The Pilgrimage of Life

PILGRIMAGES OF THE PAST

In college, I was blessed to go on a number of unique pilgrimages: walking from Maine to DC multiple times to share the Gospel of Life and the Theology of the Body; traveling to Rome and Cologne for Pope Benedict XVI's first World Youth Day; journeying to Rome, Bologna, and Assisi as a thanksgiving for being accepted into the Dominican Order. Waking, traveling, praying, sleeping. Every day it seemed that the schedule was similar, but no day was ever the same. Each of these pilgrimages had its own stages, unique stories, laughs, challenges, and moments of gratitude. Yet, all of them shared one thing in common—God's grace led to transformation.

THE PILGRIMAGE OF LIFE

Life is a pilgrimage. We are only here temporarily, and all the while we are on a journey with and to the Lord. If we lose sight of this, then we can end up getting lost. As Pope Francis said, "everything becomes confused; it is impossible to tell good from evil, or the road to our destination from other roads which take us in endless circles, going nowhere" (Lumen fidei, 3). However, when we stay focused on the reality of God's providence unfolding before us, then every part of His plan can truly be transformative. His grace can come in the moments of challenge, humor, humility, and joy. The more and more that we open our minds and hearts to that, the more His graces will shape us according to His plan. Then, at the end of this pilgrimage of life, can we finally find a true place of rest, an eternal rest with Him in heaven.

PILGRIMAGES TO DC, LOURDES, AND THE HOLY LAND

It is with this in mind that a group of parishioners is setting out on a pilgrimage to Washington, DC for the Dominican Rosary Pilgrimage at the end of the month. Through the intercession of the Blessed Mother, we hope to encounter the Lord in His saving mysteries as we reflect on and pray through the Rosary with His Blessed Mother. Through her prayers, the minds and hearts of the pilgrims can be more and more conformed to Christ's truth and charity. Similarly, in June of 2024, we are arranging a pilgrimage to Lourdes. The dates are still to be determined, but it will be for nine days between June 10-28. This will be a time to encounter the healing that flows from Christ through the hands of His Mother. Aside from the physical miracles that can occur in Lourdes, even more people speak of a deep spiritual healing. We are hoping to keep this around \$3000 (which would include airfare, most of the food, housing, and transportation in France). Finally, we are hoping to arrange for a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2025. As we close our three-year Eucharistic Revival, what better way to do that than to be in the Holy Land where our Lord first gave us the Eucharist! The details of this are forthcoming. Yet in light of the other pilgrimages on the horizon, I wanted to mention this sooner than later.

Pilgrimages remind us that we are going somewhere, that we have an end goal in mind. In the challenges and uncomfortabilites that come with them (just ask me about sleeping underneath a 15-passengar van overnight), God can shape us profoundly. May we all be open to His providential plan as it unfolds in our lives so that one day we all may safely arrive at that place of perfect rest.

MUSIC NOTES FOR SEPTEMBER 24 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Two motets from the Iberian Renaissance. Rebelo was born in Caminha, Portugal, and in 1624 became a choir boy at the Ducal Palace of Vila Viçosa, where his older brother was a chaplain. He later studied at the Colégio dos Santos Reis Magos, an academy for court musicians. Thanks to a life-long friendship with the Duke of Braganza (later King John IV of Portugal), Rebelo was made a nobleman in 1646. His musical treatise Defensa de la musica moderna is dedicated to the King. Many of Rebelo's compositions were lost in the Lisbon All Saints' Day earthquake of 1755 when the Royal Music Library was destroyed. Today, only 44 works are known to exist.

A REPORT FROM THE SOCIAL CONCERNS COMMITTEE

The Social Concerns Committee would like to share with you the ways your generous donations supported our work this past year – September 2022 through June 2023. As usual, you were extremely generous with each of our requests.

One of our major works had been providing entertainment for the ladies at the Park Avenue Shelter with Thursday bingo games. To our surprise, we discovered that the women were not interested in playing bingo at this time. Yet, the women were most appreciative of the individualized Christmas gifts you donated. We wrapped at least three gifts in each bag and arranged to have a festive dinner catered on the day they received your gifts.

We aided the poor in many other ways too. We used some of the toiletries, socks, and clothing you have given for the migrants and to a WIN home in upper Manhattan, a step-up program for women in need. Our collections for the Common Pantry reached \$17,162. At the beginning of Lent, we had an in-kind food drive for specific food items, and you donated so much. In the Spring, we participated in another project for the Common Pantry, preparing lunch bags for weekend distribution. We made sandwiches and included other items. Finally, we had our usual collection of items for the elderly in the Bronx around Mother's Day.
