The Mystery of Marriage

WEDDING CEREMONIES

With a beautiful church near Central Park, St. Vincent Ferrer is a commonly sought location for a Catholic wedding by parishioners and non-parishioners alike. Because of this, we completely revamped our marriage preparation program two years ago so that priests and parishioners can work together to help couples prepare not just for their wedding but also a whole life of marriage. This has been a very fruitful part of the Parish's ministry, and I am so grateful for all those who help make it possible.

Ultimately, we desire that our program be a means to help engaged couples enter into graces pouring forth like the new wine at the wedding at Cana. What is usually emphasized in this Gospel is that when the wine ran short, the Blessed Mother asked Jesus to solve the problem. He ended up transforming 120-180 gallons of water into wine, and good wine at that. What we might overlook, though, is the fact that Jesus is even there in the first place. The gospel mentions that not only was the Blessed Mother present at the wedding, but "Jesus and His disciples were also invited to the wedding" (John 2:2).

This makes all the difference. When Jesus is present in a wedding and continues to be present in a marriage, His grace can transform human actions from being like water into something even richer, like wine. He desires to transform human actions into something even more rich. He wants them to become His instruments that reveal His love to the world. In that way, just like the disciples who came to believe in Him because of the miracle (cf. John 2:11), so too will others come to believe in Him through the love that they see in a marriage built on the rock who is Christ (cf. Matthew 7:24-25).

WEDDING COUPLES TO GOD

All this being said, it is important to not degrade marriage to a simple "love is love" mentality. The love that should be lived out is a deeper, firmer, and richer love than that. It should be built on the love of Christ on the Cross. St. Paul, after describing how husbands and wives are supposed to make mutual gifts of themselves to one another in marriage, cleansing and sanctifying one another (cf. Ephesians 5:26), goes on to say, "This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the church" (Ephesians 5:32). In other words, the love of God that is lived out in marriage has its origin and exemplar in the Cross. It is a gritty, patient, and persevering love

that knows no bounds, and it should be built on the love that Christ offered to His Bride, the Church, when He perfectly offered Himself for her on the Cross.

When couples live in this way, by sacrificing day in and day out, it becomes clear that the Lord is pouring the new wine, the better wine, into their lives. He transforms their normal actions of everyday life into actions that can cleanse and sanctify hearts in and out of the home. All this, in turn, is so that they can one day present one another to the Lord "without spot or wrinkle or any such thing" (Ephesians 5:27). In other words, marriage is about heaven. It's about a couple wedding their spouse to God for all eternity. Through all the joys and in the midst of all the hardships, married life can become a truly sanctifying way of life.

May the intercession of the Blessed Virgin and St. Joseph aid our engaged couples to prepare for marriage, and our married couples to live out their marriage with great fruit and sanctity!

MUSIC NOTES

Sweelinck was a Dutch composer, organist, and pedagogue, straddling the end of the Renaissance and beginning of the Baroque eras. Before 1580, he succeeded his father as organist of the Oude Kerk in Amsterdam, a post he retained until his death when his own son Dirk followed him. His own organ compositions and teaching legacy – his students included Heinrich Schiedemann and Samuel Scheidt – helped establish the north German organ tradition of which Johann Sebastian Bach is the culmination.
