SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH

The Parish will celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph on Saturday, March 19, with a special Mass at noon with music by our Schola Cantorum. The Mass will be followed by a festive gathering in the cloister walk of the Church to share in the Roman tradition of blessed St. Joseph's Day bigné and coffee. Parishioners are also invited to bring any images or statues, or devotionals of St. Joseph from their homes, and to place them in the St. Joseph Chapel on the north side of the church prior to Mass so that they may be blessed alongside the traditional sweets.

St. Joseph is honored as The Patron of the Universal Church, and is the special Patron of our Eastern Dominican Province that bears his name. As his feast day is ranked a solemnity, the faithful are dispensed of their Lenten observances on this day. Please join us with your families for this special celebration.

ST. JOSEPH NOVENA

From Saturday, March 11 through Saturday, March 19, the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the Parish will offer a Novena of Prayer. Holy cards will be available at both Churches and the Novena Prayer will be recited at all Masses during this period.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION

Friday, March 25 is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Ave Regina* and *Ave Regina á 8* by Tomás Luis de Victoria.

Stations of the Cross will be held as usual following the 6 PM Solemn Mass, as well as after the 5:15 PM Mass at St. Catherine of Siena. Because it is a Solemnity, the abstention from meat is lifted on Friday, March 25.

RCIA AND THE LENTEN SCRUTINIES

During Lent, the Church prays for and prepares to welcome new members through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

A "Catechumen" (meaning one being instructed) is someone who is preparing for baptism. At the Easter Vigil, a Catechumen receives all three Sacraments of Christian Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

A "Candidate" is someone who has been baptized, but not as a Catholic. At the Easter Vigil, a Candidate makes a profession of faith, is confirmed, and/or receives the Eucharist.

After a period of catechesis (in our Parish, by Fr. Joseph Hagan, O.P.) the Catechumens participate in the Rite of Election on the First Sunday of Lent at St. Patrick's Cathedral, and the Candidates participate in the Rite of Continuing Conversion on the Second Sunday of Lent. In these Rites, the Church formally ratifies the Catechumens' readiness for the Sacraments of Initiation and the Candidates' readiness to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church. In turn, the Catechumens – thereafter known as the "Elect" – publicly acknowledge their desire to receive said Sacraments, and the Candidates their desire to be enter full communion.

At the 12 NOON Mass on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, the Elect undergo the First, Second, and Third Scrutinies. These Rites of examination and repentance are to deliver the Elect from the power of sin and temptation and to give them strength in Christ. For these Masses, a special set of orations are used by the Celebrant, specific intercessions are offered on behalf of the Elect, and the Year A lectionary is always read: the Gospels of the Samaritan woman (John 4:5-42); the healing of the man born blind (John 9:1-41); and the resurrection of Lazarus (John 11:1-45).

All young adults are invited to a Bible study on the Kingdom of God! We are going to discuss various key periods in the Bible and the people who helped in the building of the Kingdom. The final session will take place at St. Vincent Ferrer in the Parish Center on Monday, March 14 at 7 PM.

All young adults are welcome to join us for a Holy Hour at St. Vincent Ferrer Church this Sunday, March 13 at 7:30 PM. It will be a prayerful night with priests available to hear Confessions.

MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, for the Third Sunday of Lent, the Schola will sing music of William Byrd. His first known professional employment was as organist of Lincoln Cathedral, although little else is certain of his early musical training. Following the death of Robert Parsons in 1572, Byrd became a Gentleman (professional singer) of the Chapel Royal. A practicing Roman Catholic whose name appeared on recusancy lists from 1584, he composed choral music for both the Latin Rite and the English services of Queen Elizabeth's nascent Anglican Church. His three settings of the Mass Ordinary (for three, four, and five parts respectively) are considered some of the finest examples of sacred Renaissance polyphony.

The Dominican Charism – Why Community?

San Marco in fifteenth century Florence was truly a remarkable place. It is famously known for the beautiful works of art that Bl. Fra Angelico painted throughout the priory. It is also known, albeit a little less so, for being a house of reform, where the Dominicans consciously chose to live a life of greatly austerity, study, and contemplation. It is that spirit that led Fra Angelico to paint the images of the life of Christ in the cells of the brothers. There is something else fundamentally important to this enterprise but that is even less known, and that concerns Fra Angelico's own formation.

