LENTEN ALMSGIVING BABY DRIVE: MARCH 18-31

Our annual baby drive to support the Sisters of Life and the women they serve is underway. This is a great way to do some almsgiving this Lent. Each church will have a playpen with tags that list what is needed. Please come in, take a tag, and then return the item you purchased to the playpen in either church. The Baby Drive will begin on March 18 and will continue until March 31.

PASSIONTIDE

The final part of the season of Lent is Passiontide, from the Fifth Sunday of Lent, known as "Passion Sunday" until the Triduum. The liturgy during this time focuses on and commemorates the sorrowful events of the last week of Jesus' mortal life.

During this fortnight of "deep Lent," violet veils traditionally cover crosses (until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday) and cover images and statues until the *Gloria* of the Easter Vigil. The veiling was associated with the Gospel (John 8:46-59) formerly read on Lent V, in which Jesus "hid himself" from the people (*Jesus autem abscondebat se*). Statues and images of the saints are likewise covered because, as theologian Nikolaus Nilles explained, "It would seem improper for the servants to appear when the Master himself is hidden." Since the revision of the Roman Calendar in 1969, the name Passiontide is no longer formally used, although the Preface called "Passion of the Lord I (The Power of the Cross)" is used in the fifth week of Lent.

MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, for the Fifth Sunday of Lent (Passion Sunday), the Schola will sing music of music of the Italian Renaissance. Claudio Merulo was born in Correggio, Italy. It is likely that he studied with Gioseffo Zarlino or Adrian Willaert at St. Mark's in Venice. He became organist of Brescia Cathedral (the Duomo Vecchio) in 1556, and was appointed second organist of St. Mark's the following year, winning out over many other notables, including Andrea Gabrieli. When the titular Annibale Padovano left in 1566, Merulo was promoted and Gabrieli become the assistant. Merulo would remain in Venice until 1584, during which time he became recognized as the finest organist in Italy and established a publishing house. By 1586, Merulo was serving as organist to the Duke of Parma, Alexander Farnese, and the next year was also appointed organist of Parma Cathedral, obtaining an additional post at the Church of Santa Maria della Steccata in 1591. He died in 1604, received a state funeral, and is buried in Parma Cathedral next to his friend Cipriano de Rore

The Dominican Charism – Communally Bound Together

St. Dominic greatly desired to evangelize the Cuman Tartars of Eastern Europe. There was a deep longing in his heart for this mission, and his hope was that after he turned over the governance of the Order to other brothers he would be able to continue a life of preaching and evangelizing. Unfortunately, he died before this became a possibility.

Yet, his desire was not entirely unmet. St. Hyacinth and his brother Bl. Ceslaus, two young Poles, met St. Dominic in Rome, offered themselves to him and the Order, and then were sent to preach in Eastern Europe. Around the same time, a Slavic man named Sadoc met Dominic in Bologna and did the same. Only a few weeks before Dominic's death, Sadoc and three others were sent to Hungary to begin preaching to the Cuman Tartars. Eventually Sadoc went to Sandomir, Poland and became the prior of the new community there. The community grew to 49 friars and fervently preached the Gospel.

At the time in 1260, Sandomir was being buffeted by the attacks of the Cuman Tartars, but the Poles were steadfastly resisting the attacks. That is until one night, aided by some Russians, the Tartars broke into the city and began their path of destruction. They eventually made their way into the Dominican church during the singing of the *Salve Regina* at the end of Compline. There, they immediately martyred Bl. Sadoc and 47 of the other 49 friars. Seized with fear, the one remaining the friar had hidden himself. Yet on seeing the courage of his brothers, he reapproached the Tartars and was likewise martyred.

What was it that led that lone friar to come back? Was it just the fear of being a coward, or was there was something deeper going on? It was God's grace, especially a grace that was connected to the vows. The Dominican *Book of Constitutions* states, "The brothers, of one mind through obedience, and bonded by a higher love, thanks to chastity, more closely dependent on each other, thanks to poverty, ought first of all to build in their own convent the Church of God, which by their efforts they must then spread throughout the world" (*LCO*, 3§2). Chastity, poverty, and obedience all bind the Dominicans together into a community. More so than just the fact that the vows guide them to a common mission to preach for the salvation of souls, the vows also bind their hearts both to God and to one another. In fact, it is through these vows that the Dominican draws deeper into living a life of holiness. Thus, when we look at Bl. Sadoc and his companion martyrs in Sandomir, it was not only their zeal for the Lord that led to their martyrdom but also their union with one another, a union that was deepened by the vows they all made.

What a beautiful witness that is to a Dominican parish. Imagine if we all were of one mind in obedience to the Gospel, of one heart through an abiding charity, and more closely dependent upon the support and prayers of one another. That would lead us to a much deeper place than simply coming together to worship in our church at the same time. It would lead our community to truly flourish!

As we continue our observance of Lent and draw closer to the mysteries of Holy Week, may the Lord join our minds and hearts together with His Truth and His Love so that we truly may be a community bound together by grace.

Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

Required Days of Abstinence:

For all aged 14 and older, obligatory abstention from flesh meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays of Lent.

Required Days of Fast:

For all aged 18 to 59, inclusive, one full meal permitted and two other meals, which, when combined, are less than a full meal, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Required Days of Penance:

Applies to all the Faithful during the entirety of Lent and also Fridays outside of Lent. However, when a solemnity falls on a Friday, even during Lent, the abstinence is optional.

Self Denial:

Is encouraged on a voluntary basis. Acts may include daily Mass, spiritual study, Lenten Devotions, the Rosary, Stations of the Cross and deeds of mercy and kindness.

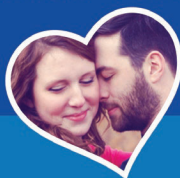
