MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, for the Fifth Sunday of Easter, the Schola will sing music of the greatest Catholic composer of the Renaissance. Giovanni Pierluigi, born in the town of Palestrina near Rome, began his musical life as a chorister in the choir of the Basilica of St. Mary Major in 1537. His first published book of Masses was so well received by Pope Julius III that he was named *maestro di cappella* of the Julian Chapel of St. Peter's Basilca in 1551. He held similar positions elsewhere in Rome, including at St. John Lateran (where he succeeded Orlando di Lasso) and St. Mary Major before returning to St. Peter's in 1571. Palestrina composed at least 105 settings of the Mass, nearly 400 motets, and countless other choral works, many of which were published in his lifetime. As the most famous and influential Renaissance composer, his style is considered the definitive example of "correct" vocal writing, a technical mastery which earned him the moniker "Prince of Music."

The Dominican Charism – Where does preaching come from?

"If the people know you love them, they'll forgive you." This was the advice my spiritual director gave me right before I was ordained a priest. I'll never forget those words, and in many ways I found them true at Providence College (I hope they will ring true here too). When it comes to preaching and ministry in general, Pope St. Paul VI said, "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses" (*Address to the Members of the Consilium de Laicis*, 2 October 1974). This might sound like an odd citation coming from a Dominican whose charism it is to preach for the salvation of souls, but I think there's something to this that actually fits into the Dominican charism. What makes a teacher first a witness?

For the Dominicans, our life of preaching is founded on the other three pillars that we have been unpacking since the fall: prayer, study, and community. Good preaching flows out from a life where prayer, study, and community are all intricately related and beautifully intertwined. The Dominican *Constitutions* puts it this way:

"Sharing in the Apostles' mission, we also follow their way of life, in the form devised by Saint Dominic. We do our best to live of one accord the common life, observing faithfully the celebration of the liturgy, especially the Eucharist and the Divine Office, diligent in study and constant in regular observance. Not only do these things contribute to the glory of God and our sanctification, they also bear directly on the salvation of humankind, since together they prepare and impel us to preach; they give our preaching its character, and, in turn, are influenced by it. The life of the order comprises a synthesis of these elements, inseparably interconnected, harmoniously balanced, and mutually enriching. It is an apostolic life in the full sense of the word, from which preaching and teaching ought to issue from an abundance of contemplation." (*Fundamental Constitutions*, IV)

In other words, a Dominican cannot preach well if he or she ignores any of these other pillars in his or her life.

These other pillars shape the life of the preacher. In very clear ways, prayer shapes the heart, and study shapes the intellect. Yet, study can also shape the heart to love what it is coming to know, and prayer can be a means to deeper clarity about the topics of faith and morals. Moreover, community can build on the topics of prayer and study. Aside from our House of Studies in Washington, where theological conversations in the refectory (the room where we eat) abound, communal meals and communal recreation in all our communities also can become beautiful means to grow in our understanding of God and how His grace works in the world. All three of these elements become instrumental to shape the preacher so that he or she, in turn, can become God's instrument for the evangelization of the world.

When the mind, the heart, and the whole life of the preacher are shaped in this way, he or she becomes a witness to what he or she is saying, and that is where preaching comes from. The content of preaching, when built on a life close to God, has greater depth and sometimes can break through even hardened hearts.

For those in a Dominican parish, who are called each in their own way to be proponents and ministers of the Gospel, these same principles apply. Others will open their hearts to you, and more importantly to God, if they first know you love them. With a life built on contemplative prayer, rigorous study, and rich community, the Lord can form our parishioners into fruitful evangelists. May He do just that for each and every one of us.


