these books, go to *tanbooks.com* or *amazon.com*. There will also be a limited supply available for purchase at the guard station at St. Vincent Ferrer. As you read, we recommend generous amounts of Earl Grey.

In all of this talk about sacred study, we ought to admit that it's not always easy work. Every student experiences the pain of learning new concepts and trying to place them in the greater context of reality. Sacred study is not for the faint of heart, then again, neither is the Christian life. Together, we invoke the help of St. Thomas Aquinas, and we repeat the principle desire of his life of study: "Nothing but You, my Lord, nothing but You."
