ANNIVERSARY OF CANONIZATION OF ST. THOMAS AQUINAS

Tuesday, July 18 is the 700th Anniversary of the Canonization of the St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican friar and Doctor of the Church known as the *Doctor Angelicus*, by Pope John XXII on July 18, 1323. There will be a **Solemn Mass at 6** PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola will sing *Missa Prima Sexti Toni* by Giovanni Croce, *O sacrum convivium* by Giaches de Wert, and *O salutaris hostia* by Thomas Tallis. (Both Eucharistic texts were written by Aquinas.)

St. Mary Magdalene

Saturday, July 22 is the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene, Patroness of the Order of Preachers. The 9:30 AM Dominican Rite Mass at St. Vincent Ferrer will be a Solemn Mass.

St. Mary Magdalene is referred to as the "Apostle of the Apostles" (*Apostola Apostolorum*) because she carried the news of the Resurrection to the apostles. With St. Catherine of Alexandria, she is a Patroness of the Order of Preachers.

St. James the Great

Tuesday, July 25 is the Feast of St. James the Great, Apostle. There will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer.

CELEBRATIONS OF ST. DOMINIC

Our Holy Father Dominic, the founder of the Order of Preachers, died on August 6, 1221. To mark the 802nd Anniversary, the Parish will have several days worth of special celebrations.

On **Friday, August 4**, the traditional feastday of St. Dominic, there will be a Solemn Mass in the Dominican Rite at 7 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Cantate* by John Sheppard.

Tuesday, August 8 is the Solemnity of St. Dominic according to the modern liturgical calendar. There will be a Solemn Mass and Procession at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer for which the Schola will sing *Missa Brevis in F Major*, K. 192 by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart; *Benedictus Redemptor omnium, Sanctus Dominicum* by Adrian Willaert; *Salve Regina* by Mitthaeus Pipelare.

From August 2–8, the Memorial of Bl. Jane Aza, the mother of St. Dominic to the Solemnity of St. Dominic, relics of St. Dominic will be displayed for veneration by the Rosary Altar at St. Vincent Ferrer.

MUSIC NOTES

Next weekend, for the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Schola will sing a setting of *Justitiae Domini* taken from Palestrina's collection *Offertoria totius anni secundum Sanctae Romanae Ecclesiae consuetudinem* published in 1593. This cycle contains sixty-eight five-voice settings of the Offertory Antiphons for all Sundays and major feasts of the liturgical year. Palestrina uses melodies of his own creation instead of taking the chant as his musical starting point as was often the case. Even in comparison to other works of Palestrina's, these motets are conservative in their construction, especially in the treatment of dissonances. Just as the collection is thematically ordered according to the liturgical year, it is musically ordered according to the ascending church modes.

When the apostles received their First Communion at the Last Supper, they had been prepared for a period of three years. In listening to Jesus' preaching, in witnessing His miracles, and in seeing His charity and compassion, their hearts and minds were open to the various gifts that He desired to pour out upon them. At the beginning of the Last Supper, He offered one final act of preparation: He washed their feet. It was a final act of cleansing to prepare them for the gift of His Body and Blood.

This was also instructive for us. *The Roman Catechism* says that Jesus washed the apostles' feet "to show that we must use extreme diligence before Holy Communion in order to approach it with the greatest purity and innocence of soul" (ch. 7). Over the past two weeks, we have looked at preparing ourselves for Holy Communion by making sure that we have prepared our body through fasting, our comportment, and our dress as well as by making sure that our souls are clean from grave sin. So how do we make sure that we are approaching the Eucharist "with the greatest purity and innocence of soul"?

First, we can ask ourselves: are we at peace with others? In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus says, "If you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift" (Mt. 5:23-24). The same would apply if our brother has done something against us, and we need to forgive him. Actively seeking

to forgive and seeking forgiveness are very fruitful ways to open our hearts to receive the deeper graces of the Lord that He desires to give us in Communion.

Moreover, we should ask ourselves if we can truly say with St. Peter, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you" (Jn. 21:17). It is so helpful to examine how deeply we love the Lord and ask Him for the grace that we may grow deeper in our love for and our dependence on Him. The greater that we enter into Communion with a heart filled with love, the more fruits that we will receive from Him.


Finally, it is good to prepare ourselves before Mass begins by reading the readings and liturgical prayers of the day's Mass, especially the text of the Eucharistic Prayer. This will help us to receive the word of God with open hearts and to more deeply join our prayers to those of the priest offering the Mass. In doing this, we will more completely benefit from what the Mass can do in our hearts. Our hearts will become more open God's grace, which will then more worthily dispose us to receive the fruits of communing with the Lord through Holy Communion.

At each and every Mass, may we more worthily prepare our souls for the graces that the Lord desires to pour out upon us so that He can strengthen us in this life and prepare us for the next.




