PENTECOST

On **Saturday, May 27**, there will be a Solemn Mass for the Vigil of Pentecost at 7:30 pm at St. Vincent Ferrer. This Vigil Mass, similar in form to the Easter Vigil (but much more brief), includes readings and prayers added by Pope Benedict XVI in 2008. It will fulfill the Sunday obligation for Pentecost. The Schola will sing *Missa Dum complerentur* and the motet on which it is based, *Dum complerentur* – *Dum ergo essent*, by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina.

The regular evening Masses at 4 and 6 PM on Saturday, May 27 will be offered as well, but the 6 PM Mass will be a Low Mass.

The schedule for Pentecost **Sunday, May 28** is as usual, with the Schola Cantorum singing *Missa Veni Creator Spiritus*; *Confirma hoc, Deus*; and *Spiritus Sanctus replevit* by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina for the 12 NOON Solemn Mass.

MUSIC NOTES

For the 7:30 PM Solemn Vigil Mass and for the 12 NOON Solemn Mass of Pentecost, the Schola will sing music of Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (1525-1594), the Prince of Music. This greatest of all Catholic composers wrote music for almost every litrugical occasion, and his output for Whitsunday is extensive. *Missa Dum complerentur* is based on musical material from the accompanying motet and *Missa Veni Creator Spiritus* is based on the familiar chant melody.

Pope Francis, like St. John Paul II and Pope Benedict before him, has offered an additional aspect to understanding what it means to participate in the liturgy. At this point in his pontificate, it seems that Pope Francis has focused largely on formation connected with the liturgy.

First, he speaks about how liturgy forms us. He uses a tender example of a parent or grandparent taking a child's hand and showing him or her how to make the sign of the Cross (Desiderio Desideravi, 47). Similarly, he speaks about how the priest bows before the altar while saying, "With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you, Lord God" and how this educates the priest in "humility and contrition" (DD, 60). In these two examples, we see a larger reality that the liturgy shapes us to live the Christian life, with the Cross before us and in the humility of the Lord. The Pope speaks about how the liturgy itself is "the first 'teacher' of catechism" because it shapes us by its very actions (Address to the Schola Cantorum of the Italian Association of Saint Cecilia, 28 September 2019). In this way, the liturgy "gives us form" and "we are formed by it" (DD, 47).

Second, Pope Francis speaks about what the liturgy forms in us: Christ. Following the teachings of the Popes over the course of

the last century, Pope Francis says that the Holy Spirit, "plunging us into the paschal mystery," can "transform every dimension of our life, conforming us more and more to Christ" (*DD*, 21). In other words, when we actively participate in the liturgy, Christ is formed in us. Participation in the liturgy is about "our conformation to Christ" (*DD*, 41).

Finally, Pope Francis speaks about what the liturgy forms us for: evangelization. He boldly says that no one should rest until everyone has received their invitation to the wedding of the Lamb (cf. DD, 5). In a particular way, he indicates that music is a beautiful means to evangelize because it "creates bridges, [and] brings people closer, even the most distant," and that "it knows no barriers of nationality, ethnicity, or skin color, but involves everyone in a higher language" (Address, 28 September 2019). In other words, not only does the liturgy itself evangelize, but it should also lead us to evangelize others so that they too might enter into the Paschal Mystery and have Christ formed in them.

Through our participation in the Holy Mass, may Christ be formed in us so that we can become His faithful witnesses in the world.

PENTECOST

The Solemnity of Pentecost celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and is prayed as the third Glorious Mystery. It marks the fiftieth day of Easter: seven weeks of seven days, thus a week of weeks. Seven is sacred in Judeo-Christian numerology, rooted in the six days of creation with a Sabbath day of rest. From this structure also comes the Jewish tradition wherein every fiftieth year – a Jubilee Year – debts were forgiven and prisoners set free. The sobriquet of the Lord's Day as the "Eighth Day," meaning that in Christ a breakthrough to a new reality was achieved, is another example of this numerology.

Pentecost has its roots in the Jewish celebration known variously as the Feast of Weeks, Feast of Harvest, and Day of First-Fruits. Contemporary Judaism observes this festival, signifying the end of the grain harvest, as Shavu'ot (meaning "week").

You shall count off seven weeks; begin to count the seven weeks from the day when the sickle is first put to the standing grain. You shall then keep the Feast of Weeks for the Lord, your God, and the measure of your own voluntary offering which you will give shall be in proportion to the blessing the Lord, your God, has given you. (Deuteronomy 16:9-11)

Pentecost is also known as Whitsunday, a name derived either from the white garments that the neophytes would have worn for the last time (Pentecost marking the end of Eastertide), or from the wisdom (wit – formerly spelled 'wyt' or 'wytte') out-poured on the Apostles by the Holy Spirit. Red, considered an 'active' and 'caloric' color, is the liturgical color for this feast, as it is for Masses of Confirmation.

The Paschal Candle, blessed at the Easter Vigil, has been burning for the entirety of these fifty days, showing Christ's enduring presence until the descent of the Holy Spirit; although historically in some places the Candle was extinguished on the Ascension (the fortieth day after Easter) to mark the time of the cenacle.

The festal character is further conveyed by joyful *Alleluias* which conclude all the Propers, as has been the case since Easter, as well as the appointment of a Sequence (*Veni Sancte Spiritus*, sung after the *Alleluia*) paralleling Easter's *Victimae paschali laudes*.
