TRINITY SUNDAY

The first Sunday after Pentecost (June 12) is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. St. Rupert commented, “The time is well chosen, for, immediately after the descent of the Divine Spirit, began the preaching and belief and Baptism and confession in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.” At the conclusion of the 12 NOON Solemn Mass on Trinity Sunday, a Solemn Te Deum will be sung. This is the great hymn of Thanksgiving to the Holy Trinity.

Summer Ordinary Time begins after Pentecost and lasts until the beginning of Advent (November 27, 2022). The lectionary in this segment of the liturgical year focuses on the spreading of the Gospel by the Spirit-filled acts of the Apostles. Before the Second Vatican Council, the equivalent “Time after Pentecost” began on the Monday after Trinity Sunday because Pentecost had an Octave.

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION

Sunday, June 19 is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi – the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. After the 12 NOON Solemn Mass at St. Vincent Ferrer, there will be a Eucharistic Procession with brass quartet through the streets to St. Catherine of Siena where there will be Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Eucharistic Adoration will then continue at St. Catherine of Siena until Benediction at 4:45 PM. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed at 3 PM and the Rosary recited at 4 PM.

SECOND COLLECTION

Next weekend, a second collection will be taken-up to support the Latin American and Home Missions. Thank you for your generosity.

The Dominican Charism – Being Sent like the Apostles

In the mid thirteenth century, the well-known Dominican, St. Albert the Great was teaching in Paris. His remarkable knowledge of Aristotle, the Scriptures, and theology had led the Dominican Order to entrust him with teaching some of her finest students. Most famously, this included St. Thomas Aquinas. Yet, there was another student whose life bears imitation—Bl. Ambrose of Siena.

Bl. Ambrose had joined the Dominican Order at the age of seventeen and was soon after sent to Paris to study under St. Albert and alongside St. Thomas. In 1248, when St. Albert was sent to Cologne and brought St. Thomas with him, Bl. Ambrose was likewise sent to Cologne. Thomas and Ambrose also began to teach, but something changed in Ambrose there. He had always known that he had a sharp intellect, but he quickly realized how deeply Thomas was able to penetrate eternal truths and to communicate them to others. At this, Ambrose carried out one of his most virtuous deeds. He stopped teaching and took up a life of preaching.

It was as a preacher that Bl. Ambrose truly excelled. He was not known to have oratorical flourishes and remarkable elegance in what he said. Rather, his sermons were simple. Yet in that simplicity, they were remarkably effective and efficacious. Through his preaching, he was able to restore peace between Venice and Genoa as well as between Florence and Pisa, he was able to reconcile Emperor Conrad of Germany with Pope Clement IV, and he was able to convince the Pope to lift the interdict from Siena not just once but twice. It was said that sometimes while he was preaching, a dove could be seen flying close to his ear as the Holy Spirit guided his words.

What was it that made Bl. Ambrose so effective as a preacher? It was a life of virtue that was built on the Dominican Charism. His study with St. Albert and his teaching with St. Thomas bore remarkable fruit that took root through a life of prayer and attentiveness to God's providence and the promptings of the Holy Spirit. The community shaped him, the study shaped him, and the prayer shaped him. Through it all, he was led to a life of humility and holiness. All of that together became the foundation for the efficacy of his preaching for the salvation of souls.

As we conclude our series on the Dominican charism, Bl. Ambrose shows us a beautiful example of what St. Dominic desired for his brothers and sisters. Our Holy Father Dominic hoped that his way of living the apostolic life—through a harmony of prayer, study, community, and preaching—would bear fruit in his own day and in the years to come. It's when these four pillars of the Dominican life are lived in a healthy balance that great fruits become manifest. Hearts are transformed, souls are saved, and the faithful are drawn closer to God.

I hope that our reflections over the course of the last nine months will continue to bear fruit in the life of the Parish. As we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost this weekend, may the Lord send His Holy Spirit down upon us so that like the apostles and the Dominican saints and blessed, we all may truly be a powerful and fruitful example of the Holy Preaching.

PENTECOST

The Solemnity of Pentecost celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and is prayed as the third Glorious Mystery. It marks the fiftieth day of Easter: seven weeks of seven days, thus a week of weeks. Seven is sacred in Judeo-Christian numerology, rooted in the six days of creation with a Sabbath day of rest. From this structure also comes the Jewish tradition wherein every fiftieth year – a Jubilee Year – debts were forgiven and prisoners set free, and the sobriquet of the Lord's Day as the "Eighth Day," meaning that in Christ a breakthrough to a new reality was achieved.

Pentecost has its roots in the Jewish celebration known variously as the Feast of Weeks, Feast of Harvest, and Day of First-Fruits. Contemporary Judaism observes this festival, signifying the end of the grain harvest, as Shavu'ot (meaning "week").

You shall count off seven weeks; begin to count the seven weeks from the day when the sickle is first put to the standing grain. You shall then keep the Feast of Weeks for the Lord, your God, and the measure of your own voluntary offering which you will give shall be in proportion to the blessing the Lord, your God, has given you.
(Deuteronomy 16:9-11)

Pentecost is also known as Whitsunday, a name derived either from the white garments that the neophytes would have worn for the last time (Pentecost marking the end of Eastertide), or from the wisdom (wit – formerly spelled 'wyt' or 'wytte') out-poured on the Apostles by the Holy Spirit. Red, considered an 'active' and 'caloric' color, is the liturgical color for this feast, as it is for Masses of Confirmation and Ordination.

The Paschal Candle, blessed at the Easter Vigil, has been burning for the entirety of these fifty days, showing Christ's enduring presence until the descent of the Holy Spirit; although historically in some places the Candle was extinguished on the Ascension (the fortieth day after Easter) to mark the time of the cenacle.

The festal character is further conveyed by joyful *Alleluias* which conclude all the Propers, as has been the case since Easter, as well as the appointment of a Sequence (*Veni Sancte Spiritus*, sung after the *Alleluia*) paralleling Easter's *Victimae paschali laudes*.

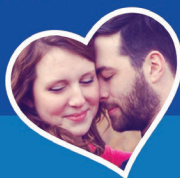
