LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING Genesis 9:8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: "See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark. I will establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the waters of a flood; there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth." God added: "This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you: I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings."

SECOND READING I Peter 3:18-22

Beloved: Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.



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PREFACE




It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Christ our Lord.



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

LITURGICAL NOTES

The penitential season of Lent (from the Old English meaning "spring" and also known as *Quadragesima* in Latin, meaning "fortieth") begins on Ash Wednesday. In Lent, violet vestments are worn. The *Gloria* is omitted except on feastdays and the *Alleluia* is replaced with the Tract. According to the *General Instructions of the Roman Missal*, the document governing the celebration of the *Novus Ordo* Mass, the organ is to be used only "to give necessary support to the singing," so organ voluntaries are omitted except on Laetare Sunday and feasts. As always in privileged seasons (Advent, Christmastide, Lent, Eastertide), the Schola will sing a polyphonic setting of the Mass Ordinary at the Solemn Mass.

As the Church strips herself of festal trimming entering into the spiritual desert, her faithful are likewise called to a heightened order of penitence, fasting, abstinence, and almsgiving. Making a good confession, attending daily Mass, and praying the Office, Stations of the Cross, and Rosary are all worthy resolutions.

MUSIC NOTES

The 'Propers' of the Mass are the scriptural texts that change daily according to the liturgical calendar and include the Lectionary (which on a typical Sunday or feast includes pericopes from an Old Testament Lesson, a New Testament Epistle, and a Gospel), the Presidential Prayers (Collect, Prayer over the Offerings, Preface, and Post-Communion Prayer), and the five 'Minor Propers' (Officium (Introit), Gradual, Alleluia or Tract, Offertory, and Communion). All Propers, even the readings, are sung in the richest form of a Solemn Mass and each has a musical tone unique unto itself.

The texts of the Minor Propers are usually excerpts from the Psalter, and today's are unique as they are all taken from the same psalm: 90 (91). Today's are also unusual because the Offertory and Communion Antiphons set the exact same text, although the chant melodies are different.

Choral music at next Sunday's Solemn Mass for the Second Sunday of Lent: *Missa Locutus sum*; *Quicumque Christum quaeritis*; and *Pater noster* (1565) by Orlando di Lasso.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross is prayed every Friday during Lent after the evening Masses: 5:15 PM St. Catherine of Siena and 6 PM at St. Vincent Ferrer.
