

Charity, Peace, and Preaching

HUNGRY FOR SOULS

When Christ first appeared to the apostles in the Upper Room, He said three things: "Peace be with you," "Go and preach," and "Do you have something to eat?" While the third one of these might seem amusing at first, it's not about Him being physically hungry. Rather, it's about Him proving that He is not a ghost, and that He is hungry for souls, and this contextualizes the other two sayings.

HUNGER FOR PEACE

Jesus hungers for a deep peace to abide in our hearts. Again and again on Easter Sunday, Jesus says, "Peace be with you ... peace be with you." He greatly desires that we live with His peace. The peace that He offers, though, isn't just about freedom from challenges. Rather, it's about living in a union of hearts with Him where what He wills is also what we will (cf. ST II-II, q. 29, aa. 1 and 2). In other words, the peace of Christ is about reordering the desires of our hearts to be in accord with His and then being able to rest in that place, regardless of what is happening all around us.

HUNGER FOR PREACHING

When we're in this place of peace, it then leads us to be able to faithfully carry out His other instruction to go forth and preach the Gospel to all nations. You see, when we come to deeply love something, we naturally want to share it with others. For instance, the only way that you might be able to enjoy one of my favorite flavors of ice cream—manchego ice cream with a mango compote swirled in it—is if I tell you how good it is and, even better, find a way for you to try it. Otherwise, you might be skeptics all your life.

Even more profound than this, though, is that once we've experienced the peace with which the Lord desires to flood our hearts, it's almost as if we'll be impelled to share what we've found. This is what we see in the woman at the well, St. Mary Magdalene on Easter morning, and the apostles after Pentecost. Once Christ comes to dwell within us and fills us with His peace, how could we not want others to experience that peace as well? Naturally, we will be moved to preach the resurrection, repentance, and the forgiveness of sins like He invites us to do in today's Gospel.

HUNGRY FOR FISH

So it's important to ask ourselves: how hungry am I? How much do I desire fish like the Lord? Not actual fish, as good as a nicely cooked piece of branzino or tuna is. Rather, the fish that come from fishing for souls. How much do I desire to share the best thing I have received in life, namely the Lord Jesus and His offer of salvation, with others? This can seem daunting at first, but it's important to remember that this drive to fish, this desire to preach, is strengthened when it is built on the Lord's peace dwelling deep within us. So it can be helpful to first pray for a deepening of Christ's peace, and then, from there, that we might be faithful to His invitation to preach the Gospel for the salvation of souls.

With God, all things are possible (Matthew 19:26).
