Charity and Joy

EXPERIENCING JOY

Joy can be contagious. My first wedding as a priest was for my cousin. She and I had grown up together, and the wedding was at one of the churches in our hometown. She and her fiancé were faithful and greatly desired to enter into a loving relationship supported by God's grace in the sacrament of matrimony. Right after the moment when they made their vows, I kind of blurted out in a whisper, "You're so married!" Their faces beamed with joy, I smiled, and whole church lit up with that contagious joy.

THE HEART OF JOY

Following Aristotle, St. Thomas wisely points out that joy is an effect of love (cf. ST II-II, q. 28). Whenever we have that thing we love, our hearts can rest more contentedly because they have something that they been searching for, longing for, and hoping for.

This isn't to say that being joyful is exclusive of also having some sorrow. Much to the relief of many of us (I imagine), Aquinas very wisely points out that there are two main types of spiritual joy. The first is joying (a word from Bl. Columba Marmion) in God simply because of God's goodness, His divinity, His perfection and so forth: "with this joy, we rejoice in the Divine good considered in itself" (ST II-II, q. 28, a. 2, corp.). Coming to know that God is God, that He is perfect, that He is a communion of love can lead to joy in a certain sense.

At the same time, there is a joy that flows from our participation in God, our union with Him. In this joy, we have the object of our love, the One whom we desire. Yet, in this life, we only have Him imperfectly. There are things that get in the way of us coming to perfect union: sin, distractions in prayer, weaknesses of the mind and the heart, suffering that we or others experience. Aquinas says that "in so far as a man grieves for that which hinders the participation of the Divine good, either in us or in our neighbor, whom we love as ourselves," we can have a mix of joy and sorrow in this life (ibid.). Hopefully throughout this life, our sorrows will be eased, our attention in prayer will be increased, and our sinful habits will be broken. Then, when we cross the threshold of this life and God-willing enter into the eternal banquet of heaven, we will have perfect joy. There, we will come into perfect union with the Source of all goodness and love.

LIVING WITH JOY

So how do we begin to live with an increased sense of joy in this life? How can our faces light up like that joy-filled bride and groom? It all starts with charity. If we want to joy in God and if we want to live in joy, then it needs to begin with charity. It starts with coming to be with God, coming to the church, and sitting in His presence in the Blessed Sacrament. It starts with prayer in church, at home, on the subway, and wherever we go. Learning to pray more deeply, growing in service to our neighbor, finding God in all things, these things lead to joy. For the more that we come to know and love Him and the more that we come to see His handiwork in creation and through His providential plan, then the more that we'll live in joy. Even if it's somewhat admixed with sorrow in this life, God-willing one day, we will be able to live in perfect joy and for all eternity.

May God bless us all with that life of eternal joy!

May Crowning

The month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. On Sunday, May 5, at the 9:30 AM Mass at St. Vincent's and at the 10 AM Mass at St. Catherine's, we will have a May Crowning of a statue of Our Blessed Mother. St. Vincent Ferrer High School will also crown Our Lady of New York, the statue on the corner of Lexington Avenue and 65th Street, on Tuesday, May 14th at 2:50 PM.

MONDAY, MAY 6, 7 PM

Solemnity of Dedication

For the Solemnity of Anniversary of Dedication of the Church of St. Vincent Ferrer on Monday, May 6, there will be a Solemn Dominican Rite Mass at 7 PM at St. Vincent's in which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Mass in G minor* by Ralph Vaughan Williams.

The building, dedicated on May 5, 1918, was built to the designs of renowned American architect Bertram Grosvenor Goodhue, who considered this his finest building. This National Historic Landmark is widely acclaimed as the foremost American example of French Gothic-style architecture and includes a complete set of Charles Connick stained glass windows, carvings by Lee Lawrie, and two instruments by the Schantz Organ Company.

TUESDAY, MAY 7, 6 PM

Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer

For the Solemnity of St. Vincent Ferrer, observed on Tuesday, May 7, there will be a Solemn Mass and Procession at 6 PM at St. Vincent's in which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa in honorem Sancti Vincentii Ferrerii*, Op. 7 by Vinzenz Goller. Following the Mass, a relic of our patron will be available for veneration.

St. Vincent Ferrer's feast day according to the Dominican liturgical calendar is May 5, but it is transferred this year at our Parish because May 5 is a Sunday. In the general Roman Calendar, St. Vincent's feast is April 5, the day on which he died in 1419.

THURSDAY, MAY 9

Ascension Day

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent's for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Laudate Dominum* by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina; *O Rex gloriae* by Andrea Gabrieli; and *Ite in universum mundum* by Tiburtio Massaino.

In addition to the regular weekday Mass & Confessions, we will have a 10 AM School Mass at St. Vincent's and a 1 PM Low Mass at St. Catherine's. The evening Masses on Wednesday, May 8 will be for the Vigil of the Solemnity and will satisfy the obligation. The Wednesday Holy Hour at St. Vincent's and the Thursday Holy Hour at St. Catherine's will take place as usual.


