On **Friday, April 21,** at 7 PM the Friends of St. Margaret and the Dominican Healthcare Ministry invite all to a Mass in honor of St. Margaret of Castello at St. Catherine's. St. Margaret was a Third Order Dominican who endured many physical disabilities with great holiness. The Friends of St. Margaret is a group of NYC Catholics with disabilities who have placed themselves under her patronage.

Tuesday, April 25 is the Feast of St. Mark, Evangelist. There will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer.

PARISH NOVENA OF PATRONAGE

Friday, April 28 is the Vigil of the Solemnity of St. Catherine of Siena. There will be a Solemn Mass at 5:15 PM at St. Catherine of Siena for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Brevis in D*, Op. 63 by Benjamin Britten; *Quid retribuam Domino* by Guy de Lioncourt; *Ave verum corpus* by George Nevin.

Friday, May 5 is the Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer. There will be a Solemn Mass with a *Te Deum* at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola will sing *Missa Gaudeamus* and *O sacrum convivium á 6* by Tomás Luis de Victoria; and *In conspectu angelorum* by Francisco Guerrero.

Saturday, May 6 is the Anniversary of Dedication of the Church of St. Vincent Ferrer (observed). There will be a Solemn Dominican Rite Mass at 1 PM; the usual 9:30 AM Mass will not be offered.

In the intervening days, the Parish will celebrate a Patronal Novena of Prayer. Friars of the Dominican Order have been ministering to this neighborhood since the Parish's founding in 1867. The current Parish was established after an archdiocesan merger process in 2015.

MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, for the Third Sunday of Easter, the Schola will sing joyful music of the Italian Renaissance. Nothing is known of the early life of Andrea Rota, a member of the last great generation of Italian Renaissance composers that includes Giovanni Gabrieli. In 1583, he was appointed *maestro di cappella* of St. Petronio, an enormous Basilica in his native Bologna. The Basilica's choir was exceptionally large, comprising 34 choristers and 12 priests. Rota published books of madrigals, motets, and Masses throughout his life; many of his madrigals are associated with the Ferrarese court of Alfonso d'Este..


