



The setting of the Mass Ordinary is *Missa Princeps pacis* by William Lloyd Webber (1914-1982).



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GOSPEL *Luke 2:16-21*




PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS

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PREFACE








SOLEMN BLESSING AND DISMISSAL



VOLUNTARY

MUSIC NOTES

William Lloyd Webber, born into a poor London family, studied composition with Vaughan Williams at the Royal College of Music. In 1938, he was appointed Organist and Choirmaster of London's All Saints Church, Margaret Street, later becoming Organist of the Methodist Central Hall, Westminster. From 1964 until his death, he served as Director of the London College of Music. William Lloyd Webber's two sons are today widely-recognized musicians: composer and impresario Andrew (b. 1948); and Julian (b. 1951), a prominent British cellist. *Missa Princeps Pacis*, written in 1962, is dedicated to the Reverend Wilfrid Purney, then director of London's Westminster (Catholic) Diocesan Choir and the National President of Pueri Cantores.

Francis Poulenc was born into a wealthy Parisian family that prohibited him from entering a conservatory, rather intending that he should go into the family's pharmaceutical company. Never-the-less, he was greatly influenced by his two private teachers, pianist Ricardo Viñes, who became his mentor after the death of his parents, and the composer Erik Satie. A member of *Les Six*, a group of young French composers, Poulenc's musical voice is distinctly personal and relatively conservative, especially when compared with his close contemporary Olivier Messiaen. Beyond his fine songs and piano pieces, Poulenc was an inspired composer of religious music. Later in life, the loss of close friends, coupled with a pilgrimage to the Black Madonna of Rocamadour, led him to rediscover his Catholic faith which resulted in compositions of a more austere tone. Of his choral works, *Mass in G* (1937), *Stabat Mater* (1950), and *Gloria* (1959) are notable. His opera *Dialogues of the Carmelites* (1957), *Organ Concerto* (1938), and many of his chamber works for winds also are of remarkable quality.



EPIPHANY

Sunday, January 7 is the Solemnity of the Epiphany. For the 12 NOON Solemn Mass, the Schola will sing *Missa Hodie Christus natus est*; *Videntes stellam*; and *Tribus miraculis* by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina.

On Saturday, January 6, the traditional date of the Epiphany, there will be a Solemn Dominican Rite Mass at 9:30 AM for which the Schola will sing *Peterhouse Mass* by Christopher Tye.
