To receive Holy Communion on the tongue, please use the Communion line at the altar rail.


To receive Holy Communion in the hand, please use the Communion line in the center aisle of the Nave.

MUSIC NOTES

Today is the First Sunday of Advent, which marks the beginning of the new liturgical year: Year A in the three-year lectionary cycle during which we hear from the Gospel of St. Matthew. The season of Advent (from the Latin *adventus* meaning "coming") looks forward to the birth of Christ, calling the faithful to prepare for his arrival: first in meekness and mercy and ultimately in judgment and glory.

Liturgies during this "privileged" season of Advent strike a note of anticipation and repentance that is mingled with joy and hope; hence, although penitential violet is the season's liturgical color, the *Gloria* is omitted, and the use of the organ is moderated, the *Alleluia* is retained. The congregational Ordinary (*Kyrie*, *Sanctus*, and *Agnus Dei*) at Sung Masses changes to the Latin-version of *Missa XVIII*.

Choral music at next Sunday's Solemn Mass for the Second Sunday of Advent: *Missa Salvatorem expectamus* by Gregorio Allegri; *Leva in circuitu oculos tuos* by Andrea Rota; *Audite insulae* – *Et posuit os meum* by Adrian Willaert.


ST. ANDREW
