### PENTECOST

Fr. Peter Martyr Yungwirth, O.P., our new Pastor, will be visiting this weekend and will preach at all Masses.

On Saturday, May 22, there will be a Solemn Mass for the Vigil of Pentecost at 7:30 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer. This Vigil Mass, similar in form to the Easter Vigil (but much more brief, lasting only about 80 minutes).

The other evening Masses at 4 and 6 PM on Saturday, May 22 will still be offered as well, but the 6 PM Mass will be a Low Mass.

The schedule for Pentecost Sunday, May 23 is as usual, with the Schola Cantorum singing for the 12 NOON Solemn Mass.

### TRINITY SUNDAY – FRASSATI DAVIS'S MASSES OF THANKSGIVING

May 30, the first Sunday after Pentecost, is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. St. Rupert commented, "The time is well chosen, for, immediately after the descent of the Divine Spirit, began the preaching and belief and Baptism and confession in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit."

Frassati Davis, O.P. who has been serving as a deacon in the Parish for the past year, will be ordained to the holy priesthood in Washington, D.C. on Saturday, May 22. On Trinity Sunday, he will celebrate the 12 NOON Solemn Mass at St. Vincent Ferrer as a Mass of Thanksgiving.

While in New York, Br. Frassati has ministered to a number of Hispanic apostolates, so he will also offer a Mass of Thanksgiving in Spanish on Saturday, May 29 at 7:30 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer.

### MEMORIAL DAY SCHEDULE

In observance of Memorial Day, the Parish Offices will be closed on Monday, May 31. There will only be two Low Masses offered in the Parish: at 7 AM at St. Catherine of Siena and at 9 AM at St. Vincent Ferrer. No Confessions will be heard and both churches will close following the Masses.

## GATHERED, ORDERED, FULFILLED

I now possess enough longevity in Church life to perceive how the Holy Spirit builds things up. During my time as Novice Master he gave me an intimate view of his work. From 2000 to 2010 I lived in the same place and followed the same annual rhythm in the life of a Dominican community, parish, and ministry. Ten classes of novices arrived in July and left in August. It ought to have been a life on auto pilot after the first two years, but it never was. In the midst of structural sameness, change surged.

To begin with, each class developed its own culture, seemingly overnight. Preferences in food, patterns of humor, and subjects of group preoccupation shifted in ways that amazed me. Our novices shared a basic demographic ballpark and a perspective on Church life, so the changes from year to year made clear how much individual and shared temperament shaped daily life, outweighing the big theological and social issues people claim to be driven by. In a 24/7 environment, living together gelled life into a distinctive shape within 90 days, and like the culture in a marriage or a family, it had far more depth and complexity than a statistical profile could account for. The defining effect of the intangibles prompted a new awareness of God's providence.

Sure enough, after a few more years I began to discern a deeper current in the progression from class to class. At moments when we needed to develop our life, Brothers with the abilities needed, were on hand. How did men show up just at the right time for publishing books, reconfiguring space, or translating from Latin to English? By the tenth year of my time, our liturgical and communal practice had evolved in ways I never would have dreamed of at the beginning.

Each class did something new and left it behind. Its successor class recognized this as a part of novitiate life and built on it. I had the privileged perspective of seeing how life acquired more texture and depth as each skill set prepared the ground for the next, and each insight prompted another. The novitiate evolved from class to class without any plan on my part, save my desire to discern the gifts and interests of each novice, and to draw them out in the context of our life, to which he felt called. I perceived, with ever greater wonder, that the Holy Spirit was developing our Novitiate year by year, assembling groups of men at the right time and in the right place. This was a lesson I packed in my suitcase and brought to New York.

If our small novitiate community in Cincinnati was a living organism fostered by the Holy Spirit, then so was this parish. Over my eleven years in New York, this truth revealed itself in spades. First, it became clear to me in the wonderful succession of young Friars who have served us as Parochial Vicars over these last eleven years. Frs. Bruno Shah, John Chrysostom Kozlowski, Innocent Smith, Luke Hoyt, and Joseph Hagan have each been wonderful parish priests, and splendid brothers, but they also came on the scene in a providential succession that was not planned by anyone least of all, me. Each had temperament and talents needed for the moment of our parish history in which he figured.

The Spirit's craft shows up everywhere. I have seen parish administration develop under the late Pat Keegan and then under Lee Ann Rubino, so that the management of affairs became more transparent at a time when society craved institutional candor; the music program developed under James Wetzel through merger and pandemic become more grounded in the scriptural word and the liturgical tradition.

When we ended up as one parish with two churches, Fr. Joseph Allen was there to make sure St. Catherine's lacked for nothing by way of physical care or pastoral concern. To assist him, the genial Dan O'Leary has made sure the front office at #411 abounded in warmth and concern.

As I look back over the last eleven years, I see our parish relating to its members and to the wider world in ever faster and more effective ways, and that is because Rachel Miller, Ginny McCusker, James Wetzel and our young Friars had the skills when they were needed, and we were positioned to give scope to them.

As violence increasingly marked our social words and deeds, the parish was able to make a response through the gentle, human-scaled work of Lisa Harrelson in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. She was able to surround young people with safety, beauty, and coherence, just when they needed it. With the Spirit's timing, Lisa could build on a foundation laid lovingly by Dolores Getcher back when the parish needed to start Religious Ed from scratch. The industry and zeal of our catechists brought burgeoning sacramental numbers, and there was John Powers with a careful eye and an elegant hand to record the events and certify them. Another beautiful gift, just when it was needed.

Young and old together needed safety and good order in church, and sure enough Nadir, Tony Hicks and Tracey Hicks at St. Vincent Ferrer, and Terrance Freeman at St. Catherine's have been able to give it to them. In days of city lock-down our churches were refuges of light and peace thanks to their ministries.

The continuity of the Church is not to stay the same, but to greet the new in the light of a living tradition. The smile of this welcome has been on the lips of Br. Damian for four decades now. He has received countless wayfarers at our door and welcomed them into the community of the parish, respecting always their comfort and privacy.

At Pentecost we have the opportunity in real time, and among real people to see how the Holy Spirit arranges things in every season for the good of Christ's Body. I look back over eleven years, marvel at his work, and believe.

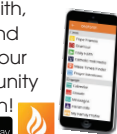

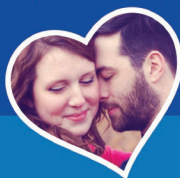