He joined the Dominicans at the priory in Fiesole with his brother Benedetto. This was at the time when St. Antoninus as well as Bl. John Dominici, Bl. Peter Capucci, and Bl. Lawrence of Ripafratta were also living there. They were formed together in a community that beautifully lived out the injunction from the Rule of St. Augustine that the Dominicans follow: "The chief motivation for your sharing life together is to live harmoniously in the house and to have one heart and one soul seeking God" (*Rule*, 2). More so than anything else, the men who entered the Dominicans in Fiesole were taught to be of one heart and mind as they sought God together.

For an order well known for its preaching, this might strike us as odd. Shouldn't preaching be the thing that draws us together? In a way, yes. Yet, every Dominican enters a community, and the salvation of his or her soul is the first and foremost guide for his or her life. The current *Constitutions* for the friars state it this way:

Sharing the Apostles' mission, we also follow their way of life, in the formed devised by St. Dominic. We do our best to live of one accord the common life, observing faithfully the celebration of the liturgy, especially the Eucharist and the Divine Office, diligent in study, and constant in regular observance. Not only do these things contribute to the glory of God and our sanctification, they also bear directly on the salvation of humankind, since together they prepare and impel us to preach; they give our preaching its character, and, in turn, are influenced by it. The life of the Order comprises a synthesis of these elements, inseparably connected, harmoniously balanced, and mutually enriching. It is an apostolic life in the full sense of the word, from which preaching and teaching ought to issue from an abundance of contemplation. (*Fundamental Constitutions*, IV)

In other words, the communal life holds a special place in the Dominican life because it is one of the primary means by which the Dominican is transformed. Through communal prayer, through study, and through various communal daily practices, the Dominican is formed bit by bit in the life of holiness. Over time, this shapes the Dominican into a faithful and fruitful preacher.

What does this look like for members of a Dominican parish? There are the obvious things of community within a parish—common participation in the liturgy as well as groups for different types of parishioners, hospitality, fellowship, and so forth. Yet, there should be something that binds the members of those groups and more importantly that binds the parish together as a whole. That is the common goal of heaven. More than anything practical or even the best group for young moms in the city, there is a need for the community "to live harmoniously in the [parish] and to have one heart and soul seeking God." That's it. That's the deepest principal of unity in the life of a parish, especially a Dominican one. From that flows everything else—the common liturgy, the affinity groups, the communal study, and everything else under the sun.

Hopefully the seeds of this way of life are already present in our parish. Through God's graces, especially during this Lenten season, may this become even more of a reality.

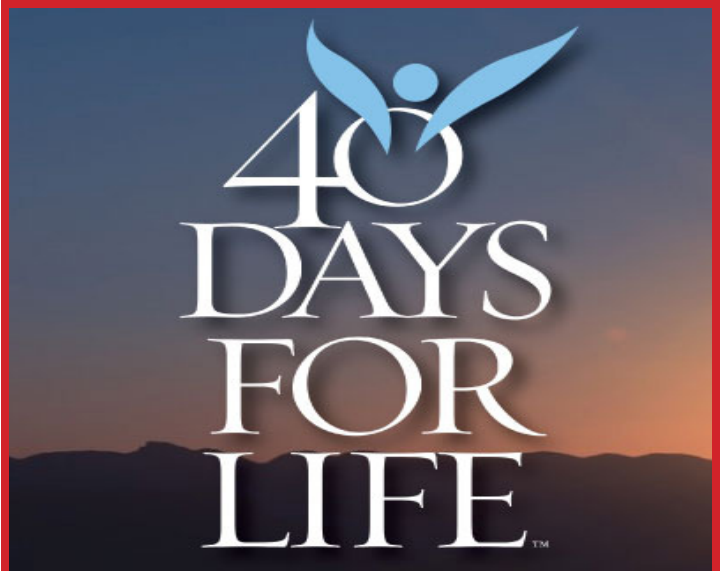

Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

Required Days of Abstinence:

For all aged 14 and older, obligatory abstention from flesh meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays of Lent.

Required Days of Fast:

For all aged 18 to 59, inclusive, one full meal permitted and two other meals, which, when combined, are less than a full meal, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Required Days of Penance:

Applies to all the Faithful during the entirety of Lent and also Fridays outside of Lent. However, when a solemnity falls on a Friday, even during Lent, the abstinence is optional.

Self Denial:

Is encouraged on a voluntary basis. Acts may include daily Mass, spiritual study, Lenten Devotions, the Rosary, Stations of the Cross and deeds of mercy and kindness.

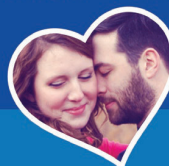
