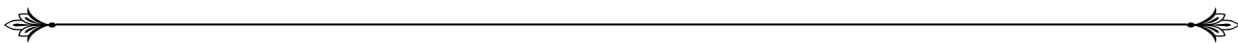

Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

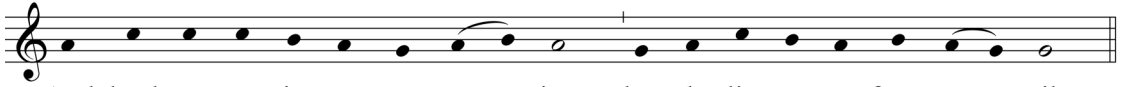

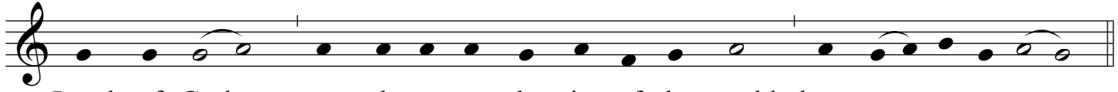
To receive Holy Communion on the tongue, please use the Communion line at the altar rail.

To receive Holy Communion in the hand, please use the Communion line in the center aisle of the Nave.

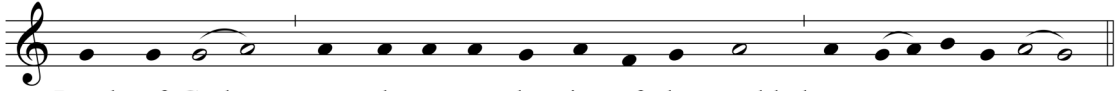


In the Procession, a Relic of St. Martin is carried.

The People follow the Ministers in procession.


