PARISH COVID PROTOCOLS

We have resumed our regular Mass and confession schedule. GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

This Sunday, April 25, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. Every year, a passage from the Johannine Gospel is read in which the relationship of Jesus and his followers is compared to that of a shepherd and his sheep.

Year A, John 10:1-10 - I am the gate for the sheep.

Year B, John 10:11-18 – I am the good shepherd.

Year C, John 10:27-30 – My sheep listen to my voice

SOLEMNITY OF ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA

Thursday, April 29 is the Solemnity of St. Catherine of Siena, co-patron of the Parish. There will be a Solemn Mass at 5:15 PM at St. Catherine of Siena for which the Schola Cantorum will sing Philippe de Monte's *Missa Quomodo dilexi*; Nicolas Gombert's *Beati omnes á 5*; and Jacob Regnart's *Tollite jugum meum*.

The Dominican Parish of St. Vincent Ferrer established a mission on 68th Street east of First Avenue in 1895 which was placed under the patronage of St. Catherine of Siena. The Priory of St. Catherine of Siena was made a formal, independent Dominican house in 1916. The present church was designed by Wilfrid Anthony, Bertram Goodhue's assistant on the St. Vincent Ferrer project, and was completed in 1931.

SOLEMNITY OF ST. VINCENT FERRER

Wednesday, May 5 is the Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer and the anniversary of Church's dedication. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola will sing Orlando di Lasso's *Missa Bell' Amfitrit' altera*; *Deus meus in simplicitate cordis mei*; and *Ecce nunc benedicite Dominum*. A solemn Te Deum will be sung at the conclusion of the Mass.

The Church of St. Vincent Ferrer, dedicated on May 5, 1918, was built to the designs of renowned American architect Bertram Grosvenor Goodhue, who considered this his finest building. This National Historic Landmark is widely acclaimed as the foremost American example of French Gothic-style architecture and includes a complete set of Charles Connick stained glass windows, carvings by Lee Lawrie, and two instruments by the Schantz Organ Company.

St. Vincent Ferrer's feastday according to the liturgical calendar of the Dominican Order is May 5. In the general Roman Calendar, St. Vincent's feastday is April 5, the day on which he died in 1419.

MUSIC NOTES

Next week, for the Fifth Sunday of Easter, the Schola will sing music of Spanish Renaissance composer Tomás Luis de Victoria, who appears frequently in our music list.

Missa Surge propera is an example of what is called a 'Parody Mass' – one in which the musical ideas are taken from another, pre-existing composition. In this case, its musical genesis is in a motet by Victoria which sets the Song of Songs passage, "Arise, make haste, my love, my dove, my fair one, and come away." The Song of Songs is read on the Passover Sabbath and is therefore likewise associated with Easter and Spring.

The *Regina Caeli* is the Marian Antiphon for Eastertide. Its distinctive alleluias which conclude every verse reflects its Easter flavor.

WHY PRAY FOR PREACHERS

I write to ask you to join in eight days of prayer for a new Pentecost.

If you are reading this letter, faith probably makes a significant difference in your life. On the Cross you recognize your Savior, and in the Eucharist you experience his support and companionship. Put simply, you have the Easter Faith.

From this gift we derive comfort and enlightenment, challenge and nourishment: faith gives confidence in believing. But why is this gift so hard to share in our times? God is allowing you and me to live in a society that finds it difficult to believe. That which gives coherence and direction to our lives, we find so difficult to get across to our contemporaries. So I ask: how do we react to living with secular people who do not "get it"? We could become defensive and circle the wagons against our age, or we could become angry and belligerent toward it. We could resign ourselves to being old fashioned, or we could decide that every age does its own thing and worry no longer.

But from the very frustration of not being able to share belief, we might also discover a whole new avenue of growth for ourselves and find the depth of believing that shines forth in the Saints. When the Saints recognize the doubt, indifference, or error of their neighbors, they love all the more, and their prayer deepens with longing for the belief of their companions. Standouts in this category are the two patrons of our Parish here in New York.

St. Vincent Ferrer (1357-1419) and St. Catherine of Siena (1347-1380), both Dominican preachers who lived in a plague-ravaged Europe and a sharply divided church. Both burned with desire that others would come to know the God who brought them so much joy and fulfillment. God responded to each with a singular gift of communicating the Gospel to their contemporaries.

Effectively, both of our Patrons offered life and energy to a world exhausted by a sustained encounter with a pandemic. But as Preachers of Jesus Christ, they offered what they had first received.

I believe we have the task of begging God for the words, images and insights that will help the people of this time connect with the timeless content of what Christ reveals. You know all too well that our neighbors are depleted from our own long ordeal and they will be looking for encouragement that also enables, and refreshment that also restores. Our task will be to let them know that we have found these things in the Risen Lord and His Sacraments.

I invite you to join me in prayer for this intention during the eight days that connect the two feasts of our patrons. We can ask these two holy preachers to pray that we share their zeal for truth and their love of souls.

Mass will be offered each day for your intentions, starting on April 28, the Vigil of the Feast of St. Catherine of Siena and concluding on May 5, the Feast of St. Vincent Ferrer. Prayers for this intention will be said at all our Parish Masses and I will be in touch with a greeting on each day of the Octave. Please also know that the Friars in our community, and our parishioners, will be joining in eight days of pleading for the spread of the Gospel, so that more and more people may live serenely on the foundation of Christ's promise of life.
