Pious Prayers

PIETY ON THE INTERCOM

As a high school senior, I was invited to lead the morning announcements every day. I'm not exactly sure why I got asked to do it or even why they let me do it all year (at some point, I introduced a "Random fact of the day" to the normal course of announcements). Part of the normal morning routine, though, was leading the Pledge of Allegiance. Normally, we think of this as a nice way of instilling patriotism in the young. What is often overlooked, though, is that this is actually an act of the virtue of piety. Every time we show respect for a US flag, sing "God bless America" or the "Star-Spangled Banner," or say the Pledge of Allegiance, we are actually living out the virtue of piety.

PIETY IN THE HEART

Now, most people think of piety as relating to how deeply someone prays. As was said a few weeks ago, that actually concerns the virtue of devotion. Piety is something different. St. Thomas points out that we are bound to honor those from whom we receive benefits (cf. ST II-II, q. 101, a. 1, corp. art.). First and foremost, we owe God honor, and this is offered through the virtue of religion. Secondly, we owe honor to our parents and our country for all the support they give to our lives, and this is offered through the virtue of piety. In other words, piety is not only the virtue by which we carry out the Fourth Commandment to "honor thy father and thy mother," but it's also the virtue by which we show reverence to our nation for its continued support for what we need.

Following Tully, Aquinas points out that "'piety gives both duty and homage': 'duty' referring to service, and 'homage' to reverence or honor" (ST II-II, q. 101, art. 2, corp. art.). Here, we can see that piety can be lived out when we say good words about our parents to others, when we give them Mother's Day or Father's Day gifts, and even when we support their material needs when they are elderly. In all of these ways, we show a beautiful and proper duty or homage to our parents. The same principles would also apply to

the various ways that we relate to our country.

Finally, Aquinas points out that while piety properly concerns parents and country, it can be extended to God with regard to Him as our Father (ST II-II, q. 101, art. 3, ad 2). In this way, the gift of the Holy Spirit of piety helps us to love and honor God as our Father.

CHALLENGING PIETY

Now, it is important to keep in mind that while most of the time parents and nations do offer good, fruitful, virtuous support for those entrusted to their care, this isn't always the case. Sometimes parents set an example that is not worth repeating, and sometimes the nation persecutes Christianity or does other things that negatively impact our path to holiness. In these cases, the pious act is to pray for whatever needs to happen so that the parents or the country can grow closer to God. Others can bear wounds in those situations, and the Lord knows what is needed to heal those wounds. Praying that He does and that He floods hearts with His peace is actually a beautiful way to live out the virtue of piety in complicated situations.
