TRINITY SUNDAY

The first Sunday after Pentecost (June 12) is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. St. Rupert commented, "The time is well chosen, for, immediately after the descent of the Divine Spirit, began the preaching and belief and Baptism and confession in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit." At the conclusion of the 12 NOON Solemn Mass on Trinity Sunday, a Solemn Te Deum will be sung. This is the great hymn of Thanksgiving to the Holy Trinity.

Summer Ordinary Time begins after Pentecost and lasts until the beginning of Advent (November 27, 2022). The lectionary in this segment of the liturgical year focuses on the spreading of the Gospel by the Spirit-filled acts of the Apostles.

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION

Sunday, June 19 is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi – the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. After the 12 NOON Solemn Mass at St. Vincent Ferrer, there will be a Eucharistic Procession with brass quartet through the streets to St. Catherine of Siena, with a stational altar along the way at St. John Nepomucene. There will be Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at both St. John's and St. Catherine's.

Eucharistic Adoration will then continue at St. Catherine of Siena until Benediction at 4:45 рм. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed at 3 рм and the Rosary recited at 4 рм.

FATHER'S DAY

Next Sunday, June 19 is Father's Day. There will be a Remembrance Book for all deceased fathers at the St. Joseph Altar at both Churches. In addition, our Father's Day Novena starts June 19 and ends on June 27. A daily Mass will be offered at St. Vincent Ferrer during this time for this intention.

NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

Thursday, June 23 is the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, transferred from June 24; the Nativity is outranked by the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart. There will be a Sung Mass at 6 рм at St. Vincent Ferrer.

John the Baptist has two feast days in the liturgical calendar: one commemorating his birth (June 24) and the other his death (August 29). There are only three nativities observed in the Roman Catholic calendar: for Jesus, for Mary, and for the Baptist.

SACRED HEART OF JESUS AND IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

Friday, June 24 is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Laudate Dominum* by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina; *Venite ad me omnes* by Felice Anerio; and *Magnus Dominus* by Andrea Rota.

Saturday, June 25 is the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

CESSATION OF PARISH LIVE-STREAMING

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has called for a three-yearlong Eucharistic Revival, beginning next Sunday on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The primary way to enter into this Revival is to be physically in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. As a way of encouraging the faithful to return to Mass, and as announced in the Pastor's Eucharistic Revival Letter in the bulletin of May 22, the Parish is ending its regular practice of live-streaming liturgies on Corpus Christi. The last regular livestream Mass will be Friday, June 17.

For those parishioners who are truly homebound, EWTN Global Catholic Network broadcasts a live daily Mass. Please contact the Parish office if you or a parishioner you know would like to receive communion or to have their confession heard.

MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, for the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Schola will sing the heroic *Messe* by Charles-Marie Widor. Born in Lyon, Widor studied at the Brussels Conservatoire and subsequently was appointed assistant to Camille Saint-Saëns at the Church of the Madeleine in Paris. In January 1870, Widor was named organist of St. Sulpice, the most prominent organist's post in France, which he held for nearly 64 years. Additionally, he became professor of organ at the Paris Conservatoire following the death of César Franck in 1890, later becoming professor of composition, replacing Théodore Dubois. Widor's students included Marcel Dupré, Louis Vierne, Charles Tournemire, Darius Milhaud, Edgard Varèse, and Albert Schweitzer. While known mainly for his ten organ symphonies, he composed in all major genres, including opera. A leading figure of Parisian cultural life beyond music, Widor was made a chevalier of the Léegion d'Honneur in 1892 and was elected permanent secretary of the Académie des Beaux-Arts in 1914.

THE DOMINICAN SHRINE OF ST. JUDE SACRED HEART NOVENA

June 16 – 24

The Lord has said: "Let whoever is thirsty come to me and drink, and streams of living water will flow from within the one who believes." These words from John (7: 37-38) offer each of us a beautiful image of God's love for all humanity.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) will be celebrated on Sunday, June 19. The U.S. Bishops have announced that a three-year Eucharistic Revival will begin on Corpus Christi Sunday and they anticipate a Eucharistic Congress in 2024 at the revival's conclusion. I expect that we will be inundated with all kinds of materials, programs, and rationale from the archdiocese as plans mature.

Here at the Shrine of St. Jude, we are anticipating the celebration of our annual novena of prayer to The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. We will begin this novena on Thursday, June 16 continuing through Friday, June 24. The Solemnity of The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is always celebrated on the Friday following the week after Corpus Christi.

The Sacred Heart began to be mentioned in a very restricted way during medieval times. The writings of St. Bonaventure and others in the 13th century started to open reflections but did not seek expression in any liturgical service. This change would come in the 17th century under the influence of St. John Eudes (1601-1680) and St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690).

A period of discussion and controversy arose concerning the validity and meaning of devotion to the Sacred Heart and the possibility of a liturgical feast for such a devotion. Within the Roman Curia, the Congregation of Rites was firmly opposed to any such approval. The circumstances gradually changed as Rome received requests for the institution of a feast to the Sacred Heart. Notably, the requests came out of Poland from the Sisters of the Visitation, the religious order to which St. Margaret Mary belonged.

Sister Margaret Mary, at the age of 24, had joined the Visitation nuns at Paray-le-Monial, France, and would make profession of vows in 1672. The following year, on the feast of St. John the Evangelist, the Lord asked her to receive Communion on the first Friday of each month and to make reparation for the sins committed against Him.

In June 1675, Jesus asked that the first Friday after the feast of Corpus Christi be dedicated to His Sacred Heart along with reception of Communion and acts of reparation. Sister Margaret Mary's superiors were unwilling to cooperate, but she ultimately received support and guidance from a Jesuit, Claude de la Colombiere.

In time, one of the nuns, a friend of Sister Margaret Mary became the religious superior and selected her to be an assistant and mistress of novices. With these changes in the leadership, the community could reflect and give its consent to the message that Sister Margaret Mary had been receiving in her private revelations. On June 21, 1686, the feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated in the convent for the first time.

In 1873, France was consecrated to the Sacred Heart and the Basilica of Sacre Coeur was built in the Montmartre district of Paris. In 1856 Pope Pius IX extended the feast of the Sacred Heart to the Universal Church. Pope Pius XI raised the feast to a solemnity.

With this brief historical overview, I hope the devotion to the Sacred Heart might increase among our parishioners. Father Peter Martyr dedicated the Parish to the Sacred Heart of Jesus this past fall on the Solemnity of Christ the King. Our image of the Sacred Heart along with the novena prayer will be used in our two churches. It is our hope that this prayer will be a source of renewal and devotion for you to the Most Sacred Heart. I suggest that we unite our prayers during this Novena for the safety and well-being of all God's children, and that we remember those who suffer from anguish and discouragement. Let us also remember the people of Ukraine during these very difficult times of war and displacement. Pray that the Sacred Heart of Jesus will restore their hope and promise for a better future.

Please list your petitions in our intention book at Shrine of the Sacred Heart in each of our churches. These books will be set up in advance of the Novena on the weekend of June 12.

The prayer of this Novena will be said at five daily Masses in our parish, as well as all eight of the Masses we celebrate on Sunday. In addition, we will offer a Novena of Masses beginning on Thursday, June 16 and concluding on the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

I pray that you might find in this celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus the true source of grace and His healing touch in all your needs.


