PALM SUNDAY

Holy Week begins next **Sunday**, **April 2**, with Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. On this day the Church recalls the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. This is liturgically observed with a procession, blessing of palms, and proclamation of the Gospel passage recounting Christ's entrance. The Gospel of the Mass itself is the Passion according to Matthew (or Luke or Mark in other years). The liturgical color is now red throughout, although purple was traditionally worn for the Mass itself.

In our Parish, the 12 NOON Solemn Mass of Palm Sunday is preceded by the Solemn Blessing of Palms and the chanting of the brief Office of Sext at 11:30 AM at St. Catherine of Siena. After the Office, the congregation, with palms in hand, and accompanied by a brass quartet, processes through the streets over to St. Vincent Ferrer for the Mass. Pews will be reserved at St. Vincent Ferrer for those participating in the Procession.

RECONCILIATION MONDAY

Monday of Holy Week, **April 3**, is Reconciliation Monday throughout the Archdiocese, an opportunity for all to make their confession before Easter. Confessions will be heard at St. Catherine of Siena from 2–5:05 PM and 6–9 PM and at St. Vincent Ferrer from 2–4 PM and 5:15–9 PM.

Parish Study "Lord, Give Me This Water" What it Means to be a Baptized Christian

Our final Lenten Parish Study is **Tuesday, March 28** at 6:45 PM in St. Vincent Ferrer Lower Church. The Sunday Readings in Lent this year are meant to teach us about the meaning of Baptism. We take the opportunity to reflect on why the Church of old has seen three passages from John's Gospel — the Samaritan woman, the healing of the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus — to be about Christian initiation. These, as well as the other Lenten Gospels, reveal to us the implications of baptism in our private, ecclesial, and social lives.

VEILING STATUES IN PASSIONTIDE

In past years, we have been able to maintain the ancient custom of veiling the statues at St. Catherine's. We had not been able to do it at St. Vincent's, though, because of the lack of veils. Previous pastors looked into this, but nothing ever materialized. Sometime last year, though, I was able to begin a few conversations with various parishioners about this topic. Through the attentiveness of a particular parishioner, we were able to find a suitable type of fabric for the veils, and through the incredible generosity of another parishioner, we were able to have the veils made. I am especially grateful for this love for the Lord.

What is the point of veiling the statues, and why did we go to all this trouble though? The history of veiling statues at the end of Lent is a little veiled in mystery, but it seems that it might have derived from the ninth century German practice of hanging a "Hungertuch" (hunger cloth) in front of the altar during Passiontide (the last two weeks of Lent). This practice seems to have been a replacement for the practice of "banishing" sinners from churches, which had been practiced in the early Church. When this Hungertuch was installed in Passiontide it was meant to foster an increased hunger for the Eucharist.

This idea seems to have developed later into the veiling of sacred images and statues in churches so that all those who come to the church would grow in their desire for what is sacred. In other words, it is meant to help us hunger and thirst for the Lord so that when we come to the Easter mysteries, we can truly enter into them with hearts longing for the grace of God.



Moreover, in the older set of readings for Mass, what we now call the 5th Sunday of Lent was previously referred to as Passion Sunday. The Gospel for the day included the passage about when Jesus invoked the Divine Name for Himself in John and how some of the Jews went to stone Him. At that, "Jesus hid Himself, and went out of the temple" (John 8:59). If Jesus hid Himself, then we can respond by hiding the statues and images so that we can enter into that longing for redemption along with Him.

As we enter into Passiontide, may the Lord grant us many graces so that our hearts increasingly can long for Him so that when we come to the fulfillment of the Paschal Mystery in heaven, we finally may be satisifed as we gaze upon Him with eyes and hearts completely unveiled before Him.
