LABOR DAY SCHEDULE

While St. Catherine of Siena will stay open through the afternoon, St Vincent Ferrer will close following the Mass.

NATIVITY OF MARY

Thursday, September 8 is the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. There will be a Sung Mass at 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer.

There are only three nativities observed in the Roman Catholic calendar: for Jesus, for Mary, and for St. John the Baptist.

OCTAVE OF PRAYER

From the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Thursday, September 8 through the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows on Thursday, September 15, the Parish will offer an Octave of Prayer. In these days we recognize Jesus' Passion and the Blessed Mother's compassion, and thus we pray for those undergoing their own passions of illness, injury, and age, and for their caregivers. Holy cards and petition slips will be found at the Rosary Altar at St. Vincent Ferrer and at the Altar of the Holy Cross at St. Catherine near the Book of the Sick.

REQUIEM MASS FOR 9/11

On **Friday**, **September 9**, a Requiem Mass in the Dominican Rite will be offered at 7 pm at St. Vincent Ferrer to commemorate the 21st anniversary of 9/11. The Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa pro defunctis á 6* by Tomás Luis de Victoria. This Mass is sponsored jointly by the Parish and the New York Purgatorial Society and will be offered for those who died as a result of the attacks on 9/11.

Our Parish's Schola Cantorum will sing for Opening Prayer Service of the 77th Session of the U.N. General Assembly on **Monday, September 12** at 6 PM, with prelude music beginning at 5:45 PM, at the Church of the Holy Family (315 East 47th Street). The service offered will be Vespers of the Holy Name of Mary.

EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS-OUR LADY OF SORROWS

Wednesday, September 14 is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. There will be a Solemn Mass at 5:15 PM at St. Catherine of Siena for which the Schola Cantorum will sing *Missa Rompi de l'empio cor* and *O crux splendidior – Dulce lignum* by Orlando di Lasso.

Thursday, September 15 is the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. There

will be a Sung Mass at 5:15 PM at St. Catherine of Siena.

There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Catherine of Siena on Wednesday and Thursday following the 7 AM Mass and concluding with Benediction and the recitation of the Rosary before the 5:15 PM Mass.

One of two such periods of extended adoration offered annually in the Parish, this one is offered for the intentions for those suffering in the hospitals and for those who care for them.

MUSIC NOTES

Next Sunday, for the Twenty-third Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Schola will sing music of two composers of the Italian Renaissance. The two texts are ones that were set numerous times during the Renaissance. *O quam suavis est*, the Magnificat Antiphon at First Vespers of Corpus Christi, is translated as: *O how sweet, Lord, is your Spirit, who, to show your kindness to your children, has given the sweetest bread of heaven, fills the hungry with good things, [and] sends the haughty rich away empty. It paraphrases Wisdom 16:20, 21 and Luke 1:52. <i>Sic Deus dilexit mundum* is the famous verse John 3:16, *God so loved the world*.

Octave of Prayer Honoring The Triumph of the Holy Cross and Our Lady of Sorrows

Dear Parishioners and Friends of the Parish:

This letter invites you to join the patrons of the Dominican Shrine of St. Jude and our two parish churches in our annual celebration of the Octave of Prayer that begins on Thursday, September 8, the feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and concludes on Thursday, September 15, the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. Within this Octave we recall the Holy Name of Mary on Monday, September 12 and the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on Wednesday, September 14.

The intentions for this Octave of Prayer will be the patients and caregivers in the various hospitals that the Dominican Friars minister to within our Parish. This has been the principal ministry of the Dominican Friars residing here in the Priory of St. Catherine of Siena from its inception. Our presence here goes back 125 years to August 29, 1897. One might walk into the church at any time during the day and witness individuals and families both in prayer and in tears on behalf of their loved ones suffering in our neighborhood hospitals. We bond with them in their prayer and sufferings during their difficult times.

Are not these days of our Octave of Prayer the perfect opportunity for bringing some hope to these

individuals and families?

Certainly, the high point of our Octave will focus on the Exultation of the Holy Cross. "Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world." We will remain powerless if we do not appreciate the richness and the meaning of this cross and why Christ died for us. During Lent and Holy Week, we focus on the sufferings of Christ crucified. In our celebration of the Triumph or Exultation of the Holy Cross, our focus shifts to the glory and victory of the cross. We approach the cross not with sorrow, but with joy; not as a symbol of death, but of life; not a sign of defeat, but of victory; and certainly not as a cause of fear, but of hope.


Moreover, in concluding this Octave, we stand at the foot of the cross with Mary the mother of the Lord. The location of this feast in the liturgical calendar reminds us of the sufferings of Mary during the passion and death of her son. She stands with St. John and becomes the mother of all the living. As our mother we can approach her with confidence that she will respond to our needs and prayers.

During this Octave of Prayer, may I suggest that we unite our prayers with all those who we know on the beds of suffering as well as caregivers at their side. The Octave Prayer will be said at all five daily Masses in our parish, as well as all eight of the Masses we celebrate on Sunday. In addition, we will be offering an Octave of Masses beginning on the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary and concluding on Our Lady of Sorrows at the 5:15 Mass each day at St. Catherine of Siena. These Masses will remember all the intentions of those making the novena as well as for all the sick in our hospitals and Mary Manning Walsh Home.

An intention book for this Octave will be placed on the altar of the Holy Cross at St. Catherine of Siena for your convenience. It is hoped that you will take advantage of this opportunity to share your intentions with all who are making this a special time of prayer. Jesus has said: "Where two or three are gathered together in prayer I am in their midst." There will be a book for intentions at St. Vincent Ferrer placed at the Rosary Altar for your convenience. Please take advantage of this for those whom we should add to this Octave of Prayer.

On the Feasts of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross (Wednesday, September 14) and Our Lady of Sorrow (Thursday, September 15) there will be ALL DAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION at St. Catherine of Siena. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed following the 7:00 AM Mass until Benediction at 4:30 PM. It is hoped that you might consider joining us for some period of prayer during these special days.




