SOLEMN MASS FOR OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

There will be a Solemn Mass for the Blessed Virgin Mary on Friday, September 24 at 7 pm at St. Vincent Ferrer. This Mass will be celebrated according to the Anglican Ordinariate Use of the Roman Rite and will be the first such Mass ever offered in New York City. All are most welcome.

The Personal Ordinariate was created by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009; it allows groups of former Anglicans converting to Catholicism to retain some of

their liturgical patrimony.

The Blessed Virgin Mary's apparition to Lady Richeldis de Faverches in 1061 in the small village of Walsingham in Norfolk inspired what would become the strongest Marian devotion of the Catholic faithful in England. A pilgrimage to Our Lady of Walsingham's shrine trailed only those to Rome and Santiago de Compostela in popularity. Destroyed in the Reformation in 1538, Pope Leo XIII re-founded the shrine in 1896, sparking a resurgence of devotion in the 20th century.

Fr. Armando Alejandro, Jr., a priest of the Ordinariate, will celebrate the Mass, and Fr. Bonaventure Chapman, o.p., himself a convert from

Anglicanism, will preach.

The Parish's Schola Cantorum will sing music of the Anglican choral tradition, including Herbert Howells's *Collegium Regale Communion Service*, originally written for the choir of King's College, Cambridge.

Music Notes

Next weekend, for the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Schola will offer two grand double-choir motets of the Spanish tradition. Juan Gutiérrez de Padilla was born in Málaga, Spain, and held positions at the Cathedrals of Jérez de la Frontera and Cádiz before emigrating to the New World in 1620. Having settled in Puebla, Mexico (then in the viceroyalty of New Spain), he was appointed *maestro di capilla* of Puebla's Cathedral in 1629. The music of New Spain, since its beginnings in the 1530s, had been modeled on that of Old Spain, and during Padilla's tenure, Puebla boasted a music establishment rivaling anything in the Spanish Empire. Under the beneficence of Bishop Palafox y Mendoza especially, the choir included 28 men and 11 boys – much larger than any choir in Rome.

"I rejoiced when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD." - Psalm 122:1

Beautiful church architecture goes a long way. From elegant arches, to vaulted ceilings, to large stained-glass windows that flood the church with their transformation of light, gothic architecture draws the mind and the heart up to the Lord so that while we remain on this earth we might nevertheless be drawn into the realm of heaven. We are so blessed in both of our churches to have remarkable architectural designs that aid our prayer.

We are also blessed with another kind of church architecture too: the architecture of the Mystical Body. Here, we focus not so much on the physical buildings but on God's people. Clerics and the laity are the most obvious image of this on a daily basis—the priest and the deacon at the altar along with the congregation in the pews, each in their own unique ways, all offering the holy sacrifice of the Mass. Yet, when a religious community administers a parish, there is another element at play that also can bear great fruit.

With the arrival of Fr. Ignatius Schweitzer, O.P., the new prior at St. Catherine of Siena Priory, some people have asked: What's a prior? How is that different than a pastor? These are great questions that relate to the architecture of the Mystical Body, and so I wanted to share a little bit about how the structures of religious orders relate to parishes.

In a parish staffed by a religious order, there are a few things going on. First, there is the connection of the parish to the diocese or archdiocese. The parish falls under the guidance and support of the local bishop or archbishop, who appoints a pastor to serve the parish. Sometimes in larger parishes, you will also have other priests who assist the pastor, i.e. parochial vicars or assistant pastors. In our case, Cardinal Dolan shepherds the Archdiocese of New York, and as the pastor, I report to him and the auxiliary bishops (assistant bishops) that support him and his work of preaching the Gospel. Fr. Joseph Allen, O.P. and Fr. Joseph Hagan, O.P. are our two parochial vicars, and they assist me, especially by helping with the liturgies and parish groups at the churches where they reside. We are also blessed to have Br. Damian McCarthy, O.P. as the sacristan at St. Vincent Ferrer. Nearly everyone knows him, and he has been a wonderful source of continuity in the parish for decades.

The other aspect of a parish staffed by a religious order is the order's own governmental structure. In the case of the Dominicans, we have two types of communities: a "priory" for a community with six or more friars or a "house" for a community with less than six friars. The Dominican community down at St. Joe's in Greenwich Village is a house because they have less than six friars while the communities at St. Vincent's and St. Catherine' are both priories since both have more than six friars. Both priories and houses are internally governed by a prior or superior, respectively, who oversees the internal communal life of the friars—from the community's prayer schedule, to our communal meals, to communal penances during Advent or Lent, and to anything else applying to the life of the Dominicans as a community.

Fr. Walter had been a in particular situation where he was both the pastor of the parish and also the prior of the Dominican community at St. Catherine's. With his departure, both roles needed to be filled. So I was proposed by the Province to the Archdiocese as the pastor, and Cardinal Dolan approved me to be the pastor. Soon after Fr. Walter's departure, the Dominican community at St. Catherine's voted and elected Fr. Ignatius as their new prior.

The final aspect of a religious order's relation to a parish it serves is the most beautiful—the living out of the order's charism. Each religious order has a charism, its own particular way of living out the Gospel, and hopefully you all have seen good examples of Dominicans through the decades who lived out our charism of preaching for the salvation of souls. Ideally, this charism guides the work of the parish in so many varied ways. A thriving Dominican parish isn't just one where the preaching at Mass is good, but it's also one where all aspects of parochial life become an invitation to live the Gospel more deeply, a holy preaching as it is often called. The liturgies and devotions, the parish organizations, the service to local organizations, the fellowship, the charity that is shown by one parishioner to another, and all the rest of the aspects of a parish's life should all become means of preaching and witnessing to the power of God's grace active in the world.

May the Lord bless us abundantly so that all that we do may become a holy preaching, and so that all who come here–parishioners and guests alike–even while on this earth may be drawn into the realm of heaven.

I grew up in Mahopac, NY with my parents and sister. I attended St. Elizabeth Ann Seton School in Shrub Oak, NY and John F. Kennedy Catholic High School in Somers, NY. I was active in scouting, youth ministry, and sports. My vocational discernment began in high school as a youth group leader on a religious retreat. On this retreat, I heard God's call to become a priest of Jesus Christ. While earning a B.S. in biology from Providence College, I discerned a priestly and Dominican vocation under the guidance of Dominican priests.
