### LOW SUNDAY/DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Today, Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be offered at St. Vincent Ferrer, with Exposition at 2 PM, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3 PM, and Benediction at 4 PM. Confessions will also be heard from 2–4 PM

Adoration at St. Catherine of Siena from 3–5 PM will also be offered as usual.

The Parish is happy to re-introduce the monthly coffee hour, an opportunity to meet with your fellow parishioners. There will be light refreshments following the 12 NOON Mass at St. Vincent Ferrer.

The Second Sunday is known as *Dominica in albis* (Sunday in White), so called because it was traditionally on this day that the neophytes who had been baptized on Easter Eve would lay aside their white baptismal garments for the first time. The other title is “Low Sunday.” The origin of this nickname is uncertain, but it is possibly intended to indicate the contrast between it and the great Easter festival immediately preceding, and also, perhaps, to signify that, being the Octave Day of Easter, it was considered part of that feast, though in a lower degree. It could also be a corruption of the first word of today’s now-suppressed sequence *Laudes Salvatori voce*.

Yet another title, “Quasimodo Sunday,” indicates a liturgical link to the bell-ringing protagonist of Victor Hugo’s 1831 French novel *Notre-Dame de Paris* (commonly known in its English version as *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*). The Introit for today’s Mass is *Quasi modo geniti infantes*. When Claude Frollo, the archdeacon of Notre Dame, found the child abandoned on Cathedral porch on the Sunday after Easter, 1467, he named him after the day of his adoption and baptism. Thus it is that one of literature’s most recognized figures has a name taken from a Gregorian chant still sung in churches over five hundred years later.

## PARISH NOVENA OF PATRONAGE

This Friday, April 29 is the Solemnity of St. Catherine of Siena. There will be a Solemn Mass at 5:15 PM at St. Catherine of Siena for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Domine Dominus noster* by Leonhard Lechner and *Confitebor tibi, Domine* by Philippe de Monte.

The Dominican Parish of St. Vincent Ferrer established a mission on 68th Street east of First Avenue in 1895 which was placed under the patronage of St. Catherine of Siena. The Priory of St. Catherine of Siena was made a formal, independent Dominican priory in 1916. The present Church was designed by Wilfrid Anthony, Bertram Goodhue's assistant on the St. Vincent Ferrer project, and was completed in 1931.

Thursday, May 5 is the Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer and the anniversary of the Church's dedication. There will be a Solemn Mass with a *Te Deum* at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola will sing *Missa Bell' Amfitrit' altera; Deus meus in simplicitate cordis mei;* and *Ecce nunc benedicite Dominum* by Orlando di Lasso.

In the intervening days, the Parish will celebrate a Patronal Novena of Prayer, with special preaching and a prayer recited at all Masses.

Eventually he moved to Madrid where he served until his death as the *maestro de capilla* of the Flemish Chapel at the court of Philip II.

# THE DOMINICAN SHRINE OF ST. JUDE

## PATRONAGE NOVENA

APRIL 28 – MAY 6

The week after the Easter Octave, you are invited to join us in our annual novena of prayer to St. Catherine of Siena and St. Vincent Ferrer. This novena will begin with our celebration of First Evening Prayer on April 28th (the vigil of St. Catherine, 1347-1380) and conclude with Second Evening Prayer on May 6th (the day following the Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer, 1357-1419). Allow me to explain.

As you may be aware, our parish has two churches. The name of the our parish is “St. Vincent Ferrer and St. Catherine of Siena.” When a parish celebrates the titular name of the church, the rank of the celebration is raised to a solemnity. It just so happens that these two great Dominican saints are celebrated in proximity of one another—St. Catherine on April 29th and St. Vincent Ferrer on May 5th for the Dominican Order.

You may have noted in your Catholic calendar that St. Vincent Ferrer is listed for April 5th. However, because St. Vincent Ferrer is such an important saint to the Dominicans, his feast day was moved within the Order of Preachers from April 5th, the day of his death in Vannes, France, to May 5th, the anniversary of the solemn translation of his relics to the Cathedral in Vannes, after their rediscovery in 1757. The feast was moved by a month because April 5th often falls during Holy Week or the Easter Octave, preventing its celebration.

Here in New York, the celebration of the dedication of our Church of St. Vincent Ferrer is May 5th. This liturgical celebration supersedes the titular celebration of the Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer. Thus, we celebrate the Feast of St. Vincent Ferrer on May 6th. As a result, we are able to celebrate this time of prayer as a novena of prayer to our two patron saints.

The two prominent Dominicans lived during the turbulent period of the 1300s and 1400s when the Western Schism caused havoc for the Christian world. Pope Gregory XI, a Frenchman, remained in Avignon, refusing to live in Rome. St. Catherine went to Avignon for four months and confronted him, eventually convincing Gregory to return to Rome. Upon his death, Urban VI would be elected pope and remained in Rome.

St. Vincent Ferrer was convinced that Clement VII and his successor Benedict XIII were the true popes. This schism in the Church distressed St. Vincent Ferrer, who wanted to respond to the crisis and reunite the Church. With his health failing, he mounted the pulpit during a large celebration with Pope Benedict presiding and preached an unforgettable sermon. Benedict realizing that his supporters would desert him, fled for his life. Later, the Council of Constance met to end the Great Western Schism and resolve the problem by electing Pope Martin V in 1417.

Both of our patrons labored to the point of exhaustion, devoting their lives and energies to preaching the healing power of the Good News. The Risen Lord had energized and sustained them to be true and faithful preachers of the word. Their lives would culminate knowing that they had given their all for the salvation of souls.

Both St. Vincent Ferrer and St. Catherine provide us with a true example of what it means to be preachers of Jesus Christ. They shared what they had received: Veritas. Praised be the Lord Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.

Starting on April 28th, the Vigil of the Solemnity of St. Catherine of Siena, and concluding on May 6th, the Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer, Mass will be offered each day for your intentions. Our Patronal Prayer will be offered at all the Masses in both churches. Our general intention will be for the holy preaching, pleading for the spread of the gospel, especially that of our Dominican Friars. We also ask that you please unite with us in praying for peace in Ukraine.

I invite you to write your intentions in our books at each of the shrines. In St. Catherine of Siena Church, an icon of the our Patron Saints will be located at the Shrine of St. Dominic and in St. Vincent Ferrer Church, at the shrine in his namesake church. Prayer cards will be available in both churches. Thank you for supporting our Dominican preaching in prayer.

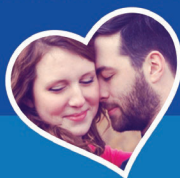
