MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, for the Sixth Sunday of Easter, the Schola will sing music of Hamburg-born Hieronymus Praetorius. He first studied organ with his father Jacob Praetorius the elder (1520-1586) and took further studies in Cologne. After spending three years as an organist in Erfurt, he returned to Hamburg in 1582 where he worked with his father as assistant organist at St. Jacobi, becoming principal organist upon his father's death. In 1596, Hieronymus traveled to Gröningen where he met Michael Praetorius (no relation) and Hans Leo Hassler. It is likely that from this encounter Hieronymus adopted the progressive Venetian polychoral style that he introduced into north Germany. Sunday's setting of the Mass is based on the eponymous double motet which will be sung at the Offertory and Communion.

The Dominican Charism – Preaching the Word

1248 holds a special place within the history of the Church. For in that year, Cologne's remarkable Cathedral, one which took over 600 years to complete and which houses the relics of the Magi, began to be constructed. In the same year, something that is less known but which is also quite important, St. Albert the Great took up teaching at the Dominican *studium* (house of formation), also in Cologne, and brought his brightest student, St. Thomas Aquinas, with him who likewise began to teach. Aquinas began to lecture on the works of the Old Testament and wrote his famous commentaries on Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Lamentations. It was only after a period of marking himself as a Biblical scholar that Aquinas went on to comment on Peter Lombard's *Sentences* and many of Aristotle's works as well as write his famous *Summa Theologiae*. It all began with the words of the Word. 1248 marked the construction of a grand edifice in stone and a grand edifice in words.

In our contemporary times, getting a doctorate in theology involves focusing on a particular discipline, such as Sacred Scripture, patristics, systematics, morality, sacraments, etc. This was not always the case though. In the medieval period, a professor of theology would have been versed in all of these areas. Take Aquinas's *Summa Theologiae* for instance. It covers systematic theology, moral theology, Christology, and sacramental theology. All the while, St. Thomas uses an abundance of texts from the Bible and the Church Fathers to not only defend his points but also to guide the whole of his work. There was a unified vision of theology, and it ultimately had one foundation—Sacred Scripture. You can see this in everything from the commentaries of St. Albert the Great, to the sermons of St. Vincent Ferrer, to the letters of St. Catherine of Siena. The words of the Word shaped the medieval mind and guided the Dominican charism.

This study of the Word led to the preaching of the Word. This was not just preaching about and writing on the Biblical texts, but also it led to the preaching of the Word Himself. The Dominican sense of preaching is built on coming to know the words of the Word and sharing the words of the Scriptures and the Word Himself. This is because the Scriptures emphasize the reality of the Incarnate Word, both in the prophecies about His life, death, and resurrection and the telling of how those mysteries unfolded in history. It is clear that these two aspects of one and the same Word are the foundation for Dominican preaching. In preaching the Scriptures, we preach Jesus Christ.

So often Dominican preaching starts with the Word. There might be a story or an analogy at the beginning of the homily, but Dominican preaching typically begins with the things of God and then dives into their application in the lives of men and women. The Word of God guides our life, gives it its shape, and reveals its goal. In all things, the Word leads us on the path to salvation. Thus, Dominicans, who immerse themselves in the Word, start with Jesus Christ so that He might guide us through this pilgrimage of life.

For those in a Dominican parish, this becomes an invitation to let the Word form the whole of our lives. Does the Word of God in the Scriptures and the person of Jesus shape our minds and our hearts? Are we spending enough time with the Word in the Scriptures and in the tabernacle? Are our conversations with others coming from the Word in the Scriptures and leading other to the Scriptures? Are we preaching ourselves or, rather, are we preaching the Word Incarnate? For those times when others aren't ready for the explicit preaching of the Word, are we still able to lay a foundation through the witness of our lives, a witness based on conformity to the Word?

There are so many ways that we can be guided by the Word of God and be shaped to become His faithful preachers. When our lives are saturated with the Word and when we beautifully live in imitation of Him, then the Lord can truly build a beautiful edifice in our own day, the Church universal.

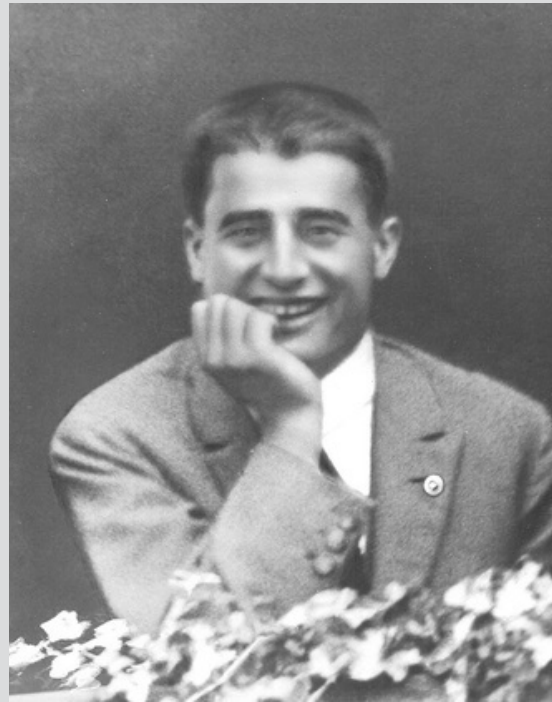

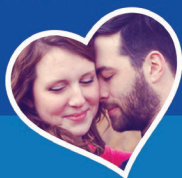
