# A Summer of Transfiguration

#### TRANSFIGURED LIVES

This past summer was beautiful. From the Corpus Christi Procession with the new banners and the flower girls leading the way for the Lord, to the celebration of the Sacred Heart as a principle point of the month of June, to 4th of July festivities, to the 700th Anniversary of St. Thomas Aquinas's canonization, to St. Dominic's Days with Fr. Gregory Pine, O.P. and Fr. Malachy Napier, C.F.R. preaching the two Masses in honor of St. Dominic, to end of the 125th Anniversary Year of the Dominican ministry at St. Catherine's with Cardinal Dolan, we have had a splendid summer rich with grace and the goodness of the Lord.

At the same time, we had some beautiful catechetical moments. From Br. Charles's Parish Study on the connection between confession and the Eucharist to Fr. Ignatius's Midday Retreat with the Mystics that included the Sisters of Life and Dominicans from around the world just a couple of weeks ago, we have been blessed with solid and fruitful preaching. We have been illuminated by the Lord's grace so that as we come to know the Lord more nearly, we may love Him more dearly.

#### TRANSFIGURED BUILDINGS

Yet, it was not just our minds and hearts that were being transfigured. The spaces in our buildings have also been receiving an overhaul. The most obvious is the confessional renovation at St. Vincent Ferrer. While this is not yet quite finished (please pray that the additional panes of glass that will reduce the sound and the visibility of the penitents come very soon!), we have almost completed it. We now have four functional confessionals, one with a door large enough for wheelchairs and strollers, a chair in the first confessional for those who are not able to kneel, and the text of the Act of Contrition printed in multiple languages in each of the confessionals to aid penitents whose first language is not English. I hope that these renovations will not only make the sacrament more accessible in practical ways but also more fruitful in spiritual ones as the Lord pours out His mercy upon us and the Madonna of Mercy (whose painting now hangs in each of the confessionals) intercedes for us.

In addition to that, we have also renovated our atria for the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, which helps us to account for more children in the program as well as for its importance in the life of the Parish. There are now two atria at St. Catherine's, which are both larger and more well-lit. We also finished the renovation of the new atrium at St. Vincent's for the Infant-Toddler section of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. These three beautiful atria will be such an integral part of our ability to pass on the faith to those youngest among us.

As a result of the movement of the atria at St. Catherine's, we renovated the old atrium space and turned it into St. Joseph Hall, where we held the reception after the recent Anniversary Mass. This space can open into the foyer and even into the courtyard if need be (you might have noticed some new plant life in the courtyard there too).

All in all, this has been a summer of transfiguration (including our bulletin template), which I hope sets the stage for the Lord to profoundly transform our lives as we begin this new year. May it be one of goodness and grace, health and holiness!

Thursday, September 14 is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Friday, September 15 is the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. There will be a Sung Mass at 5:15 PM at St. Catherine of Siena both evenings.

There will be exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Catherine on Thursday and Friday from 11:30 AM, concluding with Benediction and the recitation of the Rosary before the 5:15 PM Mass.

One of two such periods of extended adoration offered annually in the Parish, this one is offered for the intentions for those suffering in the hospitals and for those who care for them.

# A REPORT FROM THE SOCIAL CONCERNS COMMITTEE

Dear Parishioners,

The Social Concerns Committee would like to share with you the ways your generous donations supported our work this past year – September 2022 through June 2023. As usual, you were extremely generous with each of our requests.

One of our major works had been providing entertainment for the ladies at the Park Avenue Shelter with Thursday bingo games. To our surprise, we discovered that the women were not interested in playing bingo at this time. Yet, the women were most appreciative of the individualized Christmas gifts you donated. We wrapped at least three gifts in each bag and arranged to have a festive dinner catered on the day they received your gifts.

We aided the poor in many other ways too. We used some of the toiletries, socks, and clothing you have given for the migrants and to a WIN home in upper Manhattan, a step-up program for women in need. Our collections for the Common Pantry reached \$17,162. At the beginning of Lent, we had an in-kind food drive for specific food items, and you donated so much. In the Spring, we participated in another project for the Common Pantry, preparing lunch bags for weekend distribution. We made sandwiches and included other items. Finally, we had our usual collection of items for the elderly in the Bronx around Mother's Day. Your immediate and generous support of
